## Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky May 26, 2022

Mr. Ellinger remarked on the number of safety officer, police officer and community correction officer probationary appointments.

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Ms. Plomin spoke about the City's recent purchase of property at 8949 Old Richmond Road and the recreational opportunities it will provide to Lexington residents.

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Ms. Sheehan held a moment of silence for victims of gun violence in the Lexington community and across the nation in light of the events that occurred at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas. She read a statement about active shooter training in school environments and commended Fayette County Public Schools Superintendent Demetrius Liggins for his leadership and communications to Lexington families. Ms. Sheehan also acknowledged the first responders across government, private and non-profit agencies who are dedicated and strive to reduce gun violence.

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Mayor Gorton shared that she was coordinating a group of mental health and domestic violence professionals to speak to the public about recent events, and that they would also be working to find creative approaches for addressing the need for mental health or domestic violence assistance within the community.

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Mr. Moloney spoke about the need for sidewalk improvements on Versailles Rd., between Red Mile Rd. and Mason Headley, particularly around Cardinal Hill Rehabilitation Hospital.

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Ms. Reynolds thanked the Council for listening to her constituents' concerns regarding Versailles Rd. and requested the project be viewed as a means of improving Lexington as a whole instead of a single district. She spoke about recent acts of gun violence in Lexington as well as in Uvalde, Texas and invited residents to attend a vigil after the Council meeting at the Lexington Calvary Church of the Nazarene to remember the victims of a recent domestic violence triple homicide. Ms. Reynolds shared that her office was also in the processing of compiling resources for mental health, domestic violence and grief counseling.

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Mr. McCurn invited volunteers to attend a Community Garden Planting at Whitney Young Park on Saturday, May 28, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. He thanked Ms. Sheehan for her words, thanked public safety officers for their service, and expressed sympathy for families who have been affected by such tragic events.
