The Kentucky Division of Emergency Management (KYEM) is requesting Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) approval for the DR-4239 LFUCG Mobile Home Parks Weather Radio Initiative Project. LFUCG proposes to purchase and distribute weather radios to 1,515 mobile homes across Fayette County. The total proposed cost for the project is \$63,110.00.

HMGP Project Eligibility

KYEM has evaluated the weather radio initiative project application and certifies that it meets all applicable Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region IV HMGP program eligibility criteria and that the award will be implemented in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, UNIFORM ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS, COST PRINCIPLES, AND AUDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR FEDERAL AWARDS.

Conformance with Commonwealth of Kentucky Hazard Mitigation Plan

The Commonwealth of Kentucky Enhanced Hazard Mitigation Plan: 2013 Version (CK-EHMP 2013) Goal II is to maximize hazard mitigation activity throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The sole Objective is to increase the number and variety of mitigation options available to local jurisdictions, generally. The CK-EHMP 2013 has as its Goal IV to improve direction and coordination/prioritization of the mitigation activity undertaken by the Commonwealth of Kentucky's local jurisdictions. As Goal IV's sole Objective (Objective IV.1), Goal IV is to identify demand for mitigation activity from local jurisdictions. The weather radio initiative project, as proposed by LFUCG, will achieve these goals and objectives.

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Kentucky State Clearinghouse Review

The Kentucky State Clearinghouse, which includes the Kentucky Heritage Council, State Historic Preservation Office, Kentucky Division of Water, and the Kentucky Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet, has reviewed this weather radio initiative application. The findings of the Clearinghouse are included with this application.

NFIP Participation

LFUCG is a participant in good standing with the NFIP.

Concurrence with Scope and Budget

LFUCG is requesting funding for the enclosed weather radio initiative mitigation project. The radios will be distributed to 1,515 mobile homes located in eight (8) mobile home parks as follows:

- 8. Spindletop/Ponderosa Lisle Road, (38.159076, -84.543056)

The scope of work and budget provide confirmation that the requirements of 44CFR §206, subpart N will be met. KYEM and its staff will monitor the project process to assure 44CFR §206, subpart N compliance. LFUCG has projected a total cost of \$63,110.00 to complete the project. The federal share is being requested at a rate of 75% (\$47,333.00). The remaining non-federal share of 25% of the project will be divided between KYEM and the LFUCG. KYEM will be providing 12% (\$7,573) of the budget through cash. LFUCG will be providing 13% (\$8,204) of the budget through general funds. KYEM concurs with LFUCG that the costs listed in the application budget are necessary, reasonable, and justified costs of weather radio initiative projects and allowable under Hazard Mitigation Grant Program guidelines.

State Review and Recommendation

KYEM has determined that the staff of LFUCG have the capabilities and resources to complete the project and that the proposed scope of work is compliant with the requirements set forth in 44CFR §206, subpart N. Detailed in the sub-grantee's application is the weather radio scope of work that meets the FEMA Region IV HMGP policy and will assist the community in substantially reducing the risk of future hardship, loss, or suffering resulting from severe weather events.

Therefore, we request that FEMA approve this project application for HMGP funding.

Fayette County, KY has eight mobile home parks throughout the county. The eight mobile home parks in the county have spaces for 1515 mobile homes. Historically, mobile homes are at a greater risk of damage during a severe weather event such as a strong wind storm or tornado as they are not as strong structurally as a regular house or apartment building. In order to ensure the safety of the residents of these parks, we plan to distribute one NOAA All-Hazards weather radio to each family so that they can have a reliable alert system to allow them time to relocate to a safe location during severe weather. This would help reduce the risk of injury and loss of life among this population.

(To the best of his knowledge and belief) the disaster relief work described on each Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Project Application for which Federal Financial assistance is requested is eligible in accordance with the criteria contained in 44 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 205, and applicable FEMA Handbooks.
- 18. The emergency or disaster relief work therein described for which Federal Assistance is requested hereunder does not or will not duplicate benefits received for the same loss from another source.
- 19. It will (1) provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements and rights-of-way necessary for accomplishment of the approved work; (2) hold and save the United States free from damages due to the approved work or Federal funding.
- 20. This assurance is given in consideration of and for the purpose of obtaining any and all Federal grants, loans, reimbursements, advances, contracts, property, discounts of other Federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Applicant by FEMA that such Federal Financial assistance will be extended in reliance on the representations and agreements made in this assurance and that the United States shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance. This assurance is binding on the applicant, its successors, transferees, and assignees, and the person or persons whose signatures appear on the reverse as authorized to sign this assurance on behalf of the applicant.
- 21. It will comply with the flood insurance purchase requirements of Section 102(a) of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973, Public Law 93-234, 87 Stat. 975, approved December 31, 1973. Section 102(a) requires, on and after March 2, 1975, the purchase of flood insurance in communities where such insurance is available as a condition for the receipt of any Federal financial assistance for construction or acquisition purposes for use in any area that has been identified by the Director, Federal Emergency Management Agency as an area having special flood hazards. The phrase "Federal financial assistance" includes any form of loan, grant, guaranty, insurance payment, rebate, subsidy, disaster assistance loan or grant, or any other form of direct or indirect Federal assistance.
- 22. It will comply with the insurance requirements of Section 314, P.L. 93-288, to obtain and maintain any other insurance as may be reasonable, adequate, and necessary to protect against further loss to any property which was replaced, restored, repaired, or constructed with this assurance.
- 23. It will defer funding of any projects involving flexible funding until FEMA makes a favorable environmental clearance, if this is required.
- 24. It will assist the Federal grantor agency in its compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, (16 U.S.C. 470), Executive Order 11593, and the Archeological and Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 469a-1 et seq.) by (a) consulting with the State Historic Preservation Officer on the conduct of investigations, as necessary, to identify properties listed in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic places that are subject to adverse effects (see 36 CFR Part 800.8) by the activity, and notifying the Federal grantor agency of the existence of any such proper-ties, and by (b) complying with all requirements established by the Federal grantor agency to avoid or mitigate adverse effects upon such properties.
- 25. It will for any repairs or construction financed herewith, comply with applicable standards of safety, decency and sanitation and in conformity with applicable codes, specifications and standards; and, will evaluate the natural hazards in areas in which the proceeds of the grant or loan are to be used and take appropriate action to mitigate such hazards, including safe land use and construction practices.
