RE: *Residential Parking Permit District – 1200 Block of Scoville Road*

On or around November 6, 2017, the residents of the 1200 block of Scoville Road requested the establishment of a Residential Permit Parking District for the following times: 8 a.m. through 7 p.m., Monday through Friday along their respective block.

In order for a street or part of a street to be qualified for the RPP District designation, Section III-(b) items (1) and (2) of the Residential Parking Permit Program must be met. Section III-(b) items (1) and (2) state:

- (1) The total number of curbside parking spaces occupied by vehicles equals or exceeds seventy-five percent (75%) of the number of curbside parking spaces on the public streets, roads and highways of the proposed residential parking permit area; and
- (2) The total number of curbside parking spaces occupied by vehicles whose operators do not reside within the proposed residential parking permit area equals or exceeds twenty-five percent (25%) of the total number of curbside parking spaces occupied by vehicles.

Currently the 1200 block of Scoville Road has a NO PARKING restriction from 8am through 7pm, Monday through Friday, August 15th through May 15th. This policy was requested by the residents by petition containing 72% of the residents' signatures and was put into place more than 15 years ago. The residents now view the NO PARKING restriction as an inconvenience to their quality of life and have now requested by way of a petition (attached) consisting of over 65% participation, that the NO PARKING restriction be replaced with a Residential Parking Permit Program.

Based upon the wishes of the residents as well as previous studies that took place more than 15 years ago by Traffic Engineering, the Lexington & Fayette County Parking Authority therefore recommends that this section of roadway be designated as a Residential Permit Parking District.
