- 1) Bids are due by September 11, 2015 at 2:00 PM local time.
- 2) Plans and Specifications are available at Lynn Imaging, 859-255-1021.
- 3) LFUCG owns the landfill, Tetra Tech is the Engineer, and Red River Ranch operates the compost pad.
- 4) The prevailing wage determination from the KY Labor Cabinet is at the end of the Form of Proposal.
- 5) LFUCG Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) goal is 10%.
- 6) Bids must be accompanied by a bid bond in the amount of 5% of the bid.
- 7) The project is not tax exempt.
- 8) The time of completion is 60 calendar days. Liquidated damages are \$200 per day.
- 9) The Bid Schedule is on page P-6.

- 10) This is a unit price project. The measurement and payment section describes the various items listed in the Bid Schedule. The "Demolition and Removal of Ex. Compost Pad" and "Concrete" items will be based on the Plan Quantity Volume. There will be no adjustments to the quantities listed in the Bid Schedule for these 2 items unless the Owner significantly revises the quantity.
- 11) Performance, payment, and warranty bonds are required.

- 12) This project involves demolishing and replacing an existing section of a concrete compost pad including undercutting the subgrade material underneath and recompacting with fill material. The new pad will consist of perforated drainage pipes and accessories, a layer of dense graded aggregate, rebar, and fiber-reinforced concrete. The pad shall be constructed without damage to existing pad that is not listed for demolition.
- 13) The quantities for Excavation (Undercutting) and Compacted Fill Material are based on undercutting the area by 2 feet after the existing concrete and DGA are removed. Some areas may not require undercutting and some areas may require more than 2 feet. See Section 312300 for the subgrade preparation.
- 14) The hours of operation are:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Open first Saturday of each month 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Closed on Wednesdays, Sundays, and remaining Saturdays

- 15) Must maintain access to active compost pad.
- 16) Questions prior to bid opening must be in writing. Last day questions will be accepted is Noon, September 3, 2015.
- 17) An inspector will be on site periodically and during milestone events. The Contractor shall have an independent testing agency perform concrete testing. Testing costs shall be borne by the Contractor. The Engineer may perform density testing and proof-roll the subgrade.
- 18) Electronic plans will be made available to successful bidder, if requested.
- 19) The sign-in sheet for the Pre-Bid Meeting will be attached to Addendum No. 1.
- 20) Blasting will not be allowed.
- 21) Insurance requirements are listed in the Special Conditions.
- 22) A storm water pollution prevention plan is required and is described in Section 312500. The Contractor is responsible for erosion control at the project site as well as any areas disturbed by the contractor at the borrow area. Any permits that are required are the responsibility of the contractor.
- 23) Revegetation of disturbed areas is required and described in Section 329300. Revegetation of disturbed areas in the borrow area is also required; which includes grading for positive drainage.
- 24) The Contractor shall take construction progress photographs. Photographs and/or a video of the access road from the scale-house to the compost pad are required. These will be used to determine if any damage to the access road occurs during the project by the Contractor. See Section 013233.
- 25) The Contractor is responsible for any security measures to protect his work, equipment, materials, etc. See Section 015633.

7. LEXINGTON FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT MWDBE PARTICIPATION GOALS, FORMS, AND GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

A. GENERAL

- 1) The LFUCG request all potential contractors to make a concerted effort to include Minority-Owned (MBE), Woman-Owned (WBE) and Disadvantaged (DBE) Business Enterprises as subcontractors or suppliers in their bids.
- 2) Toward that end, the LFUCG has established 10% of total procurement costs as a Goal for participation of Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned and Disadvantaged Businesses on this contract.
- 3) It is therefore a request of each Bidder to include in its bid, the same goal (10%) for MWDBE participation and other requirements as outlined in this section.

B. PROCEDURES

- 1) The successful bidder will be required to report to the LFUCG, the dollar amounts of all payments submitted to Minority-Owned or Woman-Owned subcontractors and suppliers for work done or materials purchased for this contract. (See Subcontractor Monthly Payment Report)
- 2) Replacement of a Minority-Owned or Woman-Owned subcontractor or supplier listed in the original submittal must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by documentation of Good Faith Efforts to replace the subcontractor / supplier with another MWDBE Firm; this is subject to approval by the LFUCG. (See LFUCG MWDBE Substitution Form)
- 3) For assistance in identifying qualified, certified businesses to solicit for potential contracting opportunities, bidders may contact:
 - a) The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Division of Central Purchasing (859-258-3320)
- 4) The LFUCG will make every effort to notify interested MWDBE subcontractors and suppliers of each Bid Package, including information on the scope of work, the pre-bid meeting time and location, the bid date, and all other pertinent information regarding the project.

C. DEFINITIONS

- 1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.
- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by one or more Non-Minority Females.

- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) The bidder shall make a Good Faith Effort to achieve the Participation Goal for MWDBE subcontractors/suppliers. The failure to meet the goal shall not necessarily be cause for disqualification of the bidder; however, bidders not meeting the goal are required to furnish with their bids written documentation of their Good Faith Efforts to do so.
- 2) Award of Contract shall be conditioned upon satisfaction of the requirements set forth herein.
- 3) The Form of Proposal includes a section entitled "MWDBE Participation Form". The applicable information must be completed and submitted as outlined below.
- 4) Failure to submit this information as requested may be cause for rejection of bid.

E. DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) Bidders reaching the Goal are required to submit only the MWDBE Participation Form." The form must be fully completed including names and telephone number of participating MWDBE firm(s); type of work to be performed; estimated value of the contract and value expressed as a percentage of the total Lump Sum Bid Price. The form must be signed and dated, and is to be submitted with the bid.
- 2) Bidders not reaching the Goal must submit the "MWDBE Participation Form", the "Quote Summary Form" and a written statement documenting their Good Faith Effort to do so. If bid includes no MWDBE participation, bidder shall enter "None" on the subcontractor / supplier form). In addition, the bidder must submit written proof of their Good Faith Efforts to meet the Participation Goal:
 - a. Advertised opportunities to participate in the contract in at least two (2) publications of general circulation media; trade and professional association publications; small and minority business or trade publications; and publications or trades targeting minority, women and disadvantaged businesses not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow MWDBE firms to participate.
 - b. Included documentation of advertising in the above publications with the bidders good faith efforts package

- c. Attended LFUCG Central Purchasing Economic Inclusion Outreach event
- d. Attended pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform MWDBEs of subcontracting opportunities
- e. Sponsored Economic Inclusion event to provide networking opportunities for prime contractors and MWDBE firms
- f. Requested a list of MWDBE subcontractors or suppliers from LFUCG Economic Engine and showed evidence of contacting the companies on the list(s).
- g. Contacted organizations that work with MWDBE companies for assistance in finding certified MWBDE firms to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses should be a part of the bidder's good faith efforts documentation.
- h. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email or facsimile, to qualified, certified MWDBEs soliciting their participation in the contract not less that seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
- i. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting MWDBEs to determine their level of interest.
- j. Provided the interested MWBDE firm with adequate and timely information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract.
- k. Selected portions of the work to be performed by MWDBE firms in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the contract goals. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate MWDBE participation, even when the prime contractor may otherwise perform these work items with its own workforce
- l. Negotiated in good faith with interested MWDBE firms not rejecting them as unqualified without sound reasons based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities. Any rejection should be so noted in writing with a description as to why an agreement could not be reached.
- m. Included documentation of quotations received from interested MWDBE firms which were not used due to uncompetitive pricing or were rejected as unacceptable and/or copies of responses from firms indicating that they would not be submitting a bid.
- n. Bidder has to submit sound reasons why the quotations were considered unacceptable. The fact that the bidder has the ability and/or desire to perform the contract work with its own forces will not be considered a sound reason for rejecting a

MWDBE quote. Nothing in this provision shall be construed to require the bidder to accept unreasonable quotes in order to satisfy MWDBE goals.

- o. Made an effort to offer assistance to or refer interested MWDBE firms to obtain the necessary equipment, supplies, materials, insurance and/or bonding to satisfy the work requirements of the bid proposal.
- p. Made efforts to expand the search for MWBE firms beyond the usual geographic boundaries.
- q. Other--any other evidence that the bidder submits which may show that the bidder has made reasonable good faith efforts to include MWDBE participation.

Failure to submit any of the documentation requested in this section may be cause for rejection of bid. Bidders may include any other documentation deemed relevant to this requirement. Documentation of Good Faith Efforts are to be submitted with the Bid, if the participation Goal is not met.

OUR MISSION: The mission of the Minority Business Enterprise Program is to facilitate the full participation of minority and women owned businesses in the procurement process and to promote economic inclusion as a business imperative essential to the long term economic viability of Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government.

To that end the city council adopted and implemented resolution 167-91—Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) 10% Goal Plan in July of 1991. The resolution states in part (a full copy is available in Central Purchasing):

"A Resolution supporting adoption of the administrative plan for a ten percent (10%) Minimum goal for disadvantaged business enterprise participation in Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government construction and professional services contracts; Providing that as part of their bids on LFUCG construction contracts, general Contractors shall make a good faith effort to award at least ten percent (10%) of All subcontracts to disadvantaged business enterprises; providing that divisions of LFUCG shall make a good faith effort to award at least ten percent of their Professional services and other contracts to disadvantaged business enterprises..."

A Disadvantaged Business Enterprise is defined as a business that has been certified as being at least 51% owned, operated and managed by a U.S. Citizen of the following groups:

- African-American
- Hispanic-American
- Asian/Pacific Islander
- Native American/Native Alaskan
- Non-Minority Female
- Economically and Socially Disadvantaged

Haley Pike Compost Pad Replacement Phase 2 Questions and Answers

Ouestion:

Regarding the new fill to be put in place of the two feet of undercut - where does it come from and what specification does it have to meet?

Answer:

The fill material will come from the borrow area across from the railroad tracks. The area is shown on the Arial View on the Cover Sheet of the Drawings. The specification for the placement of this material is Section 312300, Earthwork.

Ouestions:

Is there a specific concrete recipe that you want to use or are we to propose one to meet a certain spec?

Answer:

The requirements for the concrete are described in Specification Section 033000, Cast-In-Place Concrete.

Question:

Regarding the two feet of undercut from the existing pad, where is that material supposed to be hauled to for disposal.

Answer:

This material shall be used in the borrow area across the railroad tracks to fill any depressions, low areas, or areas needing fill to promote positive drainage as directed by the Owner. The Contractor shall be responsible for hauling, placing, and compacting this material. The contractor shall revegetate these areas in accordance with the Specifications.

Ouestion:

Is the drawing correct showing a tie-in of the new 4" drain under the new pad to a 4" pipe existing in the historic pad?

Answer:

Yes. A 4'x4' area of the existing concrete pad (as shown on Sheet 2 of the Drawings) is to be saw cut and removed in order to access the existing pipe. The connection to the existing pipe is detailed on Sheet 3 of the Drawings.

Question:

Regarding the demolition of the existing concrete and DGA, where is the material supposed to be hauled to for final disposal? If it is to be landfilled, who is responsible for the tipping fee?

Answer:

This material shall be hauled to an area adjacent to the existing stockpiled material at the site. The Contractor shall crush the concrete at this location. The reinforcing steel shall be extracted and the Contractor shall be responsible for the removal of the steel from the site. The size of the final crushed concrete/DGA shall be 3-inch minus. The final crushed material shall be left on-site for use by the Owner and no landfill tipping fee will be required by the Contractor.

"This item includes all labor, materials, and equipment to saw cut the existing concrete and reinforcement, demolish the existing concrete and reinforcement, remove and haul the demolished concrete and reinforcement and existing DGA to the area adjacent to the existing stockpiled material as directed by the Owner, crush the demolished concrete/DGA to a size 3-inches or less, extract and remove from site the existing reinforcing steel per Specifications and as shown in the Drawings. The final crushed material shall be stockpiled for later use by the Owner."

Replace Part 2.07 B with the following:

"This item includes all labor, materials, and equipment to excavate the material and place the material in areas of the borrow area as directed by the Owner per Specifications and as shown on the Drawings so that an acceptable area for compacted fill material is constructed."

2. SPECIFICATION SECTION 024100 – Demolition

Add the following to Part 3.02

"E. The demolished concrete pad material shall be hauled to an area adjacent to the existing stockpiled material at the site. The Contractor shall crush the concrete at this location. The reinforcing steel shall be extracted and the Contractor shall be responsible for the removal of the steel from the site. The size of the final crushed concrete/DGA shall be 3-inch minus. The final crushed material shall be left on-site for use by the Owner and no landfill tipping fee will be required by the Contractor."

3. SPECIFICATION SECTION 312316 – Excavation

Replace Part 3.06 with the following:

"The excess material shall be used in the borrow area across the railroad tracks to fill any depressions, low areas, or areas needing fill to promote positive drainage as directed by the Owner, unless the material is unsuitable, as deemed by the Owner. The Contractor shall be responsible for hauling, placing, and compacting the excess suitable material. The Contractor shall revegetate the areas where excess suitable material is placed in accordance with the Specifications. The unsuitable material shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall determine the best method and location for disposal and obtain all permits and required permission. Disposal on site will not be permitted unless specifically indicated by the Owner."
