7. LEXINGTON FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT MWDBE PARTICIPATION GOALS, FORMS, AND GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

A. GENERAL

- 1) The LFUCG request all potential contractors to make a concerted effort to include Minority-Owned (MBE), Woman-Owned (WBE), Disadvantaged (DBE) and Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) Enterprises as subcontractors or suppliers in their bids.

B. PROCEDURES

- 1) The successful bidder will be required to report to the LFUCG, the dollar amounts of all payments submitted to Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned subcontractors or Veteran-Owned and suppliers for work done or materials purchased for this contract. (See Subcontractor Monthly Payment Report)
- 2) Replacement of a Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned or Veteran-Owned subcontractor or supplier listed in the original submittal must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by documentation of Good Faith Efforts to replace the subcontractor / supplier with another MWDBE Firm; this is subject to approval by the LFUCG. (See LFUCG MWDBE Substitution Form)
- 3) For assistance in identifying qualified, certified businesses to solicit for potential contracting opportunities, bidders may contact:
 - a) The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Division of Central Purchasing (859-258-3320)
- 4) The LFUCG will make every effort to notify interested MWDBE subcontractors and suppliers of each Bid Package, including information on the scope of work, the pre-bid meeting time and location, the bid date, and all other pertinent information regarding the project.

C. DEFINITIONS

1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.

- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by one or more Non-Minority Females.
- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) A Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by a veteran and/or a service disabled veteran.
- 5) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) The bidder shall make a Good Faith Effort to achieve the Participation Goal for MWDBE and Veteran-Owned subcontractors/suppliers. The failure to meet the goal shall not necessarily be cause for disqualification of the bidder; however, bidders not meeting the goal are required to furnish with their bids written documentation of their Good Faith Efforts to do so.
- 2) Award of Contract shall be conditioned upon satisfaction of the requirements set forth herein.
- 3) The Form of Proposal includes a section entitled "MWDBE Participation Form". The applicable information must be completed and submitted as outlined below.
- 4) Failure to submit this information as requested may be cause for rejection of bid or delay in contract award.

E. DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) Bidders reaching the Goal are required to submit only the MWDBE Participation Form." The form must be fully completed including names and telephone number of participating MWDBE firm(s); type of work to be performed; estimated value of the contract and value expressed as a percentage of the total Lump Sum Bid Price. The form must be signed and dated, and is to be submitted with the bid.
- 2) Bidders not reaching the Goal must submit the "MWDBE Participation Form", the "Quote Summary Form" and a written statement documenting their Good Faith Effort to do so. If bid includes no MWDBE and/or Veteran participation, bidder shall enter "None" on the subcontractor / supplier form). In addition, the bidder must submit written proof of their Good Faith Efforts to meet the Participation Goal:

- a. Advertised opportunities to participate in the contract in at least two (2) publications of general circulation media; trade and professional association publications; small and minority business or trade publications; and publications or trades targeting minority, women and disadvantaged businesses not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to participate.
- b. Included documentation of advertising in the above publications with the bidders good faith efforts package
- c. Attended LFUCG Central Purchasing Economic Inclusion Outreach event
- d. Attended pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned Businesses of subcontracting opportunities
- e. Sponsored Economic Inclusion event to provide networking opportunities for prime contractors and MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses.
- f. Requested a list of MWDBE and/or Veteran subcontractors or suppliers from LFUCG Economic Engine and showed evidence of contacting the companies on the list(s).
- g. Contacted organizations that work with MWDBE companies for assistance in finding certified MWBDE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses should be a part of the bidder's good faith efforts documentation.
- h. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email or facsimile, to qualified, certified MWDBEs soliciting their participation in the contract not less than seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
- i. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting MWDBEs and Veteran-Owned businesses to determine their level of interest.
- j. Provided the interested MWBDE firm and/or Veteran-Owned businesses with adequate and timely information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract.
- k. Selected portions of the work to be performed by MWDBE firms and/or Veteran-Owned businesses in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the contract goals. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate MWDBE and Veteran participation, even when the prime contractor may otherwise perform these work items with its own workforce
- l. Negotiated in good faith with interested MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses not rejecting them as unqualified without sound reasons based on a thorough

investigation of their capabilities. Any rejection should be so noted in writing with a description as to why an agreement could not be reached.

- 3. Refer to the Specifications, Section 131100 Spraygrounds. Part 2 PRODUCTS, 2.2 SPECIALIZED SPRAYGROUND MATERIAL VENDORS AND MANUFACTURERS, Section D states: "The Equipment Supplier shall have previously supplied sprayground system design, drawing and equipment, similar in size and complexity to the specified project." Add the note: "Sprayground equipment supplier / vendor shall be able to demonstrate a minimum of twenty (20) successfully installed Sprayground projects of similar size and scope over the last ten (10) years."
- 4. Refer to the Specifications, Section 131100 Spraygrounds. Refer to Part 3 EXECUTION, section 3.1A states "Should the bidder wish to substitute products other than the products specified herein, the bidder shall list products and submit a written Substitution Fer-of Proposal at least 10 calendar days prior to the date of receipt of bids." Note that this refers to a substitution for individual products specified in the Drawings and Specifications, not a Sprayground vendor substitution. Delete the note that proposal to substitute products shall be submitted 10 calendar days prior to the date of receipt of bids; substitution of individual products may be submitted after receipt of bids, upon review and acceptance of proposed Sprayground vendor / manufacturer.

2.0 Drawings:

1. Refer to the Drawings, Sheets JS 1.0, JS 2.0 and MSS 1.0 and MSS 2.0. Note reference to a sump drain in the bottom of the storage tank. Sprayground vendor shall supply gravity sump drain in the bottom of the tank. However, delete reference to connecting gravity drain to sanitary sewer. Instead, Contractor shall install a 12" diameter French drain to connect to tank sump drain. French drain shall be at the



same depth as the tank sump drain line and shall be 12" in diameter, wrapped completely in filter fabric, and filled with washed #57 drainage stone. French drain shall extend 50' from point of sump drain, extending downslope at minimum 1/8" / foot.

3.0 Other:

There will be no tap fee for water service per Kentucky American Water. There will be
a tap fee for sanitary sewer connections at both sites. Bidders are instructed to
include a total of three thousand, six hundred dollars and no cents (\$3,600,00) for all
sanitary sewer tap fees in their bid. Bidders shall submit actual cost to the Owner
after work is complete and any necessary adjustment to the Contract for costs (add
or deduct) will be made at that time.

2.0 Site Utility Items - Plumbing:

- 1. The plumbing contractor shall coordinate all sanitary sewer taps with the LFUCG Sewer Department, Mike Lambert at 859-258-3433.
- 2. The plumbing contractor is responsible for the sewer tap fees for this project. See Addendum No. 4 for the sewer tap fee amount. This includes both locations. The LFUCG sewer department will be making the taps and the plumbing contractor will be responsible for the connections to the tees provided by the LFUCG taps. Please note that at Jacobson Park the tap will be made by using an Inserta Tee method by LFUCG.
- 3. Provide and install Backwater valves, Josam 67360 series or equal, for the 6" sanitary sewer piping connections. There shall be 3 valves total 2 at Jacobson Park at each of the 6" sanitary sewer piping locations (restroom building and sprayground piping) and 1 at Masterson Station at the sprayground 6" sanitary sewer piping.
- 4. Per the sprayground drawings, there shall be an air gap before the connection from the overflow of the recirculating tap to the sanitary sewer line.
- 5. The plumbing contractor is responsible for the installation of all p-traps on the Jacobson Park modular restroom building once it is placed on site.
- 6. The Masterson Station modular building will be installed on site and then the plumbing contractor will be responsible for installing the floor drain inside this building after it is placed on site.

4.0 Questions:

Q1: Can a precast modular building by CST, Inc., be bid as an approved equal for the restroom and storage buildings?

A1: The precast modular building submitted for preapproval does not meet the intent of the Specification and cannot provide the wall construction and finish and roof type to meet LFUCG Parks and Recreation standards, and cannot be accepted.

Q2: After reviewing, is there conflicting information on the drawings? They reference Water Odyssey and ARC, and we don't know which park has which product.

A2: The Jacobson Park site and the Masterson Station Park site each have two schematic designs shown. For Jacobson Park, see JS1.0 for the schematic ARC (Aquatix) layout and JS2.0 for the schematic Water Odyssey layout. For Masterson Station Park, see MSS1.0 for the schematic ARC (Aquatix) layout and MSS2.0 for the schematic Water



Odyssey layout. These schematic designs provide a guide for the types of feature and minimum number of features to be included, as well as minimum requirements for equipment, pad and systems.

Q3: Please confirm water treatment. We are to provide activator, controller, manifold and drains?

A3: The Sprayground design is to be a complete package system by the Sprayground vendor, as noted on the Drawings and in the Specifications. This includes all equipment (mechanical, electrical, features, appurtenances), sprayground pad, recirculation system, etc. as needed to create a complete, functioning Sprayground system.


