Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky February 17, 2022

Brown, and Baxter, Environmental Services Educators Danny Woolum and Annie Griggs, and the Meadowthorpe Elementary teaching staff for their participation.

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Vice Mayor Kay announced the passage of American Rescue Plan Act proposals and funding sources at the February 17, 2022 Special Committee of the Whole Meeting, and updated the Council on the next steps in the process.

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Ms. Lamb implored Councilmembers to recognize the value Mock Council Meetings hold for students and encouraged Councilmembers to continue hosting the events.

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Upon motion by Vice Mayor Kay, seconded by Ms. Baxter, and approved by unanimous vote, the meeting adjourned at 6:43 p.m.
