15.	Refer schematic sheet I-13: Who will be responsible for the integration of the new Pump Monitoring System to the existing Schneider VFDs?	Refer to sheet E-014 for hardwired interlocks from the new Pump Monitoring system to the existing Dry Weather Pump Control Wiring.
16.	1.03.E calls for all manufacturer information to be submitted to the contractor within 30 days of the Notice to Proceed. While general submittal information can be provided it this time frame, structural calculations and FEA reports can require much more time. Will this be acceptable?	Yes, additional time is acceptable for structural calculations and FEA reports. However, both should be submitted in a timely manner to not impede the proposed project schedule.

Revise specification section 11310-1.08.
19.	1.08.C - Lateral Analysis Calculations – The structure will not be included in a level 1 lateral analysis.	Instead of preparing level 1 analysis for wet pit submersible pumps, perform factory and field vibration testing at 50 rpm speed intervals across the full range of operations to validate that there is no vibration in excess of HI 9.6.4 and no apparent resonance condition. Revise specification section 11310-1.08.
20.	1.08.C – Structural analysis – For an HI 9.6.8 level 1 analysis, the structure is not included and is assumed to be rigid. Note, due these being wet pit submersibles, the assumptions used in an HI level 1 analysis may not be accurate as the pump is not fixed at the bottom (HI assumes the pump acts like a beam fixed at one end for a level 1 structural analysis). Please confirm that not including the structure in the analysis is acceptable.	Instead of preparing level 1 analysis for wet pit submersible pumps, perform factory and field vibration testing at 50 rpm speed intervals across the full range of operations to validate that there is no vibration in excess of HI 9.6.4 and no apparent resonance condition. 21.	1.08.C Motor Reed Frequency – As these are submersible pumps and the motors are internal to the pump, the motor RCF and post manufactured pre shipment verification are not included or required.	Instead of preparing level 1 analysis for wet pit submersible pumps, perform factory and field vibration testing at 50 rpm speed intervals across the full range of operations to validate that there is no vibration in excess of HI 9.6.4 and no apparent resonance condition. Revise specification section 11310-1.08.





22.	1.08.D.1 – As the analysis will be done by an engineer from our factory, the report will be signed by an engineer in the country of manufacturer. Note that local regulations (in the country of manufacture) dictate legal requirements for "engineering" signatures similar to what a Professional Engineer in the US has. Please confirm that this is acceptable.	Instead of preparing level 1 analysis for wet pit submersible pumps, perform factory and field vibration testing at 50 rpm speed intervals across the full range of operations to validate that there is no vibration in excess of HI 9.6.4 and no apparent resonance condition. Revise specification section 11310-1.08.
23.	2.01.G.2 – L-10 life based on ½ BEP to 1.5tims BEP conflicts with the bearing life requirement across the entire curve specified in section 2.02.A	Specification section 11310-2.02A is correct. L-10 Bearing life shall be a minimum of 100,000 hours at all points along the usable portions of the pump curve at maximum pump speed.
24.	2.01.L Three options are listed but option 2 says for all pumps over 100hp vibration sensors should be included. Is a vibration sensor required for all three monitoring options?	Only if electing to comply with option 2 for protection of the pumps. Only 1 of the 3 options provided in section 2.01.L is required for compliance with the specifications.
25.	2.02 Schedule calls for three pumps and the drawing shows 4 pumps. Please confirm if the job is for 3 or 4 pumps.	The project includes the replacement of four (4) dry weather pumps.
26.	Specification Section/Page 01520-2 requires contractor to put station back into operation and to stop by pass pumping at the end of each work day Can temp. by pass pumping continue through the night until all work is completed. Could be several weeks at a time.	See clarification 'A' below. The station has the ability to isolate wet wells such that one wet well could be closed for construction activities while the other stays active. Each wet well contains two pumps. It is anticipated that with ability long term bypass will not be necessary, but it is the Contractor's responsibility to determine their best and most efficient method of installation.





27.	What is the backfill material of the existing pump station? What was called for and installed for backfill between new concrete pump station wet well structure and earth/rock existing ground?	The actual backfill material used around the existing pump station and the manner in which it was installed exactly are unknown, as there are no as-built records or field inspection reports confirming the materials or methods used during original construction. However, notes from the original construction plans indicate that compacted structural fill was intended, with the following specification: "Compaction of backfill within 2 feet of foundation walls shall be accomplished with hand equipment. Where fill is required on both sides of foundation wall, bring the fill up each side simultaneously and uniformly." This suggests that granular backfill placed in controlled lifts was expected, but in the absence of documentation, the actual field conditions and compliance with these requirements cannot be confirmed.
28.	It the prebid meeting sign in sheet in Addendum 2 correct? The title page says Floyds Fork with the bid date of December, 2024. Thank you.	This is the correct sign in sheet from the mandatory EHPS – Phase 2 prebid meeting although the title references the incorrect project.
29.	It appears the 30" Wall Pipes with face plate flanges at the wall are to be a custom welded fabrication with no link seal at the cored openings as may be found in a typical thru-wall installation (reference Detail A on M-008). It is difficult to properly weld ductile iron pipe in this manner; therefore, please advise/confirm if the wall piping and the welded plate is to be ductile iron, or if stainless steel or painted carbon piping will be acceptable in this application. The installation will require at least one of the flanges to be field welded in order to limit the size of the opening as shown.	The 30-inch 'wall pipe' section shall be carbon steel with a minimum thickness of 0.34 inches and face plates shall have a minimum thickness of 0.50 inches. The interior of the wall piece shall be coated with Protecto 401 or approved equal and touched up after welded in place. The plain end of the steel pipe shall be sized to join either the MJ plug valve or push on DIP as shown on Drawing M-007. See revised Detail A from Drawing M-008 included in this addendum.





30.	Will all the pressure, level and flow transmitters be re-used, or is there a requirement for supply of new transmitters?	The design provides for re-use of pressure, level and flow transmitters shown on existing and revised drawings I-11 through I-15. Level range re-calibration is anticipated. Refer to level range notes on sheet I-23.
31.	Please provide the last soil borings or any other geotechnical information that may be available.	Two previous geotechnical reports from the preliminary design and phase 1 project are included in this addendum. These geotechnical reports are provided for informational purposes only. Since the completion of these reports, construction activities have taken place on the site, which may have altered the original subsurface conditions. As such, the findings and recommendations contained herein may no longer accurately reflect current site conditions and should not be solely relied upon for design or construction decisions without further evaluation. Contractors shall use these for informational purposes only.
32.	What material is the existing 20" pipe (sheet note 7 on sheets C-001 & C-002)?	Ductile Iron Pipe



Section 3.03.E.1 Revise paragraph to be the following: After installation and as soon as conditions permit full speed operation, and in the presence of the Engineer, have the vibration tests performed at 50 rpm speed intervals across the full range of operations in accordance with ANSI/HI 9.6.4 on each unit to (a) prove compliance with specified limitations, and (b) prove that there are no field installed resonant conditions due to misalignment, the foundation, or the connecting piping and its supports, when operating at any speed within the specified operating range.
- B. Specification Section 17410 Basic Control Instrumentaiton

4. CLARIFICATIONS

- A. During the construction period, the contractor is required to maintain a minimum of 2 dry weather pumps in operation at all times. The contractor shall also maintain wet weather pump station operation as much as practicable. The maximum acceptable down time for the wet weather pump station for the installation of the connector pipe shall be 5 days (one working week Monday to Friday). In addition this work should occur during a time of extended dry weather so that the wet weather pumps are unlikely to be needed during this period.
- B. Existing duty/dry weather pumps.
 - a. There are currently two operational dry weather pumps at the EH Pump Station. Two additional pumps have been ordered and are expected to be delivered around the time the project Notice to Proceed is issued. The Contractor may relocate the two existing pumps to any of the four available pump guiderails and bases, as needed, to facilitate the isolation of each dry weather wet well during construction of the project.




