At **JA BizTown**, the students will discover the real-life opportunities available in the free enterprise system, as they become business operators, taxpayers and consumers for the day in one of the **JA BizTown** businesses: Chick-fil-A, Forcht Bank, iHeart Media, Keeneland, Kentucky Coal Association, KentuckyOne Health, Kentucky Society of CPAs, Kentucky Utilities, LEX 18, Lexington Herald-Leader, Scanlon Family Philanthropy Center, Toyota, UK HealthCare, University of Kentucky and UPS.

The **JA BizTown** curriculum is designed to correlate to Kentucky's Core Content as well as focusing on 21st Century Job Skills.
