

RESOLUTION NO. 271 -2019


A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, ON BEHALF OF THE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT, TO EXECUTE AND SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, UNDER THE COMPREHENSIVE OPIOID ABUSE SITE-BASED PROGRAM, AND TO PROVIDE ANY ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THIS GRANT APPLICATION, WHICH GRANT FUNDS ARE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$900,000.00 FEDERAL FUNDS, AND ARE TO ASSIST IN THE REDUCTION OF OVERDOSE FATALITIES, FACILITATE ACCESS TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT SERVICES, AND PROVIDE SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT SERVICES THROUGH THE COMMUNITY PARAMEDICINE PROGRAM.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT:

Section 1 - That the Mayor, on behalf of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, be and hereby is authorized and directed to execute and submit the Grant Application, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, to the United States Department of Justice, under the Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Site-Based Program, and to provide any additional information requested in connection with this Grant Application, which Grant funds are in the amount of \$900,000.00 Federal funds, and are to assist in the reduction of overdose fatalities, facilitate access to substance abuse treatment services, and provide substance abuse treatment services through the Community Paramedicine Program.

Section 2 - That this Resolution shall become effective on the date of its passage.
