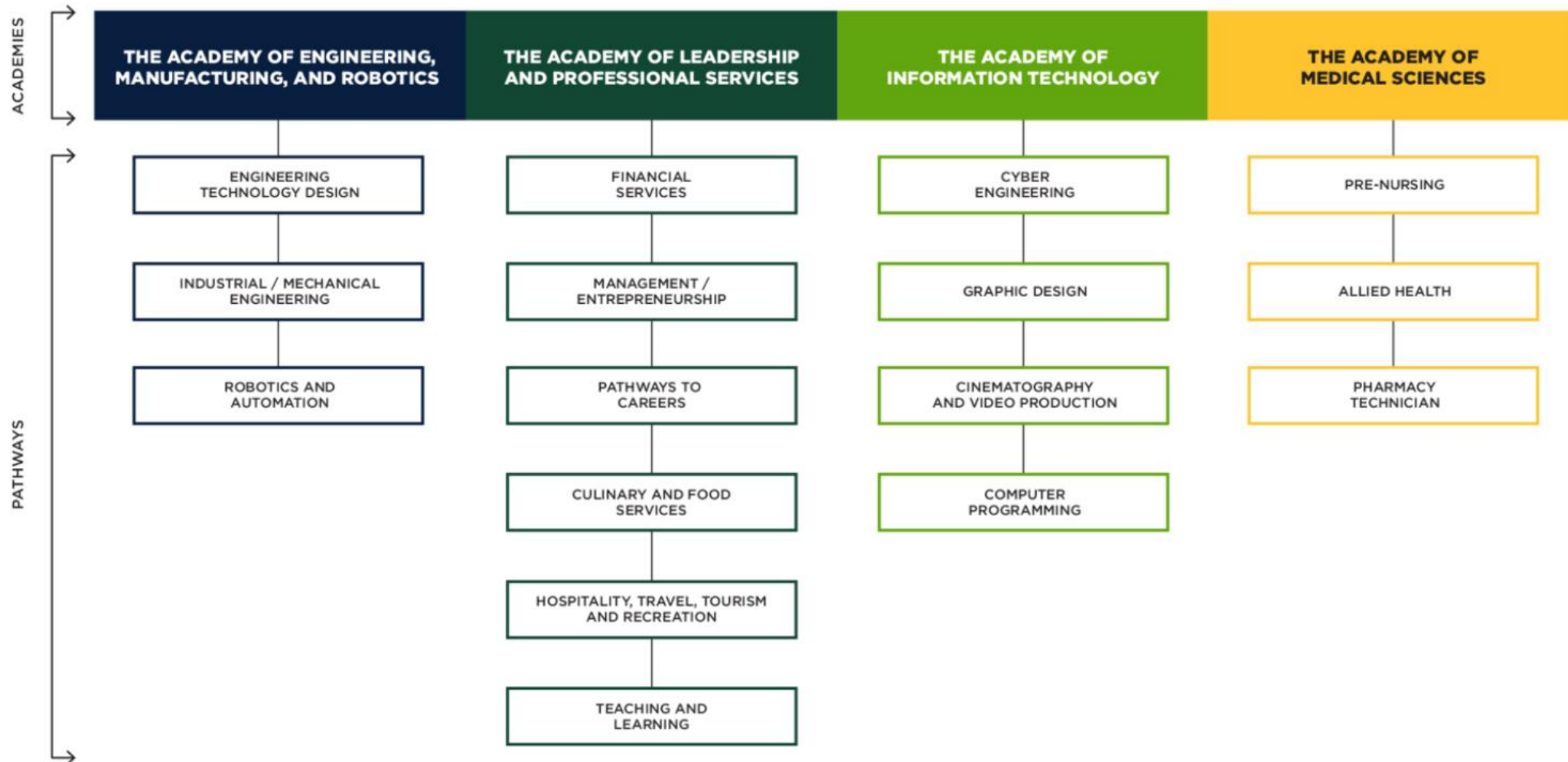

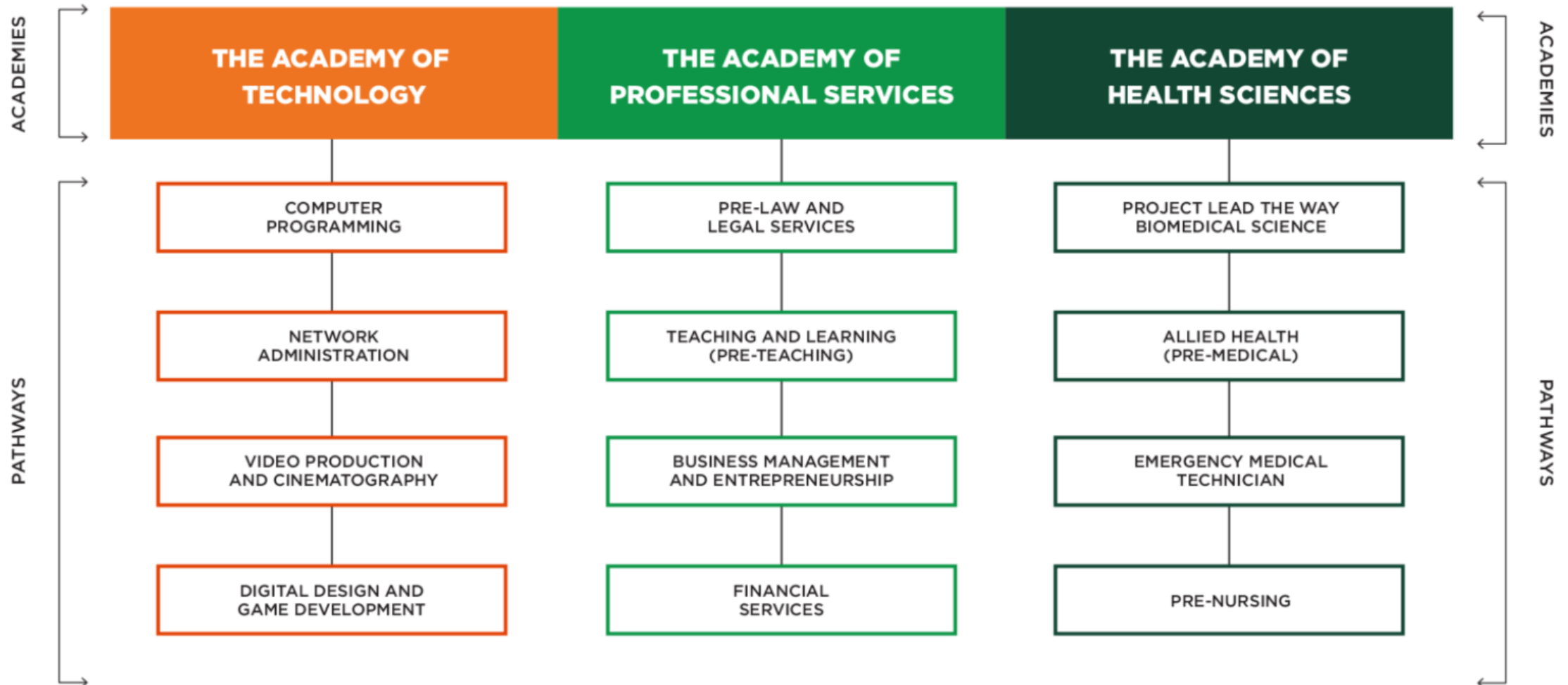

BRYAN STATION ACADEMIES AND PATHWAYS (10th – 12th GRADES)



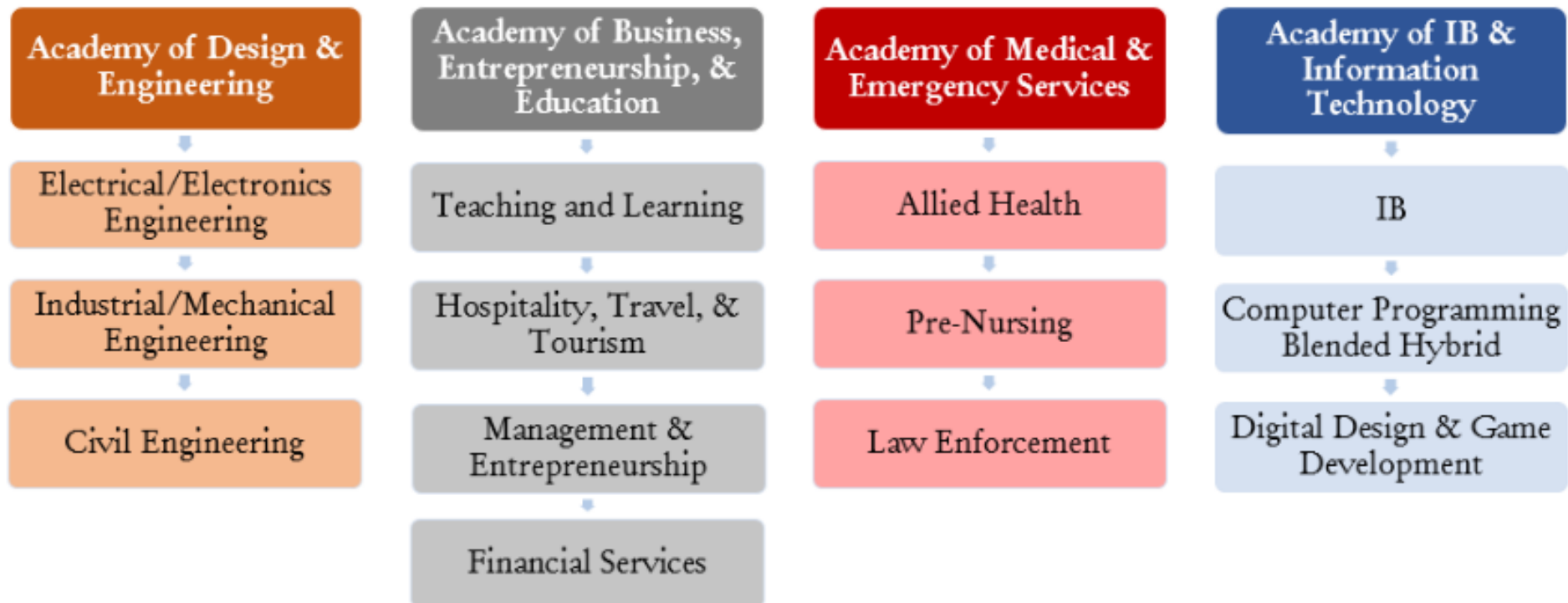

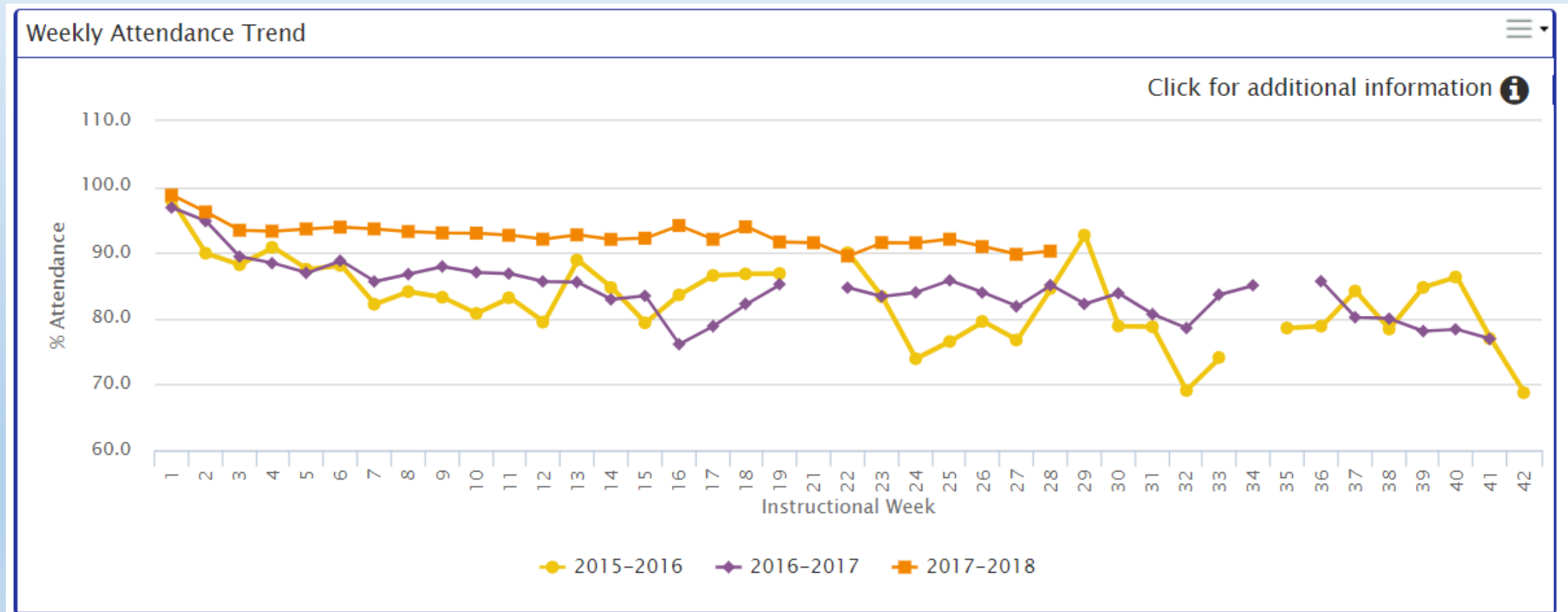
