Authorization to amend Section 6-53 of the Code of Ordinances relating to the City Employee Pension Fund to provide for a five percent (5%) increase, effective January 1, 2024, to each retiree or beneficiary's base annuity. The increase will apply to all annuity payments made after January 1, 2024. The pension is a "closed" fund, and as of July 1, 2023, there are 8 retirees and 21 beneficiaries participating in the fund, which is over 500% funded. (L1087-23) (Allan/Hamilton)
