Immediate Response Spill Technologies (IRST) Agreement

The Division of Fire and Emergency Services requests authorization to enter into an agreement with Immediate Response Spill Technologies (IRST) to continue the Hazardous Materials Cost Recovery and Supply Program. The initial term of the agreement is one (1) year and is automatically renewable for an additional one-year term unless otherwise canceled or terminated by the parties. The agreement may be canceled by either party by providing a written thirty-day notice.

The IRST Cost Recovery Program enables the Division of Fire and Emergency Services to recover the cost of time and equipment used during hazardous responses. Additionally, IRST provides high-quality emergency response supplies and training. There is no cost to LFUCG for this service.
