# HOME COMPOST PILOT REPORT

#### Goals

- Provide alternative organic material disposal option for households in the Urban Service Area
  - Landfill
  - (Yard waste) mulching
- Encourage at-home food composting



#### **Program Overview**

- Three workshops
  - Sept., Oct., Nov.
  - Facilitated by Seedleaf
- Demonstration site installed at McConnell Springs
- 60 households max (avg. 20 per workshop)
- Discounted composter
  - Worm, \$10\*
  - Stationary backyard, \$20
  - Tumbler, \$30



#### **Results: By the Numbers**

- Number of households: 45
- Number of participants: 64
- Number of no shows: 27

















#### **Actual: Compost Bins Ordered**

- Worm bins: 6
- Stationary composter: 13
- Tumbling composter: 18
- None/Doing their own thing: 6
- No response: 2

- April (~ 6 months)
- October (~ 1 year)

November workshop	\$1,940	\$1,232

#### Take-aways

- McConnell Springs and Seedleaf were both amazing partners
- There is significant demand
- More time communicating with participants than anticipated
- Taking payments for and arranging pickup of composters is a significant challenge
- Plan for no-shows
- Composter supply is currently unpredictable; prices are unstable



#### **Moving Forward**

- 3 workshops a year
- Move to winter: one in January, two in February
- Continue to pay Seedleaf to facilitate
- Increase cap from 20 to 30-35 households per workshop
  - Target 100 households per year
- More deliberate promotion moving forward
