Please be advised of the following clarifications to the above referenced Bid:

- 1. Pre-bid sign-in sheet is attached.
- 2. Time of completion is forty-five (45) calendar days between June 11, 2018 and August 27, 2018.
- 3. For the 5' wide field access gates at the end of the dugouts that are called out on the plans and part of the bid, change these to be 7' tall and with a fence panel above them because the 10' high fencing continues toward the outfield beyond the dugouts.
- 4. Once the demolition is completed and the building of the new dugouts begins, LFUCG will help the contractor determine the finished floor elevations of the dugouts.
- 5. On field A first base side dugout, there is an existing section of asphalt inside the fence to provide dugout access that is included in the demolition and gets replaced by a new concrete walk as shown on the plan.
- 6. No vehicles will be permitted on ball fields (trucks, skid steers, concrete trucks, etc.), as existing irrigation lines may be damaged.
- Contractor should minimize any disturbance of playing fields and will be responsible for repair including seeding.



- 8. Contractor is responsible for having all utilities marked before demolition begins.
- 9. There are 2-12' wide service gates at each end of the baseball complex, one behind the first base dugout for field A and one behind the third base dugout for field C. It is suggested that for concrete pours, the contractor stage the concrete trucks at these locations and use a Georgia-buggie to get concrete to the various locations within the complex.

- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by one or more women.

- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) A Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a veteran and/or a service disabled veteran.
- 5) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS
