

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky March 2, 2017

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on March 2, 2017 at 6:01 p.m. Present were Mayor Gray in the chair presiding, and the following members of the council: Gibbs, Henson, Higgins, Kay, Lamb, Moloney, Mossotti, Plomin, Scutchfield, Stinnett, Bledsoe, F. Brown, Evans, and Farmer. Absent was Council Member J. Brown.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 17-2017 through 21-2017, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 86-2017 through 108-2017, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by the Rev. Ernie Perry of Broadway Christian Church.

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Mayor Gray asked Mr. David Marchiano, President of the Lexington YMCA, and Mr. David Barberie, Dept. of Law, and Commissioner Janet Graham, Dept. of Law, to join him at the podium. Mayor Gray read a Proclamation declaring March 2, 2017 as David Barberie Day in Lexington. Mayor Gray described the life-saving work of Lexington firefighters Matthew Anderson, Jason Moore, Kiker Moses, and Richard Garr, the staff of the High Street YMCA, including Mr. Mark Wright, Mr. David Elsen, and Ms. Chazman McKoy, and YMCA class members, Ms. Allison Stewart and Ms. Karen Wolfsdorf. Mayor Gray told the story of Mr. Barberie's experience of having a heart attack at the YMCA and how members, staff and first responders saved his life.

Mr. Barberie offered his thanks and that of his family to all of the honorees for saving his life.

Mr. Marchiano thanked all of the responders in this event, and thanked Mr. Barberie for his contributions to the High Street YMCA.

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Mayor Gray asked Commissioner Chris Ford to join him at the podium, and read a Proclamation declaring March 2017 as Social Work Month in Lexington.

Comm. Ford thanked Mayor Gray for recognizing the contributions of social workers, and talked about the many ways that social workers are part of the fabric of our community.

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Mayor Gray asked Ms. Becky Mercier, The Lexington Club, Altrusa International, to join him at the podium, and read a Proclamation declaring April 11, 2017 as Altrusa Awareness Day in Lexington in honor of Altrusa International's 100th anniversary.

Ms. Mercier described Altrusa's membership and the many significant contributions of the Altrusa organization in Lexington.

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Mayor Gray asked Ms. Evans to join him at the podium, and read a Proclamation celebrating Read Across America and declaring March 2, 2017 as Read Across America Day in Lexington.

Ms. Evans described events to celebrate Dr. Seuss's 113th birthday, and many of the activities planned for children.

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An Ordinance creating Section 14-106 of the Code of Ordinances of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, requiring that the delivery of unsolicited written materials to a premises be placed on the front porch, through a mail slot, securely attached to the front door, between the exterior and interior front door, in a distribution box, or personally with the owner; classifying a violation of this Ordinance as a civil offense; establishing administrative review procedures to contest citations; fixing a maximum civil penalty for violations in the amount of two hundred dollars (\$200) per violation; designating the Administrative Hearing Board as the code enforcement board having authority to determine whether a violation has occurred; and amending Subsection 14-10(f)(4) to designate citation officers; all effective sixty (60) days from passage received second reading.

Mr. Farmer, Ms. Lamb, Ms. Evans, and Ms. Mossotti spoke in opposition to the ordinance.

An Ordinance amending Articles 1, 3, 8, 11 and 23A of the Zoning Ordinance to define and regulate Market Gardens throughout Lexington-Fayette County.
