

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky September 12, 2019

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on September 12, 2019 at 6:03 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the council: Plomin, Reynolds, Worley, Bledsoe, F. Brown, J. Brown, Ellinger, Evans, Farmer, Gibbs, Kay, Lamb, McCurn, Moloney and Mossotti.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 56-2019 through 62-2019, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 429-2019 through 478-2019, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Jeff Gates of Volunteers of America.

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Upon motion by Vice Mayor Kay, seconded by Mr. Farmer, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the August 15, 2019 and August 29, 2019 Council Meetings were approved.

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Mayor Gorton asked Courtney Kloske, Alzheimer's Association Congressional Ambassador for Kentucky – 6th District, to join her at the podium, and read a Proclamation declaring September 21, 2019 as Alzheimer's Awareness Day in Lexington. Ms. Kloske spoke of the impact the disease has across the nation as well as the economy. She talked about the Alzheimer's Association's mission and her personal endeavors to create a world without Alzheimer's disease by worldwide outreach and research studies conducted at the University of Kentucky's Sanders-Brown Center on Aging.

An Ordinance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government making certain findings concerning and establishing a development area for economic development purposes within Fayette County to be known as The Fountains at Palomar Development Area; approving a local participation agreement between Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Dept. of Finance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, and The Fountains at Palomar, LLC, as Developer, establishing an incremental tax special fund for payment of administrative costs, public infrastructure costs, and redevelopment assistance; designating the Dept. of Finance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as the agency responsible for oversight, administration, and implementation of the Development Area; approving a Master Development Agreement between the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Dept. of Finance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and The Fountains at Palomar, LLC; and authorizing the Mayor and other officials to take such other appropriate actions as are necessary or required in connection with the establishment of the Development Area.

An Ordinance amending the Classified Civil Service authorized strength reallocating three (3) positions of Heavy Equipment Technician and the incumbents from Grade 516N to Grade 518N, in the Div. of Fire and Emergency Services; and reallocating twenty (20) positions of Heavy Equipment Technician and the incumbents from Grade 516N to Grade 518N, in the Div. of Facilities and Fleet Management; providing a five percent (5%) salary supplement for a Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) Inspector Certification in the Div. of Facilities and Fleet Management pursuant to Section 21-27(e) of the Code of Ordinances; effective the beginning of the pay period following passage of Council.

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A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute a Memorandum of Agreement with the Federal Emergency Management Agency, for use of the Public Alert and Warning Systems Management.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute an Amendment to the Agreement with RED7E, extending the effective term through September 30, 2019, for the design and implementation of an overdose prevention awareness campaign, for the First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Program, at no cost to the Urban County Government.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the University of Kentucky defining the fee-splitting requirement within Chapter 17D of the Code of Ordinances; the

University Of Kentucky's duties relating to dockless vehicles; and the provision of shared mobility data management software accounts, at no cost to the Urban County Government.
