

## Planholders shall incorporate the following into the Contract Documents for the project:

- 1. A pre-bid meeting was held on June 10, 2019 at the LFUCG Division of Water Quality. The minutes of the meeting and list of attendees are included below as Attachment No. 1.
- 2. The following questions were received, and responses are indicated in red text.
  - a) For bioretention area: What is elevation of water table? (Stream is at ~965'). We don't know.
  - b) What is elevation of rock? Several rock soundings in the LFUCG properties were obtained, and the minimum depth of those soundings was 6.3'.
  - c) Is Contractor responsible for ensuring that bioretention basin drains in a specified time frame (e.g...,48 hours). No.
  - d) Will the diversion structure (by others) have a hole in it for the proposed 10" corrugated hdpe pipe? Yes.
  - e) When will the storm sewer contractor be finished? Scheduled for mid-September 2019.
  - f) Will we be able to get the rock for the rock toe and the boulder edge from the West Hickman Treatment Plant? What will the process be if we choose to go this route in acquiring the rock? Regarding obtaining the boulders, the successful bidder will be provided contact information for the West Hickman Wastewater Treatment Plant site. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all arrangements pertaining to accessing the site and loading the rock.
  - g) What is the difference in type 1 and type 2 coir erosion control blanket? Specifications for Type I and Type II Coir Fabric are defined in the provided GI Specification 31 05 20 Coir Fabric for Earthwork.
  - h) Will an Erosion and Sediment Control Bond and Warranty Bond be required? Yes, see PB-8 in the Contract Documents.
  - i) Is there an engineer's estimate that will be given for the project? Less than \$250,000.

- j) Will there be a unit price addition for the boulder edge rock? Or should the price be included elsewhere in the bid? This work shall be incidental to the Lump Sum price for General Conditions.
- k) Regarding Pay Item 3 Can you provide a breakdown of how the Earthwork (Cut) quantity was established? Using digital terrain modeling, and including subgrade excavation to be replaced with filter media. What is the anticipated quantity of stripped topsoil? We don't know.
- Regarding Pay Item 11 Does the 375 CY quantity cover the full quantity needed for 24" media placement for the entire job or has this number factored in the use of the stripped topsoil? It is the full quantity, including topsoil, with no assumption of the topsoil source. Note that the filter media thickness varies in different locations.
- 3. On page P-35 of the Contract Documents, in the Evidence of Insurability table, the minimum limits of AUTO coverage shall be changed from \$2,000,000 to \$1,000,000.
- 4. Detail F on Sheet 6 of the Plans has erroneous elevations. The correct elevations are illustrated below.



Special Conditions #5 on page SC-6 of the Contract Documents: replace "2A" with "3". WGPL Storm Sewer Project, Bid No. 60-2019 Addendum No. 1 – June 11, 2019 Page 3

- 6. Section 01025 of the Contract Documents:
  - a. Item 2.10 the text should not have been struck out.
  - b. Item 2.11 replace "Rock Pretreatment Area" with "Bioretention Filter Media".
- 7. There is no change to the bid submittal deadline at this time.

#### **Bidding**

- Bids will only be accepted from registered plan holders who have purchased plans from Lynn Imaging.
- 2. Bids will be received at the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing, 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Government Center, until 2:00 p.m. on June 17, 2019. Bids will be opened and read aloud at that time. The intent is to award a construction contract no later than the last council meeting prior to summer break (July 9, 2019).
- 3. All questions should be sent to Brian Marcum of Purchasing no later than noon on June 11, 2019.
- 4. The Contractor shall make every effort to meet the LFUCG disadvantaged business goals of 10% MBE/WBE and 3% veteran-owned business. Sherita Miller will send attendees the list of certified DBE firms and stated that DBE subconsultants must be certified prior to contract award.
- 5. Bids must include all of the required forms and documents contained in the bid package. Bidders shall pay particular attention to the risk management provisions.

#### Utilities

- 1. All utility locations are approximate as shown. The Contractor is responsible for verifying the existence of all utilities in the project area whether they are shown on the plans or not.
- 2. Approximate location of a sanitary sewer line is identified on the plans. Contractor is responsible for locating and flagging this line such that it is not disturbed by grading and no equipment is tracked over the line.

#### Construction

- 1. The general project purpose is to construct a bioretention area and two bioswales with native plantings to improve surface water quality and to construct a walking trail to provide recreation benefits to local residents.
- 2. A field office is not required for this project. The Contractor is responsible for all staging areas and borrow/waste sites. The site is within the regulatory floodplain, and the Contractor shall

- protect the materials and equipment accordingly. Sharing of access and staging/stockpile areas with others constructing the nearby storm sewer project may be required.
- 3. The Contractor shall coordinate with the current storm sewer construction in the WGPL neighborhood. There is expected to be overlap in the two projects construction schedule. . The storm sewer contract stipulates coordination with the green infrastructure basin contract.
- 4. Bidders are advised that the WGPL neighborhood has narrow streets and an active neighborhood association.
- 5. LFUCG purchased an adjacent property at 1871 Pensacola Drive. It will be demolished but the demolition date has not been established.
- 6. The alignment of the proposed walking trail shall be staked and approved prior to construction.
- 7. Contractor shall maintain access to private properties and street traffic shall be maintained.
- 8. Construction is adjacent to Wolf Run Creek. Erosion and sediment control shall be implemented (as indicated in Plans and Technical Specifications, including SWPPP) to prevent sediment from leaving the site and/or entering Wolf Run Creek. The maximum width of natural creek buffer possible shall be protected and remain undisturbed. The only creek disturbance required is for the installation of two bioretention outlet pipes, which is a permitted activity. Streambank disturbance shall be minimized and stabilized as soon as possible after outlet pipes are installed.
- 9. Equipment tracking and compaction-causing activities shall be minimized over the entire site and especially within the footprint of the bioretention area and bioswales.
- 10. Flow diversions may be required to build these green infrastructure features "in the dry". No sediment-laden water shall be discharged into Wolf Run Creek. Clean runoff shall be diverted around construction areas.
- 11. A diversion structure (where stormwater is split and routed into the bioretention area and bioswale) has been constructed by others (See Sheet 4). Contractor shall connect pipe with end treatment to the diversion structure.
- 12. Some trees within the grading limits (indicated on Sheet 4) will be removed by others prior to the initiation of this project. All other tree removal shall be the minimum necessary for project construction. Tree removal requires written approval.
- 13. Native seed, plant plugs, and trees are specified for installation in the bioretention area and bioswales. Contractor shall contact nurseries and suppliers early to ensure availability of specified species (see Sheet 3 and Technical Specifications 31 25 50 Bioretention Area and 31 23 40 Bioswale).
- 14. In addition to construction warranty, plant plugs and trees shall have a one-year period of care and replacement following substantial completion as detailed in project Special

Conditions (section SC-7). Success is defined as 70% survival at the end of the one year period following Substantial Completion.

- 15. Testing and verification of components of Bioretention Filter Media (see Technical Specifications 31 25 50 Bioretention Area) shall be provided by Contractor. Contractor shall furnish all materials, equipment, and labor require to sample and test media components or provide verification for supplied components. The mixing of the filter media shall be witnessed by Owner or certified by the supplier. Clay content is a primary concern. In-situ topsoil may be used if it meets the specification requirements.
- 16. As indicated in Technical Specification 01720 Project Record Documents, Contractor shall obtain a post-construction topographic survey of the constructed project and submit digital drawings with digital terrain model.
- 17. Owner to supply access to boulders for "no mow" boulder border from construction ongoing at West Hickman Wastewater Treatment Plant (just south of Lexington in Jessamine County, West Hickman Plant Road). The Contractor shall be responsible for loading, transporting, and placing the boulders.

#### **Permits**

- Permit approvals from the Kentucky Division of Water for Floodplain Construction and Water Quality Certification and United States Army Corps of Engineers for Placing Fill in an Aquatic Resource (to install bioretention outlet pipes) have been acquired by the Owner. Copies of permit approvals and conditions are included as Appendix B to the project Specifications. All permit conditions must be met by the Contractor (all costs to do so shall be the responsibility of the Contractor).
- All other permitting (including the KPDES Notice of Intent and LFUCG Land Disturbance Permit), and/or notifications associated with the work on this project to include all costs, testing, notices of intents, storm water pollution prevention plans, etc., for this project shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. For a lump sum based bid, the item total is the bid amount the Division uses for bid comparison.

For a unit price based bid, the sum of the item totals is the bid amount the Division uses for bid comparison.

The LFUCG's decision on the bid amount is final.

The contract, if awarded, will be on the basis of materials and equipment specified in the specifications without consideration of possible substitute or "or equal" items.

The estimated quantities of items of unit price work are not guaranteed and are solely for the purpose of comparison of bids and determining an initial Contract price. Determination of the actual quantities and classification of unit price work performed by the Contractor will be made by the Engineer in accordance with the General Conditions.

Contrary to General Conditions Item 10.9.1, quantities of items on the Bid Form are considered "Plan Quantities" and are final, not subject to change unless the Owner agrees in writing to plan changes. There shall be no separate measurement of quantities during or after construction.

# 7. Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government MWDBE PARTICIPATION GOALS

#### A. GENERAL

- 1) The LFUCG request all potential contractors to make a concerted effort to include Minority-Owned (MBE), Woman-Owned (WBE), Disadvantaged (DBE) Business Enterprises and Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (VOSB) as subcontractors or suppliers in their bids.

- 2) Replacement of a Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned or Veteran-Owned subcontractor or supplier listed in the original submittal must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by documentation of Good Faith Efforts to replace the subcontractor / supplier with another MWDBE Firm; this is subject to approval by the LFUCG. (See LFUCG MWDBE Substitution Form)
- 3) For assistance in identifying qualified, certified businesses to solicit for potential contracting opportunities, bidders may contact:

- 4) The LFUCG will make every effort to notify interested MWDBE and Veteran-Owned subcontractors and suppliers of each Bid Package, including information on the scope of work, the pre-bid meeting time and location, the bid date, and all other pertinent information regarding the project.

#### C. DEFINITIONS

- 1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.
- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by one or more women.
- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a person(s) that are economically and socially

disadvantaged.

- 4) A Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a veteran and/or a service disabled veteran.
- 5) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

### D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) The bidder shall make a Good Faith Effort to achieve the Participation Goal for MWDBE and Veteran-Owned subcontractors/suppliers. The failure to meet the goal shall not necessarily be cause for disqualification of the bidder; however, bidders not meeting the goal are required to furnish with their bids written documentation of their Good Faith Efforts to do so.

- 2) Bidders not reaching the Goal must submit the "MWDBE Participation Form", the "Quote Summary Form" and a written statement documenting their Good Faith Effort to do so. If bid includes no MWDBE and/or Veteran participation, bidder shall enter "None" on the subcontractor / supplier form). In addition, the bidder must submit written proof of their Good Faith Efforts to meet the Participation Goal:
  - a. Advertised opportunities to participate in the contract in at least two (2) publications of general circulation media; trade and professional association publications; small and minority business or trade publications; and publications or trades targeting minority, women and disadvantaged businesses not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to participate.
  - b. Included documentation of advertising in the above publications with the bidders good faith efforts package
  - c. Attended LFUCG Central Purchasing Economic Inclusion Outreach event

- d. Attended pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned businesses of subcontracting opportunities
- e. Sponsored Economic Inclusion event to provide networking opportunities for prime contractors and MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses.



- f. Requested a list of MWDBE and/or Veteran subcontractors or suppliers from LFUCG and showed evidence of contacting the companies on the list(s).
- g. Contacted organizations that work with MWDBE companies for assistance in finding certified MWBDE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses should be a part of the bidder's good faith efforts documentation.
- h. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email or facsimile, to qualified, certified MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned businesses soliciting their participation in the contract not less than seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
  - i. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting MWDBEs and Veteran-Owned Businesses to determine their level of interest.
- j. Provided the interested MWBDE firm and/or Veteran-Owned business with adequate and timely information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract.



- k. Selected portions of the work to be performed by MWDBE firms and/or Veteran-Owned businesses in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the contract goals. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate MWDBE and Veteran participation, even when the prime contractor may otherwise perform these work items with its own workforce
- 1. Negotiated in good faith with interested MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses not rejecting them as unqualified without sound reasons based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities. Any rejection should be so noted in writing with a description as to why an agreement could not be reached.
