SUBJECT: Amendment No. 2 to Agreement for the Home Network Program (HANDS) at

the Family Care Center

Request: Council authorization to execute Amendment No. 2 and accept an award from the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department in the amount of \$70,319 for FY20 and \$8,124 for FY21 for a total award of \$78,443 from state Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) program funds for Home Network Project, also known as Kentucky Health Access Nurturing Development Services (HANDS) at the Family Care Center. There are no matching funds required.

Purpose of Request: On August 26, 2021 (Resolution 476-2021) Council authorized acceptance of grant funds in the amount of \$116,257 for FY22 to add HANDS state Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) funds to the program. On July 6, 2021 (Resolution 359-2021) Council accepted \$412,000 of federal funds and \$144,000 of state funds for the Home Network Project also known as HANDS at the Family Care Center for FY 2022. The Health Department is now offering an additional \$78,443 of federal funds.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? \$33,395 has been awarded for FY2022. The Lexington-Fayette County Health Department use \$45,048 to procure and distribute approved Family Care Center goods and services. Total awarded amount is \$78,443. No match is required. Funds for future budget years dependent upon availability of grant funds.

Are the funds budgeted? Budget amendment 11616 is in process.
