Please be advised of the following clarifications to the above referenced Bid:

1. Bid opening date has been changed to June 1, 2016, 2:00 PM.

- 2. Pre-bid Sign-in attached.
- 3. QUESTIONS & ANSWERS:
 - a. Q: Please provide the weight of the building structure. A: 18,500 LBS
 - b. Q: Are there lift points on the building? If yes, please provide some details. A: Accommodating lifting points are located on top of the shelter.
 - c. Q: Please explain the extent of the scope of electrical conduit. A: The PVC conduit is to be installed in the reinforced concrete pad to allow underground electrical service to the structure. The conduit is to be located directly under the electrical panel in the structure (Contractor to field verify location) and is to terminate 42" below the existing ground line, three feet outside of the concrete foundation. It should be noted that the steel structure's orientation is to be rotated 180 degrees from its current orientation.
 - d. Q: Please confirm that there is no electrical work other than conduit. A: Confirmed. The connecting conduit and electrical connection is to be installed by OWNER.
 - e. Q: What are the backfill requirements of the conduit installed in pavement? A: Not in this contract.
 - f. Q: Is weekend work allowed? A: Yes, if coordinated with OWNER.
 - g. Q: Who's responsibility is the concrete testing? A: OWNER
 - h. Q: Sheet S3, Note #2 states, "Site grading and drainage by Others". Please explain. A: As the construction is located in a paved asphalt parking lot there is no site grading and drainage necessary. The Contractor will repair the asphalt immediately adjacent to the concrete foundation to prevent surface water from entering the subsurface.



- i. Q: Please confirm that embed plates and Hilti tie down bolts are provided by Others.
 A: The plates and mounting hardware are in the Owner's possession and will be made available to the Contractor on site.
- j. Q: Do you anticipate that rock will have to be excavated for the turn down edges? A: No geotechnical exploration of the site has been made by the Owner. All excavation is considered "unclassified".
- k. Q: Sheet S3, Note #1 refers to consultation with geotechnical engineer. Two questions: Who pays for the engineer? Is the foundation plan subject to change? A: The Owner will inspect the excavation and confirm adherence to soil bearing requirements. Foundation design changes are not anticipated. However, adjustments to the design may be made by the Owner if unforeseen site conditions are revealed during excavation. If this change condition results in an increase in work, it will be addressed as a change order to this contract.
- I. Q: The Owner will supply the Tornado Shelter. Are columns, beams, and ventilation system part of the Tornado Shelter supplied by the Owner? A: The necessary appurtenances associated with the Shelter are provided by the Owner.
- m. Q: The Plans show Generator being part of the Contractor's responsibility. However, the Specification and the Bid Package does not mention anything about Generator being the Contractor's responsibility. A: No Generator is associated with this project.
- n. Q: The Specification mentions that the Contractor will have to construct ADA Ramp. Please provide details, dimensions, location, and quantity of it. A: One ramp conforming to ADA design standards is to be constructed at the north entrance to the Shelter.
