SUBJECT: Federal funding for Fiscal Year 2017 Chemical Stockpile Emergency

Preparedness Program (CSEPP)

Request:

Council authorization to accept award from the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management of federal funds in the amount of \$496,250 under the Fiscal Year 2017 Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP).

Purpose of Request:

On June 11, 2017, (Resolution 459-2017(Council approved the submission of a grant application requesting federal funding from the CSEPP Program. The Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management has offered the LFUCG an award of \$496,250 for the continuation of the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2017. These funds will be used to support salaries and benefits of a part-time administrative assistant, part-time manager, and a public information officer (.5FTE), maintain an alert and notification system, communications, public outreach and education, purchase of supplies, maintenance of equipment and software, EOC enhancements, computer equipment, equipment for traffic control and evacuee support, decontamination equipment, and professional development.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?

Available federal funding in Fiscal Year 2017 is \$496,250. No matching funds are required. Future years funding is dependent upon availability of federal funding.

Are the funds budgeted? Budget amendment #8703 is in process.
