SUBJECT: Invitation to Bid #107-2012 – Pump & Haul Services for DWQ

On August 3, 2012 the Division of Central Purchasing received bids for the purpose of establishing a Price Contract for Pump & Haul Services for the Division of Water Quality.

The EPA Consent Decree requires that the LFUCG have the ability to either provide emergency power or hauling capabilities to all of our pump stations. Many of our larger stations are either equipped with emergency generators or have the capability of being attached to a portable emergency generator in cases of power outage or pump station maintenance that would require power to be temporarily disconnected. This would affect (14) pump stations. As such, an emergency generator is simply not a good financial recommendation nor is rental for a temporary emergency generator; therefore, an emergency pump and haul contract is the best solution.

Notices were sent via Economic Engine to two hundred eighty nine (289) vendors for this particular commodity. Forty four (44) vendors reviewed the document. A Pre-Bid meeting was held on July 26, 2012 with only (2) vendors present, one of which was Martin's Sanitation Service, Inc. Several "no-bids" were indicated on Economic Engine.

The bid submitted by Martin's Sanitation Service, Inc. meets bid specifications and is reasonable and within budgetary constraints.

I recommend the bid of Martin's Sanitation Service, Inc. be accepted.
