Administrative Synopsis - New Business Items

Authorization to execute an agreement with Analytic Insight to 1056-19 а develop two (2), 5-year strategic plans at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.00, providing strategic plans for both the Office of Homelessness Prevention and Intervention as well of the Office of Affordable Housing Trust Fund. Funds are (L1056-19) (Ruddick/Hamilton)

> Authorization to execute an agreement with Community Action Council to operate an Intensive Street Outreach program at a cost not to exceed \$280,000.00. The program will provide compliance with the Encampment Standard Operating Procedures, provide street level service engagement and ongoing intensive case management for those experiencing unsheltered homelessness. Funds are budgeted. (L1057-19) (Ruddick/Hamilton)

Authorization to establish ZOLL as a sole source vendor for the cardiac monitors the division purchases at a cost of \$250,000.00. ZOLL is the only manufacturer of the cardiac monitors and the only capable supplier. Funds are budgeted. (L1064-19) (Chilton/Armstrong)

Authorization to execute an agreement with Brandstetter Carroll, Inc. for the design services for the renovation of Fire Station #9. The first phase of this work was competitively bid under RFP #20-2019. \$43,000.00 was approved by Council to complete the Phase A programming and design on November 15, 2018 per Resolution 700-2018. The project budget has now been established and additional funding has been secured. The remaining design fees for design, development, and construction documents have been calculated at an additional cost of \$31,750.00. The total contract amount will then be \$74,750.00. Authorization to accept a donation of ten (10) motorcycle helmets purchased by the CPAAA. This MOA outlines an agreement with both parties to provide for the care, maintenance, feeding and supplies for two canines from the Office of the Fayette County Sheriff which will be housed at the new LPD Canine Facility.
