Background

- □ \$150,000 was authorized by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County
 Council in FY2017 for the purpose of providing economic
 and workforce development services to supplement and support the
 work of the Urban County Government.
- ☐ Grant awards were made based on a total score. Agencies determined how many people they could train and place into employment based on their funding request.
- ☐ Grant awards were approved by Lexington's Economic Development Investment Board and the Urban County Council.



Year 1 (July 1, 2017- June 30, 2018) Agencies Impacted

- 1. Bluegrass Care Navigators (\$20,000) Certified Nursing Assistants
- 2. Build Inclusion, DSACK, Easter Seals Cardinal Hill (\$25,000) Employment Transition Services for Youth with Disabilities
- 3. Building Institute of Central Kentucky (\$20,000) Skilled Trades (HVAC, Plumbing, Electrical, Building Maintenance, Carpentry)
- 4. FoodChain (\$20,000) Culinary Training
- 5. Jubilee Jobs (\$25,000) **Job Placement Services for Population Re-entering Workforce**
- 6. Opportunity for Work & Learning (\$20,000) Certified Forklift Training & Customer Service Training
- 7. Urban League / BCTC (\$37,500) Fiber Optic Installation Training



Grant Outcomes - Year 1

Training

□ A total of 162 individuals were provided services through this grant for an average cost of \$926 per person served.



Grant Outcomes - Year 1

Placements

- □ A total of 101 placements occurred in the first year of this grant resulting in an average cost of \$1,485 per placement.
- □ Agencies were required by the Purchase of Services Agreements to complete at least 75% of their stated placement goal.



Grant Outcomes - Year 1

Wages

- \Box Average wage = \$11.29
- \square Median wage = \$10.28
- \Box Highest wage = \$21.00
- \Box Lowest wage = \$8.20



Workforce Sectors

- ☐ 105 placements occurred in these main sectors (in order of frequency):
- 1. Hospitality (29 placements)
- 2. Healthcare (25 placements)
- 3. Manufacturing (21 placements)
- 4. Retail (10 placements)
- 5. Business & Professional Services (9 placements)
- 6. Skilled Trades (7 placements)

Year 2 Agencies Impacted

- □ \$300,000 was authorized by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council in the FY 2018 Adopted Budget
- ☐ Ten (10) agencies were approved for funding. Agencies are currently training and placing citizens in Year 2.
- □ Recommendations for approval of grant funding were brought before the Economic Development Investment Board, Urban County Council Budget, Finance & Economic Development Committee, and final approval from the full Urban County Council.

- ☐ Financial grantees agree to submit quarterly performance reports in coordination with the Office of the Chief Development Officer and the Workforce Development Manager.
- Workforce Development Manager conducts on-site compliance and monitoring visits throughout the year.
- □ LFUCG reserves the right to demand repayment if the grant outcomes are not met.

- □ New application process for the next round of potential grant funding will begin in Fall 2019 (pending council budget approval in FY2020 budget).
