

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky January 18, 2024

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on January 18, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Plomin, Reynolds, Sevigny, Sheehan, Worley, Wu, F. Brown, J. Brown, Ellinger, Elliott Baxter, Fogle, Gray, LeGris, Lynch, and Monarrez.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 144-2023 through 160-2023, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 641-2023 through 684-2023, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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Upon motion by Mr. Ellinger, seconded by Mr. Sevigny, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the Minutes of the November 28, 2023 Zone Change Public Hearing and the December 5, 2023 and December 7, 2023 Council Meetings were approved.
