Lexington, Kentucky January 23, 2024

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Chief Lawrence Weathers, Div. of Police, presented a disciplinary matter regarding Officer Brandon Holbrook. An allegation has been made that Officer Brandon Holbrook has committed the offense of Emergency and Pursuit Driving which constitutes misconduct under the provisions of KRS 95.450 and/or KRS 15.520 and General Order 1973-02K Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.11 Unsatisfactory Performance/ Inefficiency in that on the 8 day(s) of August 2023, he/she allegedly:

(1) Officer Holbrook engaged in a pursuit that did not comply with department policy. Officer Holbrook has previously received retraining on department expectations related to emergency and pursuit driving and traffic laws. Retaining was conducted on November 10, 2020-August 25, 2021- June 13, 2023-July 2, 2023- and August 22, 2023 related to similar deficiencies. Officer Holbrook's performance has been determined to not be in compliance with performance standards.

Officer Holbrook took full responsibility for the incident and his violations of policy.

This is Officer Holbrook's second formal complaint since his employment in March 2017.

The appropriate punishment for this conduct is Three (3) months suspension without pay and upon his return, six (6) months suspension of home fleet.

Upon motion by Ms. Reynolds, seconded by Ms. Monarrez and approved by unanimous vote, the disciplinary recommendation was approved.

Ms. Reynolds asked about reckless driving and the expectations that the Lexington Police Officers are held to when operating a Department vehicle. Chief Weathers responded about to her question by telling her about driver training.

Ms. Fogle asked if it was possible to increase mental health counseling for officers who commit driving infractions. Chief Weathers detailed the Chaplaincy program that is available to all Lexington Police Officers.

Ms. Gray expressed concern that this was Officer Holbrook's second offense of this type. Chief Weathers explained that the circumstances of the second offense were not the same as the Officer's first offense.

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Ms. Lynch invited constituents of her district to attend "Shayla in the Second", an event to discuss district and city wide matters which is to be held on January 31, 2024 from 5:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. at the Black and Williams Center. She also invited business owners to attend the Business Collective Open House from 6:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. at the Black and Williams Center on January 31, 2024.

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Ms. Fogle reminded everyone that on January 31, 2024, there would be a LexCount, an event to conduct a count of the number of individuals and households identified as being without shelter, complete surveys with those identified, facilitate access to emergency shelter, and distribute care packages. She expressed concerns about making sure that everyone would be counted. Ms. Fogle also shared that the Street Voice would meet on February 2, 2024 at 12:00 p.m. at Central Christian Church.

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Ala Hassan, District 12, spoke about the Palestinian and Israeli conflict in Gaza and asked the Council to place a resolution on the docket supporting a cease-fire. She also spoke about the atrocities she has seen occurring in Gaza and reminded the Council to think of humanity.

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Upon motion by Ms. Gray, seconded by Ms. Elliott Baxter, and approved by unanimous vote, the meeting adjourned at 5:46 p.m.
