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### II. <u>Bid Conditions</u>

- A. No bid may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days after the date and time set for opening.
- B. No bid may be altered after the date and time set for opening. In the case of obvious errors, the Division of Central Purchasing may permit the withdrawal of a bid. The decision as to whether a bid may be withdrawn shall be that of the Division of Central Purchasing.
- C. Acceptance of this proposal shall be enactment of an Ordinance by the Urban County Council.
- D. The bidder agrees that the Urban County Government reserves the right to reject <u>any</u> and <u>all</u> bids for either fiscal or technical reasons, and to award each part of the bid separately or all parts to one vendor.

- E. Minor exceptions may not eliminate the bidder. The decision as to whether any exception is minor shall be entirely that of the head of the requisitioning Department or Division and the Director of the Division of Central Purchasing. The Urban County Government may waive technicalities and informalities where such waiver would best serve the interests of the Urban County Government.
- F. Manufacturer's catalogue numbers, trade names, etc., where shown herein are for descriptive purposes and are to guide the bidder in interpreting the standard of quality, design, and performance desired, and shall not be construed to exclude proposals based on furnishing other types of materials and/or services. However, any substitution or departure proposed by the bidder must be clearly noted and described; otherwise, it will be assumed that the bidder intends to supply items specifically mentioned in this Invitation for Bids.
- G. The Urban County Government may require demonstrations of the materials proposed herein prior to acceptance of this proposal.
- H. Bids must be submitted on this form and must be signed by the bidder or his authorized representative. Unsigned bids will not be considered.
- Bids must be submitted prior to the date and time indicated for opening. Bids submitted after this time will not be considered.
- J. All bids mailed must be marked on the face of the envelope:

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government assumes no responsibility for bids that are not addressed and delivered as indicated above. Bids that are not delivered to the Division of Central Purchasing by the stated time and date will be rejected.

- K. Bidder is requested to show both unit prices and lot prices. In the event of error, the unit price shall prevail.
- L. A certified check or Bid Bond in the amount of <u>5</u> percent of the bid price must be attached hereto. This check must be made payable to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, and will be returned when the material and/or services specified herein have been delivered in accordance with specifications. In the event of failure to perform within the time period set forth in this bid, it is agreed the certified check may be cashed and the funds retained by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as liquidated damages. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned when the bid has been awarded.
- M. The delivery dates specified by bidder may be a factor in the determination of the successful bidder.
- N. Tabulations of bids received may be mailed to bidders. Bidders requesting tabulations must enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope with the bid.
- O. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is exempt from Kentucky Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax on materials purchased from this bid invitation. Materials purchased by the bidder for construction projects are not tax exempt and are the sole responsibility of the bidder.
- P. All material furnished hereunder must be in full compliance with OSHA regulations.
- Q. If more than one bid is offered by one party, or by any person or persons representing a party, all such bids shall be rejected.
- R. Signature on the face of this bid by the Bidder or his authorized representative shall be construed as acceptance of and compliance with all terms and conditions contained herein.
- S. The Entity (regardless of whether construction contractor, non-construction contractor or supplier) agrees to provide equal opportunity in employment for all qualified persons, to prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, sex or age, and to promote equal employment through a positive, continuing program from itself and each of its sub-contracting agents. This program of equal employment opportunity shall apply to every aspect of its employment policies and practices.

The Kentucky Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 (KRS 45.560–45.640) requires that any county, city, town, school district, water district, hospital district, or other political subdivision of the state shall include in directly or indirectly publicly funded contracts for supplies, materials, services, or equipment hereinafter entered into the following provisions:

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

- (1) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age or national origin;
- (2) The contractor will state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractors that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age or national origin;
- (3) The contractor will post notices in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, setting forth the provisions of the non-discrimination clauses required by this section; and
- (4) The contractor will send a notice to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under the nondiscrimination clauses.

### The Act further provides:

KRS 45.610. Hiring minorities - Information required

- (1) For the length of the contract, each contractor shall hire minorities from other sources within the drawing area, should the union with which he has collective bargaining agreements be unwilling to supply sufficient minorities to satisfy the agreed upon goals and timetable.
- (2) Each contractor shall, for the length of the contract, furnish such information as required by KRS 45.560 to KRS 45.640 and by such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to all books and records pertaining to his employment practices and work sites by the contracting agency and the department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with KRS 45.560 to 45.640 and such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto.

### KRS 45.620. Action against contractor - Hiring of minority contractor or subcontractor

- (1) If any contractor is found by the department to have engaged in an unlawful practice under this chapter during the course of performing under a contract or subcontract covered under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the department shall so certify to the contracting agency and such certification shall be binding upon the contracting agency unless it is reversed in the course of judicial review.
- (2) If the contractor is found to have committed an unlawful practice under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the contracting agency may cancel or terminate the contract, conditioned upon a program for future compliance approved by the contracting agency and the department. The contracting agency may declare such a contractor ineligible to bid on further contracts with that agency until such time as the contractor complies in full with the requirements of KRS 45.560 to 45.640.
- (3) The equal employment provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 may be met in part by a contractor by subcontracting to a minority contractor or subcontractor. For the provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640, a minority contractor or subcontractor shall mean a business that is owned and controlled by one or more persons disadvantaged by racial or ethnic circumstances.

### KRS 45.630 Termination of existing employee not required, when

Any provision of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 notwithstanding, no contractor shall be required to terminate an existing employee upon proof that that employee was employed prior to the date of the contract.

### KRS 45.640 Minimum skills

Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job.

It is recommended that all of the provisions above quoted to be included as special conditions in each

contract. In the case of a contract exceeding \$250,000, the contractor is required to furnish evidence that his work-force in Kentucky is representative of the available work-force in the area from which he draws employees, or to supply an Affirmative Action plan which will achieve such representation during the life of the contract.

U. Any party, firm or individual submitting a proposal pursuant to this invitation must be in compliance with the requirements of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government regarding taxes and fees before they can be considered for award of this invitation and must maintain a "current" status with regard to those taxes and fees throughout the term of the contract. The contractor must be in compliance with Chapter 13 from the Code of Ordinances of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government. The contractor must be in compliance with Ordinance 35-2000 pursuant to contractor registration with the Division of Building Inspection. If applicable, said business must have a Fayette County business license.

Pursuant to KRS 45A.343 and KRS 45A.345, the contractor shall

- (1) Reveal any final determination of a violation by the contractor within the previous five year period pursuant to KRS Chapters 136 (corporation and utility taxes), 139 (sales and use taxes), 141 (income taxes), 337 (wages and hours), 338 (occupational safety and health of employees), 341 (unemployment and compensation) and 342 (labor and human rights) that apply to the contractor; and
- (2) Be in continuous compliance with the above-mentioned KRS provisions that apply to the contractor for the duration of the contract.

A contractor's failure to reveal the above or to comply with such provisions for the duration of the contract shall be grounds for cancellation of the contract and disqualification of the contractor from eligibility for future contracts for a period of two (2) years.

V. Vendors who respond to this invitation have the right to file a notice of contention associated with the bid process or to file a notice of appeal of the recommendation made by the Director of Central Purchasing resulting from this invitation.

Notice of contention with the bid process must be filed within 3 business days of the bid/proposal opening by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support contention, to the Director of the Division of Central Purchasing or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Central Purchasing to explain his/her contention with the bid process. After consulting with the Commissioner of Finance the Chief Administrative Officer and reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor, the Director of Central Purchasing shall promptly respond in writing findings as to the compliance with bid processes. If, based on this review, a bid process irregularity is deemed to have occurred the Director of Central Purchasing will consult with the Commissioner of Finance, the Chief Administrative Officer and the Department of Law as to the appropriate remedy.

Notice of appeal of a bid recommendation must be filed within 3 business days of the bid recommendation by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support appeal, to the Director, Division of Central Purchasing or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Central Purchasing to explain his appeal. After reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor and consulting with the Commissioner of Finance and the Chief Administrative Officer, the Director of Central Purchasing shall in writing, affirm or withdraw the recommendation.

### **LFUCG Non-Appropriation Clause**

Contractor acknowledges that the LFUCG is a governmental entity, and the contract validity is based upon the availability of public funding under the authority of its statutory mandate.

In the event that public funds are unavailable and not appropriated for the performance of the LFUCG's obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically expire without penalty to the LFUCG thirty (30) days after written notice to Contractor of the unavailability and non-appropriation of public funds. It is expressly agreed that the LFUCG shall not activate this non-appropriation provision for its convenience or to circumvent the requirements of this contract, but only as an emergency fiscal measure during a substantial fiscal crisis, which affects generally its governmental operations.

In the event of a change in the LFUCG's statutory authority, mandate and mandated functions, by state and federal legislative or regulatory action, which adversely affects the LFUCG's authority to continue its obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically terminate without penalty to the LFUCG upon written notice to Contractor of such limitation or change in the LFUCG's legal authority.

### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO THE BIDDER

### (DO NOT SUBMIT PERFORMANCE SECURITY WITH BID)

<u>Performance Security:</u> The <u>APPARENT LOW BIDDER</u> shall furnish, before recommendation by the Division of Central Purchasing to the Urban County Council that the <u>BIDDER'S</u> bid be accepted, a <u>Performance Bond, Certified Check or Cashier's Check</u>, payable to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, in the penal sum of <u>100%</u> of the price of the materials and/or services proposed in the bid.

The performance bond will not be returned to the bidder after delivery of the materials/services specified herein unless the bidder requests that the performance bond be returned.

The certified / cashier's check will be returned when the materials and/or services specified herein have been delivered.

In the event of bidder's failure to perform as specified herein, it is agreed that the monies represented by the performance bond or certified / cashier's check shall be retained by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as liquidated damages.

Contracts that are less than \$50,000 will not require a 5% bid security or a performance and payment bond.

### **EQUAL OPPORTUNITY AGREEMENT**

#### The Law

- Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (amended 1972) states that it is unlawful for an employer to discriminate in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age (40-70 years) or national origin.
- Executive Order No. 11246 on Nondiscrimination under Federal contract prohibits employment discrimination by contractor and sub-contractor doing business with the Federal Government or recipients of Federal funds. This order was later amended by Executive Order No. 11375 to prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex.
- Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 states:

The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental disability.

- Section 2012 of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act of 1973 requires Affirmative Action on behalf of disabled veterans and veterans of the Vietnam Era by contractors having Federal contracts.
- Section 206(A) of Executive Order 12086, Consolidation of Contract Compliance Functions for Equal Employment Opportunity, states:

The Secretary of Labor may investigate the employment practices of any Government contractor or sub-contractor to determine whether or not the contractual provisions specified in Section 202 of this order have been violated.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government practices Equal Opportunity in recruiting, hiring and promoting. It is the Government's intent to affirmatively provide employment opportunities for those individuals who have previously not been allowed to enter into the mainstream of society. Because of its importance to the local Government, this policy carries the full endorsement of the Mayor, Commissioners, Directors and all supervisory personnel. In following this commitment to Equal Employment Opportunity and because the Government is the benefactor of the Federal funds, it is both against the Urban County Government policy and illegal for the Government to let contracts to companies which knowingly or unknowingly practice discrimination in their employment practices. Violation of the above mentioned ordinances may cause a contract to be canceled and the contractors may be declared ineligible for future consideration.

#### **GENERAL PROVISIONS OF BID CONTRACT**

By signing the below, bidder acknowledges that it understands and agrees with the following provisions related to its bid response and the provision of any goods or services to LFUCG upon selection by LFUCG pursuant to the bid request:

- Bidder shall comply with all Federal, State & Local regulations concerning this type of service or good.
- 2. Failure to submit ALL forms and information required by LFUCG may be grounds for disqualification.
- 3. Addenda: All addenda, if any, must be considered by the bidder in making its response, and such addenda shall be made a part of the requirements of the bid contract. Before submitting a bid response, it is incumbent upon bidder to be informed as to whether any addenda have been issued, and the failure of the bidder to cover any such addenda may result in disqualification of that response.
- 4. Bid Reservations: LFUCG reserves the right to reject any or all bid responses, to award in whole or part, and to waive minor immaterial defects in proposals. LFUCG may consider any alternative proposal that meets its basic needs.
- 5. Liability: LFUCG is not responsible for any cost incurred by bidder in the preparation of its response.
- Changes/Alterations: Bidder may change or withdraw a proposal at any time prior to the opening; however, no oral modifications will be allowed. Only letters, or other formal written requests for modifications or corrections of a previously submitted proposal which is addressed in the same manner as the bid response, and received by LFUCG prior to the scheduled closing time for receipt of bids, will be accepted. The bid response when opened, will then be corrected in accordance with such written request(s), provided that the written request is contained in a sealed envelope which is plainly marked "modifications of bid response".
- 7. Clarification of Submittal: LFUCG reserves the right to obtain clarification of any point in a bid or to obtain additional information from any bidder.
- 8. Bribery Clause: By his/her signature on its response, bidder certifies that no employee of his/hers, any affiliate or subcontractor, has bribed or attempted to bribe an officer or employee of the LFUCG.
- 9. Additional Information: While not necessary, the bidder may include any product brochures, software documentation, sample reports, or other documentation that may assist LFUCG in better understanding and evaluating the bid response. Additional documentation shall not serve as a substitute for other documentation which is required by the LFUCG to be submitted with the bid response.
- 10. Ambiguity, Conflict or other Errors: If a bidder discovers any ambiguity, conflict, discrepancy, omission or other error in the bid request of LFUCG, it shall immediately notify LFUCG of such error in writing and request modification or clarification of the document if allowable by the LFUCG.
- Agreement to Bid Terms: In submitting its bid response, the bidder agrees that it has carefully examined the specifications and all provisions relating to LFUCG's bid request, including but not limited to the bid contract. By submission of its bid response, bidder states that it understands the meaning, intent and requirements of LFUCG's bid request and agrees to the same. The successful bidder shall warrant that it is familiar with and understands all provisions herein and shall warrant that it can comply with them. No additional compensation to bidder shall be authorized for services, expenses, or goods reasonably covered under these provisions that the bidder omits from its bid response.
- 12. Cancellation: LFUCG may unilaterally terminate the bid contract with the selected bidder(s) at any time, with or without cause, by providing at least thirty (30) days advance written notice unless a different advance written notice period is negotiated prior to contract approval. Payment for services or goods received prior to termination shall be made by the LFUCG provided these goods or services were provided in a manner acceptable to the LFUCG. Payment for those goods and services shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 13. Assignment of Contract: The selected bidder(s) shall not assign or subcontract any portion of the bid contract with LFUCG without the express written consent of LFUCG. Any purported assignment or subcontract in violation hereof shall be void. It is expressly acknowledged that LFUCG shall never be required or obligated to consent to any

request for assignment or subcontract; and further that such refusal to consent can be for any or no reason, fully within the sole discretion of LFUCG.

- 14. No Walver: No failure or delay by LFUCG in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege hereunder, nor any single or partial exercise thereof, nor the exercise of any other right, remedy, power or privilege shall operate as a waiver hereof or thereof. No failure or delay by LFUCG in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege under or in respect of this bid proposal or bid contract shall affect the rights, remedies, powers or privileges of LFUCG hereunder or shall operate as a waiver thereof.
- 15. Authority to do Business: Each bidder must be authorized to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and must be in good standing and have full legal capacity to provide the goods or services specified in the bid proposal. Each bidder must have all necessary right and lawful authority to submit the bid response and enter into the bid contract for the full term hereof including any necessary corporate or other action authorizing the bidder to submit the bid response and enter into this bid contract. If requested, the bidder will provide LFUCG with a copy of a corporate resolution authorizing this action and/or a letter from an attorney confirming that the proposer is authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. All bid responses must be signed by a duly authorized officer, agent or employee of the bidder.
- 16. Governing Law: This bid request and bid contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In the event of any proceedings regarding this matter, the bidder agrees that the venue shall be the Fayette County Circuit Court or the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, Lexington Division and that the bidder expressly consents to personal jurisdiction and venue in such Court for the limited and sole purpose of proceedings relating to these matters or any rights or obligations arising thereunder.
- 17. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is now accepting bids for the removal and reinstallation of lighting fixtures and the minor expansion and reconfiguration of electrical service to two large fleet service shops located at the LFUCG Fleet Services Facility, 669 Byrd Thurman Drive, Lexington, KY 40510 per the following specifications:

### Large/Heavy Vehicle Shop - Scope of Work

- Contractor to install a new minimum 1 ½" "lighting only" conduit running from the electric panel up to the height of the center run of lights. Conduit will run the full length of each shop and end near the opposite wall. Junction boxes will be installed as needed to feed the lateral light runs. Contractor must support new conduit directly from the building structure and not from hangers supporting HVAC, sprinkler, or other infrastructure.

  - Square D QO (20) space panel. All breakers to match existing type and manufacture in use in existing panels.
  - Sub-panel may be located in Mechanical/Tool room adjacent to existing panel or on the outside wall of the Mechanical/Tool Room (Preferred).
    - All wall penetrations must be sealed to maintain existing fire rating.
- Install (5) new 20 Amp circuits in the new sub-panel each feeding (1) quad/4 gang outlet at locations noted on the plans.
  - Contractor to install a new minimum 1" conduit running from the sub-panel up to the height of the center run of lights so as to run adjacent to the new "Lighting" conduit. Conduit will run the full length of the bay and end at the opposite wall. Contractor must support new conduit directly from the building structure and not from hangers supporting HVAC, sprinkler, or other infrastructure. Contractor may reduce this conduit size at their discretion as the circuit count within diminishes.
  - Vertical conduit down to the outlet(s) should be secured to the structural column. Outlet(s) should be located approximately 48" AFF and face nearest work bench. Large/Heavy shop manager to provide contractor with a more precise location at pre-construction meeting.

### Small/Car Shop – Scope of Work

- Contractor to install a new minimum 1 ¼" "lighting only" conduit running from the electric panel up to the height of the center run of lights. Conduit will run the full length of each shop and end near the opposite wall. Junction boxes will be installed as needed to feed the lateral light runs. Contractor must support new conduit directly from the building structure and not from hangers supporting HVAC, sprinkler, or other infrastructure.
- No lighting fixture(s) may be utilized as a junction box or raceway.
- Lighting in this shop is configured in (5) circuits and will be rewired in a similar configuration with the noted changes. Total of 59 lights to be removed and replaced.
  - Emergency lighting circuit will be reconfigured to feed the (5) lights shown in "Red" on Sheet # 2.
    - This circuit is not switched, lights on this circuit remain on 24/7. The owner is providing "New in Box" LED Fixtures that include a battery backup.
  - Front Tire area circuit currently feeds (2) un-switched lights that have already been replaced.
    - Modify existing wiring as needed and add switch to control these two lights. This circuit
      may feed electric to other fixtures/outlets. Only the two lights are to be switched.
  - The center aisle or walkway lighting shall be centered over the walkway.

- The remaining (3) circuits are currently not switched. The contractor is install surface mounted boxes (5) switches adjacent to the existing panel. The circuits/switches should be configured as follows:
  - (1) switch for the center aisle lighting.
  - (1) switch the front.
  - (1) switch for the rear.
- Install (9) new 20 Amp circuits; (7) circuits will each feed (1) quad/4 gang, (2) circuits will feed GFCI/WP Duplex outlet(s) at locations noted on the plans.
  - Existing panels shown on plans have sufficient space and capacity for the new circuits.
    - All new breakers to match existing type and manufacture in use in existing panels.
  - Contractor to install a new minimum 1 ½" conduit running from the electric panel up to the height of the center run of lights so as to run adjacent to the new "Lighting" conduit. Conduit will run the full length of the bay and end at the opposite wall. Contractor must support new conduit directly from the building structure and not from hangers supporting HVAC, sprinkler, or other infrastructure. Contractor may reduce this conduit size at their discretion as the circuit count diminishes.
  - Vertical conduit down to the outlet(s) should be secured to the structural column or anchored securely to wall. Outlet(s) should be located approximately 48" AFF and face nearest work bench. Small/Car shop manager to provide contractor with a more precise location at pre-construction meeting.
    - (3) outlet(s) will require the contractor to provide and install a code compliant "Anchor
      point". The anchor point should be constructed solid enough to safely take minor bumping
      from tool boxes. Owner has several examples already installed.

### General Notes - Scope of Work

- Contractor is responsible for providing any/all materials, wiring, brackets/adapters, and equipment required to complete this project. As noted: The owner will ONLY be providing "New in Box" light fixtures.
  - Contractor may reuse at their own risk and where code or regulations allow any materials from the
    existing lighting infrastructure being removed. Such as existing wire, conduit, hangers, etc. except
    as noted where new materials, sizes, or methods are required. Under no circumstances may
    salvaged material from another job(s) be reused to complete this work.
- Sheets #3 provides a "not to scale" sectional view show the general installation location of the fixtures.
- Each fixture must attach in a rigid manner to the building structure by a minimum of two separate points.
   This shall be accomplished thru the use of a beam/purlin clamp and threaded rod. CABLE OR WIRE HANGING OF FIXTURES ON THIS PROJECT IS NOT ACCEPTABLE.

- It is the contractor's responsibility to determine the exact size and configuration of clamp(s) and threaded rod needed for each application. This may changes throughout the project based on the fixture location and/or available structure.
  - The contractor should note that these fixtures will be frequently exposed to wind loads, and select and install hardware accordingly.
- The contractor may utilize uni-strut as needed to establish intermediate anchor points between the fixtures and the building structure as needed/required.
- All material utilized in hanging the light fixtures must be new/not previously used; such as beam clamps, threaded rod, nuts/washers, uni-strut, etc.
- Contractor is responsible for removal, recycling, and proper disposal of all existing lamps, fixtures, ballasts, and other materials no longer needed. The contractor is not authorized to "abandon in place" any materials, including but not limited to wiring, conduit, hangers, safety cables, etc.
  - Contractor is required to provide proof of proper disposal of lamps and ballasts with final pay application.
- Contractor is responsible for the cost and coordination for all permits, fees, and inspections required to complete all work as noted in this scope and attached drawings.
  - All work must conform to all applicable codes and regulations, not limited to the following:
     Kentucky Electrical Code, Kentucky Building Codes, National Electric Code, and National Fire Protection Association/Kentucky Fire Code.
  - All work must be performed in accordance with OSHA and KOSH regulations.
  - If a conflict exists between any applicable code and these plans and specifications. It is the contractor's responsibility to bring that to the attention of the project manager immediately. Nothing in these plans or specification should be construed as superseding applicable code(s).
- Contractor is responsible to provide for any and all related crane, man lift and/or rigging services required to accomplish this task.
  - LFUCG will provide the contractor an exterior staging area to be utilized for the contractor to store equipment, dumpster(s), and staging of material for disposal/recycling.
- Contractor to provide a 1 year material and workmanship warranty on all work; excluding the owner purchased fixtures.
- Contractor will have 30 calendar days from receipt of purchase order to source materials and begin
  construction. Contractor will have 45 calendar days from initiation of construction to reach substantial
  completion of the project. Contractor will have an additional 10 calendar days to reach final completion;
  this includes passing all required inspections.
  - Liquidated damages of \$250.00 per day will be assessed for failure to reach substantial completion within the allotted time.

- Liquidated damages of \$150.00 per day will be assessed for failure to reach final completion within the allotted time.
- Contractor must perform work on off Hours: Monday through Friday, 6:00 PM through 7:00 AM; Saturday
  and Sunday beginning at 6:00 PM Friday and end at 7:00 AM on Monday. Contractor may also work any
  hours on LFUCG holidays.
  - Contractor will ensure all areas are "work ready" at the beginning of each LFUCG work day Mon-Fri (7:00 AM).
  - Contractor may only work in one shop at a time, and must complete all work in that shop less any
    required inspections prior to beginning work in the second shop.
  - Contractor must provide a construction schedule to the project manager prior to initiation of construction.
  - Contractor must provide the project manager with a written progress report at the end of each
    week. At a minimum the report must indicate the % of work or milestone(s) completed in the
    current week as well as a schedule of work for the upcoming week.
- Contractor is responsible for daily job site cleanup. Contractor is responsible for complete job site cleanup once equipment is installed.

**NOTE:** LFUCG will provide three (3) pedestals for the electric outlets in the car bay and they will be available to the vendor before work is started.
