Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky August 17, 2023

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on August 17, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Sheehan, Worley, Wu, F. Brown, J. Brown, Ellinger, Elliott Baxter, Fogle, Gray, LeGris, Lynch, Monarrez, Plomin, Reynolds, and Sevigny.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 081-2023 through 087-2023, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 392-2023 through 432-2023, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Pastor Carmen Russell of Lexington Calvary Church of Nazarene.

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Upon motion by Mr. Ellinger, seconded by Ms. Fogle, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the Minutes of the June 29, July 11, and July 13, 2023 Council Meetings were approved.

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Mayor Gorton asked Ashley C. Smith, Co-Founder and CEO of Black Soil Kentucky to join her at the podium and read a Proclamation declaring August 25, 2023 as Black Soil Day in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton spoke of the mission and efforts of Black Soil Kentucky.

Ms. Smith thanked the Mayor and Council. She shared that on August 25, 2023 Black Soil will be working with six non-profit organizations and local agencies; Casa de la Cultura, Community Action Council, AVOL Ky, Sisters Working against Gun Violence (SWAG), the Georgetown Street Neighborhood Association, and the Lyric Theatre and Cultural Arts Center. She thanked the rest of her team at Black Soil for their hard work.

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Mayor Gorton asked Richard Young, Founder and Executive Director of CivicLex to join her at the podium, along with Ms. Reynolds, and read a Proclamation declaring August 17, 2023 as CivicLex Day in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton spoke of the mission and purpose of CivicLex and the accolades the organization had received.

Mr. Young talked the origins of CivicLex and their mission. He thanked LFUCG for their cooperation in making government more accessible to citizens.

Ms. Reynolds expressed excitement over the recognition of CivicLex and their contribution to the Lexington Community

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Chief Lawrence Weathers, Div. of Police, presented a disciplinary matter regarding Officer Daniel Hempel. An allegation has been made that Officer Hempel has committed the offense of Violating any Rules of the Department which constitutes misconduct under the provisions of KRS 95.450 and/or KRS 15.520 and General Order 1973-02K – Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.35 in that on the 18 day of May, 2023 he allegedly:

(1) On March 2, 2022, Officer Daniel Hempel submitted a Tattoo and Body Alteration request for a tattoo on his forearm. Prior to receiving approval from the Chief's Office approving such tattoo, Officer Hempel had the tattoo completed. On March 17, 2022, Chief Weathers denied the request and said notice was provided to Officer Hempel. On May 18, 2023, Officer Hempel's supervisor became aware of the unapproved tattoo. Officer Hempel has since received approval for and completed a cover up tattoo to be in compliance with department policy.

The appropriate punishment for this conduct is written reprimand.

Upon motion by Mr. Worley, seconded by Ms. Fogle and approved by unanimous vote, the disciplinary recommendation was approved.

Chief Weathers elaborated on the Lexington Police Department's policy on tattoos.

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Mr. Worley thanked Chief Weathers for his transparency on the issue of police officer tattoos. He welcomed the Boy Scout in attendance.

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Ms. Fogle also thanked Chief Weathers for his transparency. She also introduced the new Executive Director of the Lyric Theatre & Cultural Arts Center, Christian Adair.

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Mr. J. Brown also welcomed the Christian Adair as the new Executive Director of the Lyric Theatre and Cultural Arts Center. He also reminded the community about Wee Ball and Tee Ball sign ups at Douglas Park on August 23 and 24, 2023 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. He also spoke about the East End Family Reunion that would be happening the upcoming weekend with a dance on August 18, a family barbeque on the August 19 and a gospel music festival on August 20. He thanked the Parks and Recreation and

public safety partners who would be there during the events. Lastly, he announced the East End Art and Music Festival being held on August 19, 2023 at the Artist's Village on Goodloe St.

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Vice Mayor Wu shared some of the community events that he had been able to participate in while the Council was on break.

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Ms. Reynolds spoke about some of the community events she had attended while the Council was on break including the opening of the Manchester Hotel and the ground-breaking ceremony for Town Branch Park. She also mentioned the Great Gardenside Back to School Event where Mayor Gorton issued a proclamation honoring the Farmer's Market in Gardenside Plaza. She also spoke about the dedication of the new WayPoint Center, Centro de San Juan Diego.

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At 6:58 p.m., Mr. F. Brown departed the meeting.

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Ms. Lynch talked about back to school rallies including one that she had attended at Douglas Park where she participated in a fitness class with students. She also shared that she had been able to take a tour of Fire Station 24 and attend the "Yappy" Hour at the Masterson Station Dog Park. She also encouraged everyone to participate in Bystander Awareness Month by wearing green and completing a Green Dot Bystander Training.

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Mr. Sevigny talked the upcoming performance of Honey Child the upcoming Friday at Moondance Theatre at 7:00-9:00 p.m.

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Mr. Ellinger asked Comm. Ken Armstrong, Dept. of Public Safety, to comment on the retention and recruitment of Public Safety Officers. He noted the influx of Corrections Officers that appeared on the Mayor's Report (FYI). Comm. Armstrong was excited to share that the Div. of Corrections had seen an uptick in hiring and that the Div. of Police would have a graduating class of Police Officers later this year.
