**SUBJECT: Kentucky Office of Homeland Security Grant FFY2025 and FFY2026 Application for
Division of Police**

Request: Lexington Police requests council authorization to apply for and accept if awarded grant funds from the KY Office of Homeland Security Grant for \$581,860.00 to purchase three ICOR Technology Mini-CALIBER Robots. Funds are for FY 2027. No matching funds are required.

Purpose of Request: The Kentucky Office of Homeland Security is accepting applications from local governments requesting federal funding from the Homeland Security Grant Program. This federally funded program, originating from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, provides financial assistance to the states to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. The states have the responsibility for apportioning funding to local governments.

The Division of Police is preparing an application to purchase three ICOR Technology Mini-CALIBER Robots, two being for Kentucky State Police at \$140,620 each and an upgrade to our Spartan robot, costing \$160,000. These are used to increase bomb technicians' capabilities during bomb threats, suspicious package investigations, active violence incidents, barricaded subject responses, hazardous materials incidents, and post-blast assessments. The system enhances responder safety while improving the effectiveness of tactical operations.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? Lexington Police requests a total of \$581,860.00 in federal funds for Fiscal Year 2027. No matching funds are required. Future years are dependent upon availability of grant funding.

Are the funds budgeted? Budget Amendment will be forthcoming if approved for funding.
