SUBJECT: Radio System Agreement – Lexington-Fayette Animal Care and Control

Request:

The Division of Enhanced 911 is requesting a resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Lexington-Fayette Animal Care and Control (LFACC) to access the government's 800 MHz P25 Trunked Digital Radio System.

Why are you requesting?

The LFACC has acquired radios that allow their personnel to talk on both the LFACC radio system and the LFUCG's radio system. LFACC will continue to use its own radio system for day-to-day operations, but requests access to the government's 800 MHz system in order to communicate with the Division of Emergency Management and E911 during disasters and other emergencies. The agreement outlines the terms for use of the LFUCG's radio system.
