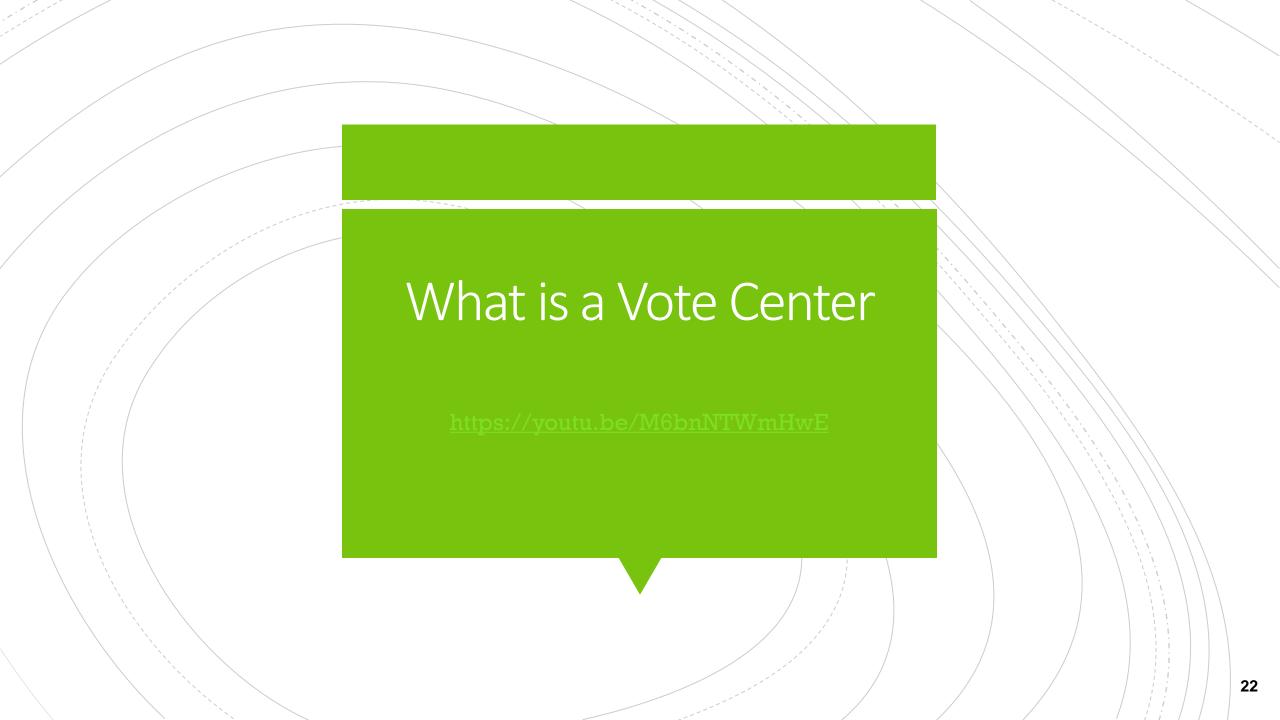

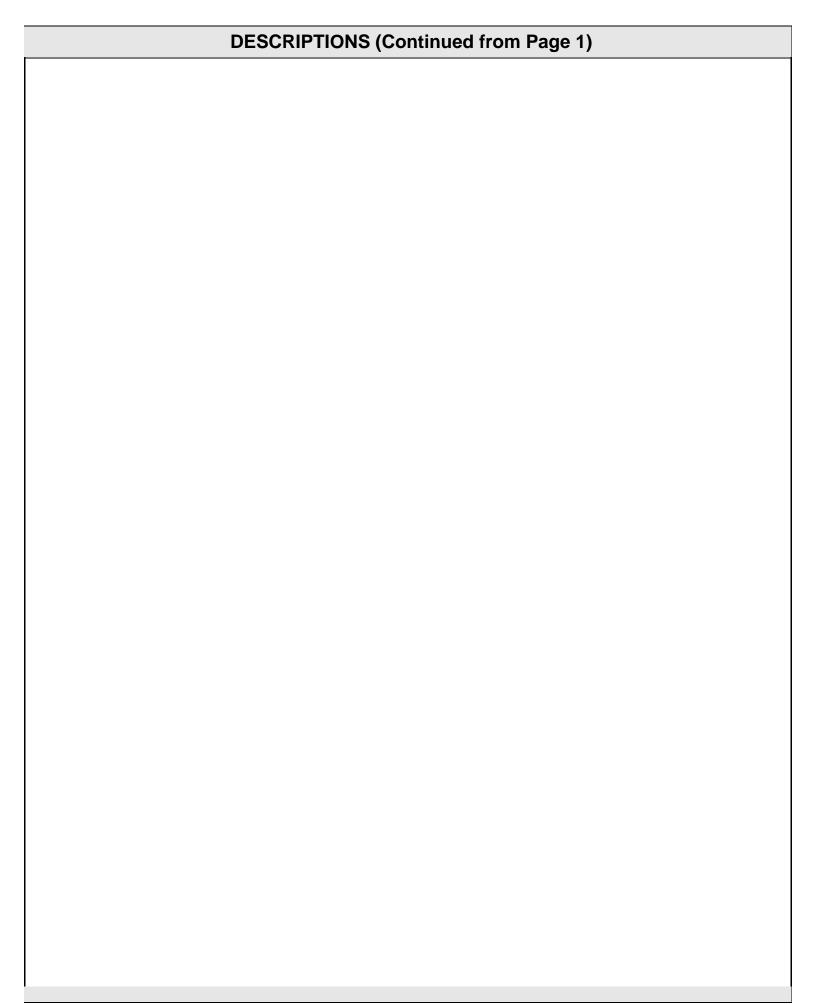

### AGREEMENT WITH LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT GRANTING HVAC PERMITTING AND INSPECTION RESPONSIBILITY PURSUANT TO KRS 198B.6673(2)

WHEREAS, Chapter 198B of the Kentucky Revised Statutes authorizes the creation of the uniform state building code within the boundaries of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and assigns specific enforcement responsibilities to each local government and to the Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction ("Department"); and

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Building Code is adopted by administrative regulation, 815 KAR 7:120, and the Kentucky Residential Code is adopted by administrative regulation, 815 KAR 7:125; and

WHEREAS, statutes specifically related to Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning ("HVAC") are found at KRS 198B.650 through 198B.689; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to KRS 198B.6673(2), the Department may authorize local government entities to administer, carry out, and enforce the applicable statutes, regulations, and code of the Department relating to HVAC with approval by the Department; and

WHEREAS, the Department has previously granted Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("LFUCG") additional responsibility pursuant to KRS 198B.6673(2) and 815 KAR 8:100; and

WHEREAS, LFUCG has met all criteria required for a renewal of its local jurisdiction HVAC program pursuant to KRS 198B.6673(2) and 815 KAR 8:100.

#### Section I: Jurisdiction Granted to Local Program

LFUCG shall assume primary permitting, inspection, and enforcement responsibility of initial HVAC installations and major repairs or substantial alterations to an HVAC system under KRS 198B.650 through 198B.689; 815 KAR Chapter 8; the Kentucky Building Code, 815 KAR 7:120; and the Kentucky Residential Code, 815 KAR 7:125; and all other applicable laws and regulations for all buildings within its jurisdictional boundaries with the exception of those found in Section II of this agreement.

#### Section II: Jurisdiction Retained by Department

The Department shall retain HVAC permitting, inspection, and enforcement responsibility within the jurisdictional boundaries of LFUCG for all of the following buildings:

- 1. Institutional buildings;
- Facilities required to be licensed by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services; including, for example, day care centers, hospitals, nursing homes, and other similar facilities:
- 3. State owned buildings or state leased facilities;
- 4. High hazard occupancies; and
- 5. Industrialized building systems, including modular homes, unless the HVAC system is installed on site in the jurisdictional limits of LFUCG.

#### **Section III: Inspectors**

It is further understood and agreed that continuation of this increased responsibility for LFUCG shall be contingent upon continued employment or contracting of one or more HVAC inspectors who shall meet and maintain the qualifications found in 815 KAR 8:100 Section 1(2). LFUCG shall immediately notify the Department of any changes to the program or inspectors employed or under contract.

#### **Section IV: Complaints**

LFUCG shall address all complaints related to HVAC projects within its jurisdiction, and document all findings and resolutions reached, if any.

#### Section V: Violations

LFUCG's program shall investigate all HVAC violations that occur within its jurisdiction, issue stop work orders, or require other remedial measures as appropriate. Additionally, local programs shall initiate and fully cooperate with County Attorneys and Commonwealth's Attorneys regarding criminal cases resulting from cited violations. LFUCG's employees shall act as witnesses for the Department in all licensing violation proceedings, as needed and requested by the Department. Violations and their resolutions shall be documented in writing and forwarded to the Department, Division of HVAC upon completion.

#### **Section VI: Accounting of Fees**

Accurate accounts shall be maintained by LFUCG for all permitting and inspection fees under its HVAC program. Fees shall be deposited monthly in the local government's treasury or otherwise as required by law.

#### Section VII: Record Retention and Audits

LFUCG shall maintain official records of all applications received, permits and certificates issued, fees collected, reports of inspections created, complaints, violations, and notices or orders issued related to the HVAC program. Records shall be retained for the retention period required for public records as established by the Kentucky Department of Libraries and Archives, pursuant to 725 KAR 1:061.

#### **Section VIII: Deficiencies**

Any deficiencies identified in LFUCG's HVAC program shall be addressed pursuant to 815 KAR 8:100 Section 8(4).

#### Section IX: Term

The jurisdiction granted by agreement to LFUCG shall be in force and effect for a maximum of three (3) years upon execution of this agreement so long as the program remains compliant and in good standing. This agreement shall be effective through October \_\_\_\_\_, 2026. However, it may be cancelled pursuant to KRS 198B.6673 and 815 KAR 8:100, with thirty (30) days written notice from either party.

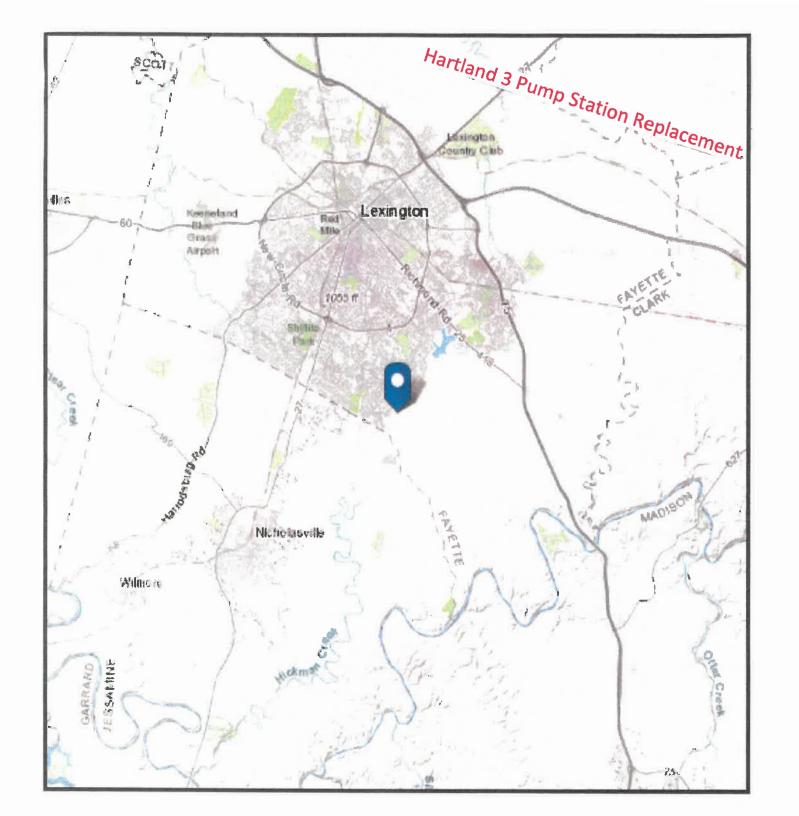

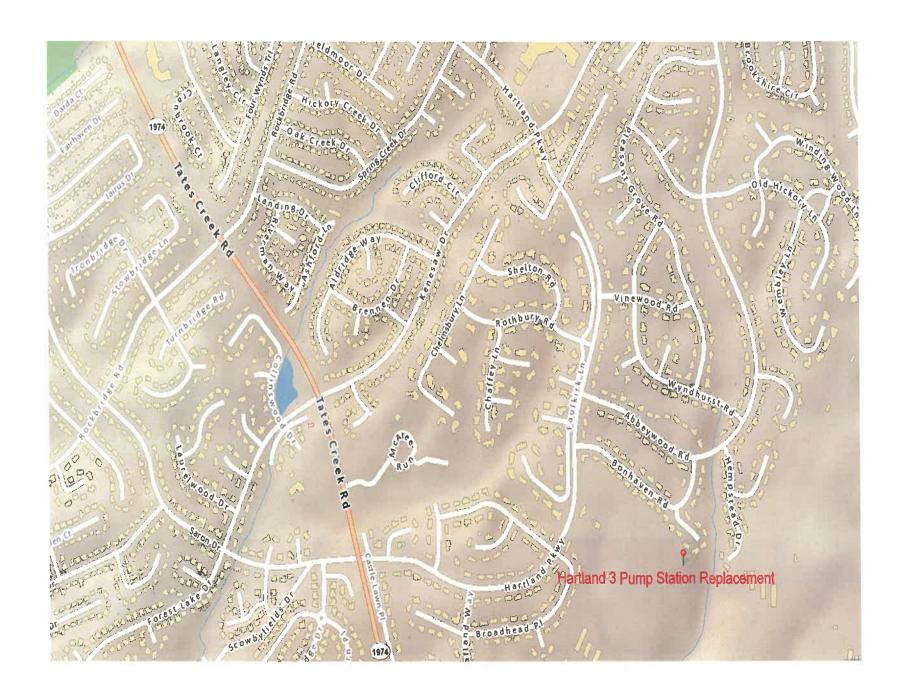

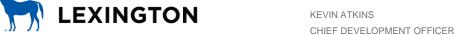

#### **REASON FOR REQUEST:**

KEENELAND ASSOCIATION, INC.'s facility, located at 4201 Versailles Road, is undergoing significant reinvestment through facility improvements to ensure the long-term viability of the venue. Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("LFUCG") incentives will be utilized to reimburse infrastructure requirements related to the construction of this project.

The Economic Development Investment Board reviewed the request for allocation of a Public Infrastructure Incentive for this project, and has recommended Council approval. As part of the approval process the Council will waive the requirement in the ordinance related to these public infrastructure funds that the funding be provided in the form of an interest free loan.

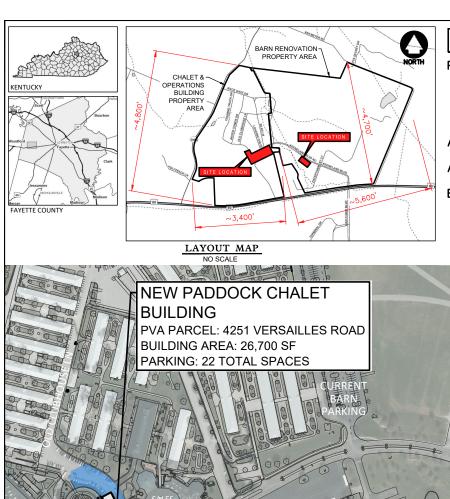

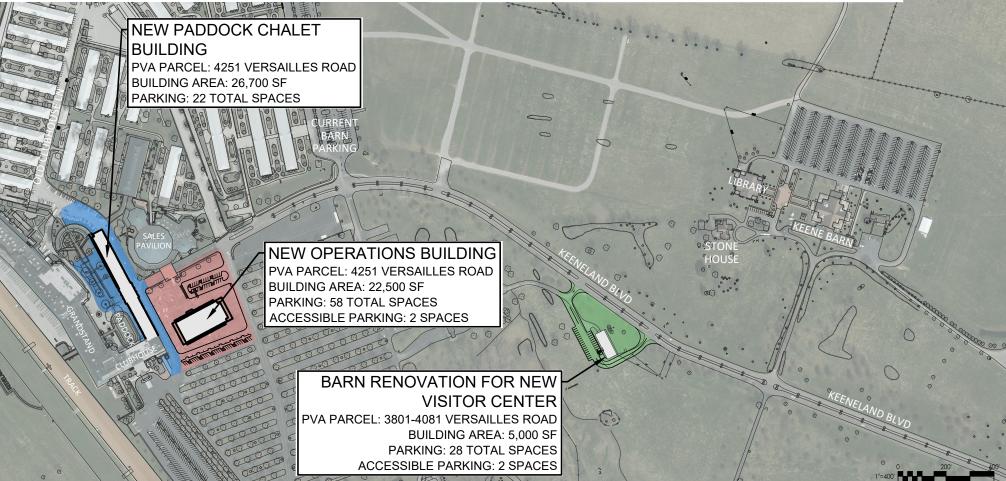

# **Keeneland Expansion Project**

## Founded by Horsemen

Since opening in October 1936, Keeneland has been unique in the Thoroughbred industry. Only at Keeneland are world-class racing and industry-leading sales united under one mission-driven entity. Today, Keeneland continues to be guided by its original mission, taking a leadership role in the industry to improve safety, promote integrity and strengthen the sport of racing.

# A Global Leader in the Thoroughbred Industry

Keeneland is the world's largest and most prominent Thoroughbred auction house and hosts world-class racing twice annually during its boutique Spring and Fall meetings. Owners, trainers, riders and fans from all over the world travel to Lexington each year to participate at Keeneland.

Its April and October race meets offer 40 graded stakes races worth over \$10 million and include 10 Breeders' Cup "Win-and-You're-In" events. Its thoroughbred auctions include 4 different sales in January, April, September, and November each year which generate over \$500 million in total sales and include over 50 countries being represented by buyers and sellers.

### A Commitment to Reinvestment

Keeneland's mission to perpetuate the sport of racing continues more than eight decades after its founding, as profits from Keeneland racing and sales are returned to the industry and community through initiatives such as:

- Racing purses Over the past 7 years, nearly \$40 million has been contributed by Keeneland sales above what is required per horsemen agreements to fund one of the richest purse structures in North America.
- Global market development Keeneland is committed to the growth of the Thoroughbred industry and the buying bench at its auctions and actively travels to numerous foreign countries and invests hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to expand the marketplace.
- **Industry initiatives** Keeneland proudly supports safety initiatives and equine organizations and is an advocate for Thoroughbred aftercare to improve the health of the industry. In the past 5 years, Keeneland has contributed nearly \$1.5 million to the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance alone.
- **Fan development** Keeneland is committed to the growth of the industry's fans and future participants. Each race meet creates racing fans of all ages, exemplified

- by the 10,000 members of the Keeneland Kids Club which exceeds. Enthusiastic crowds underscore Keeneland's commitment to fan development.
- Local community Proudly serving as a leader in Central Kentucky, Keeneland
  is committed to the community. This community activism began with Keeneland
  founders and continues to this day. Keeneland has donated millions to local
  charities, as well as to health and educational programs. Intended as a gathering
  place for the local community, Keeneland hosts hundreds of charitable and private
  events annually.

# Project Description, Location, and Timetable

Keeneland is planning to invest in a significant expansion of their facilities in Lexington, Kentucky so that they may better meet demand for premium experience access at the track and continue to drive increased visitorship to Lexington. As currently contemplated, the Keeneland Expansion Project ("Project") is anticipated to cost approximately \$92.6 million and will include the development of a new Paddock Chalet Building with premium guest experience offerings, the relocation of Keeneland's back-of-house operations, grandstand upgrades near the finish line, and the development of a dedicated visitor's center to receive guests at the property but away from the main racing areas.

The Project plans include a brand-new Paddock Chalet Building with over 100,000 square feet of space and capacity to host up to 1,657 additional guests each day in premium areas with dining options, bars, event spaces, and rooftop access. With a fully seated capacity of 936, the Paddock Chalet building will offer a truly elevated experience across several different areas within the building. Each area will have various different features and levels of service, allowing many more patrons to enjoy a premium experience at the track while also creating additional opportunity for Keenland to host lifetime celebrations and other entertainment events.

In order to make room for this amenity, which will also serve as a main entrance to the racetrack and overlooking the paddock, Keeneland will be required to relocate its existing space utilized for racetrack operations to a new Operations Building, which will be strategically located adjacent to both the existing sales pavilion and the new Paddock Chalet Building. The addition of a 42,000 square foot Operations Building will free up critical space for visitors to enjoy the track, both at the site of the new Paddock Chalet Building and within the trackside grandstands.

Keeneland's Project plans also include several construction projects to improve the experience for those race fans sitting trackside. The seating within the grandstand and nearest the finish lines should, by most standards, be "premium seating" similar to seats on the 50-yard line at a football game or center-court at a basketball game. There are not

sufficient amenities in these areas to adequately serve patrons. To help, Keeneland plans to cut an opening in the exterior wall outside of the third-floor dining area to provide enhanced food and beverage service to these areas.

Each year, Keeneland welcomes visitors to its race meets and sales. Keeneland hosts a race meet in October and April each year as well as four horse sales throughout each year. It is important to Keeneland's mission that it continues to welcome new visitors to its grounds, both during and outside these 61 days of organized activity, and that it has a quality experience to offer them while they are on the property. Keeneland does not currently have a location dedicated to visitors; however, it plans to work with professionals and other industry participants on phases to develop a state-of-the-art visitor experience, including interactive opportunities for visitors to learn more about the horse and our sport. Within the next three years, Keeneland plans to begin this iterative process by starting with the renovation of Keeneland's pony barn. This 5,400 square foot Visitor's Center will be located away from the main track along Keeneland Blvd. to receive visitors, buses, and include amenities to improve their time spent on the property.

At an estimated total development cost of \$92.6 million, the Project represents a serious undertaking and investment in the future of the track and the tourism industry of the Commonwealth. Hoping to break ground in early 2024, the projected construction schedule should allow usage of the new and improved amenities in time for the Spring meet in 2026.

#### LSC Stadium Company, LLC – Project Description

The proposed stadium, located in the Athens-Boonesboro corridor adjacent to Interstate 75, will serve as the home of Lexington Sporting Club's professional men's and women's teams, hosting over thirty (30) home games each calendar year.

The stadium is projected to start with 5,400 seats with the ability to expand to 11,000 seats in future years. The stadium will also serve as the potential home of High School state championships and regional university conference championships. The stadium will serve as an economic driver for the entire region, creating demand in an under-developed part of Fayette County.

The \$35 million stadium will be part of an overall \$85 million investment in facilities, infrastructure and performance buildings to support the local youth and professional soccer eco-system.

Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("LFUCG") incentives will be utilized for the development of a professional soccer stadium with at least 5,250 seats and a related training facility.

The Economic Development Investment Board reviewed the requests for IRB and Public Infrastructure Forgivable Loan Incentive for this project, and have recommended Council approval of both incentives. As part of the approval process the Council will waive the requirement in the ordinance related to the public infrastructure funds that the funding be provided in the form of an interest free loan.



The Company or its affiliates has been awarded state sales tax incentives under Kentucky's Tourism Development Incentive Program as a designated Kentucky Tourism Development Act Project for the already-constructed youth soccer fields, and the Kentucky Enterprise Initiative Act as a qualifying economic development project with the support of LFUCG.

LFUCG previously entered into an agreement in June 2023 providing the Company or its affiliates with \$1 million in incentives to assist with the construction of youth soccer fields for the benefit of the Lexington community.

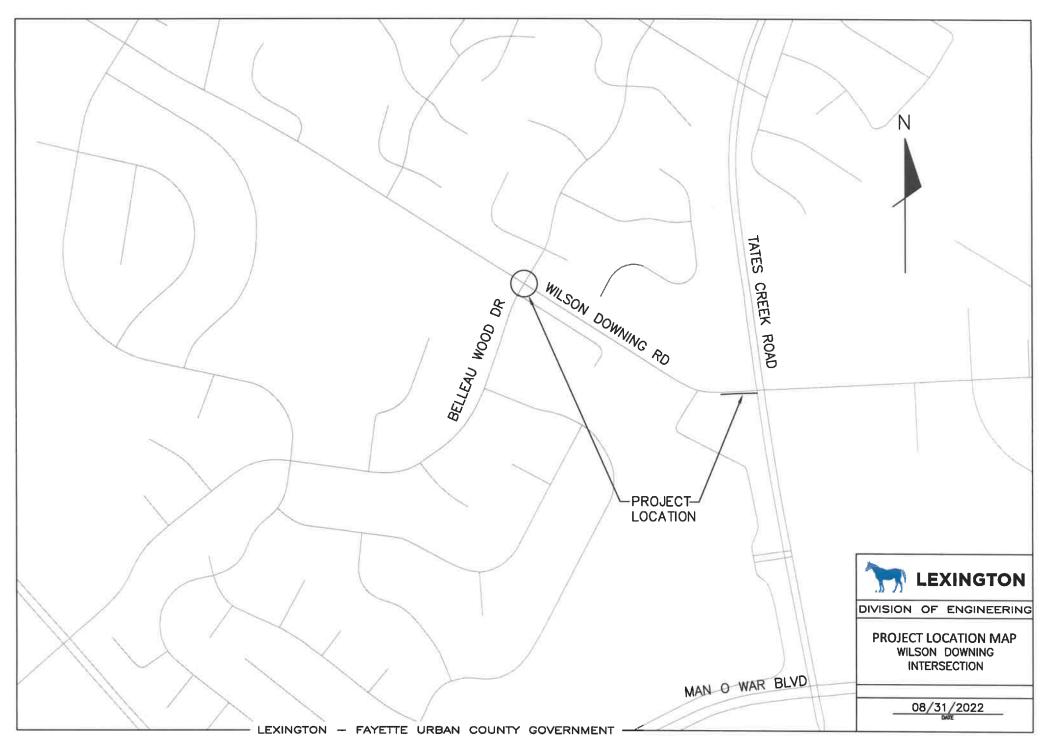

**Purpose of Request:** On July 7, 2015 (Resolution 465-2015), Council authorized execution of an Engineering Services Agreement in the amount of \$286,600 with Strand Associates Inc. for design of Town Branch Trail Phase 6 (RFQ 18-2015). On March 22, 2017 (Resolution 117-2017) Council approved execution of Contract Modification No.1 in the amount of \$744,174 for addition of the preparation of the final design which increased the contract total to \$1,030,774. On September 30, 2021 (Resolution 532-2021), Council approved Contract Modification No. 2 increasing the contract by \$42,100 which increased the contract total to \$1,072,874. On May 5, 2022 (Resolution 230-2022), Council approved Contract Modification No. 3 in the amount of \$67,500 for additional design increasing the contract to \$1,140,374. On July 13, 2023 (Resolution 419-2023), Council approved Contract Modification No. 4 in the amount of \$53,800.

The LFUCG Division of Engineering needs this action to design wayfinding to improve trail user experience and aesthetics, additional landscaping and evaluate ADA compliance between Oliver Lewis Way and the Norfolk Southern (NFS) railroad for the project.
