The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

The Mayor asked Asst. Chief Dwayne Holman and Officer Derrick Wallace, Div. of Police, to join him at the podium. The Mayor stated Mr. Joshua Davis saw Officer Wallace in a struggle and stepped in to help him. His help was appreciated and made the difference between an arrest and the criminal getting away. The Mayor read a Proclamation honoring Mr. Davis and his bravery in assisting the Div. of Police.

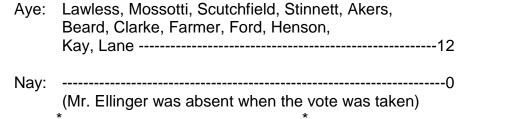

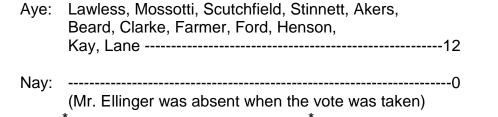

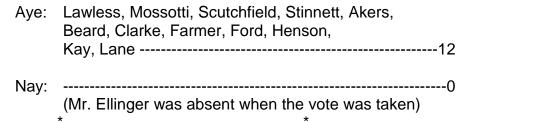
