Request:

Request Council authorization to submit application requesting \$50,000 from the Kentucky Energy and Environment Cabinet for the completion of a feasibility study to assess future/potential composting efforts/capabilities at the Haley Pike Waste Management Facility - FY18.

Why are you requesting

The Recycling and Household Hazardous Waste (IHIW) Management Grants Program was established in 2006 by Senate Bill 50, effective July 12, 2006, and incorporated as a part of the Kentucky pride fund. KRS 224.43-505(2) (c) specifies the establishment of recycling and Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) management grant programs. The purpose of the Kentucky Pride Fund Composting Grant Application is to assist applicants in their efforts to achieve a successful program to divert materials from being landfilled and direct them to composting, reuse or other recycling options.

If the grant is awarded, LFUCG will hire a consultant to complete the feasibility study.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?

If the grant is awarded, state funds in the amount of \$50,000 and a required 25% match in the amount of \$12,500 will be budgeted will be budgeted in Fiscal Year 2018. Total cost will be \$62,500. No expenses are anticipated for future budget years.

Are the funds budgeted? Funds will be budgeted if the application is approved.
