The actual cost of the relocation totaled \$36,054.03 which is a \$12,524.03 increase above the original estimated \$23,530.00 cost presented in the utility relocation agreement for Job Order No. 16-0266670-00. This increase results in a 53.23% increase to the agreement. Funds are budgeted. (L0482-17) (Martin/Hoskins-Squier)
