- 1. Bonding is required for this project.
 - a. For bid bond requirements see Part 1 ADVERTISEMENTS FOR BIDS, Section 7 BID SECURITY and Part 2 INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS, Section 5 BID SECURITY of the specifications.
 - b. For performance and payment bond requirements see Part 2 INFORMATION, Section 10 SECURITY FOR FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE of the specifications.
 - c. A certified cashier's check can be accepted for the required bonds.

Please be advised of the following clarifications to the above referenced Bid:

SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. In Part 1 ADVERTISEMENT FOR BID, Section 7 TIME OF COMPLETION AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES, remove the value \$200.00 and replace with \$500.00.
- 2. In Part 3 FORM OF PROPOSAL, Section 5 STATEMENT OF BIDDER'S QUALIFICATIONS #8, add the clarification "in the past five years" after the word Bidders.
- All work shall be performed in Right-of-Way. The Contractor shall not go onto private property.
- 4. Permits
 - a. The Contractor is required to obtain applicable permits per Part 4 GENERAL CONDITIONS, Section 5.10 Permits including but not limited to:
 - i. The Contractor will be required to obtain the Land Disturbance Permit through the Division of Engineering.
 - ii. The Contractor will be required to obtain a Lane Closure Permit for any lane closures required to perform the work through the LFUCG Division of Traffic Engineering.
- In the Technical Specifications Section 329300 Plants, 1.02 QUALITY ASSURANCE, add the following language:
 - "Minimum Experience: Contractor shall have performed 3 projects of similar scope within the past five years, however, the LFUCG reserves the right to award contract based on the best interest of the government."
- Add the following language to Section 329300 Plants 3.04 PREPARATION:
 "H. Work shall be staged to minimize the amount of bare soil exposed at any given time.

- I. All bare soil within 10 feet of a sidewalk, roadway, or storm drain shall be fully covered each night with straw, mulch, wood chips, or temporary erosion control or coir fiber blanket (can be reused).
- J. Roads and sidewalks shall be kept clear of dirt and debris. Any loose dirt or debris shall be swept up each evening, and before a rain event.
- K. The use of augers is prohibited."
- 7. Add the following language to Section 329300 Plants 3.04 INSTALLATION A: "All trees shall be installed at or slightly above grade with the trunk flare visible."
- 8. Add the following language to Section 329300 Plants 3.04 INSTALLATION E: "Mulch shall not be placed against the trunk and mulch volcanoes are prohibited."
- 9. Pre-purchased Plant Material
 - a. The City has pre-purchased some plant material for use on this project (see Addendum #1)
 - b. Add the following language to Section 329300 Plants 1.04 DELIVERY, STORAGE, AND HANDLING:

"The Contractor shall be responsible for picking up all plant material that has been prepurchased by the City at the nursery at 1313 Old Frankfort Pike. The Contractor shall notify the City at least 2 business days in advance to schedule the pick-up. The City representative shall be present during the pick-up of the pre-purchased material. At pick-up, a complete and thorough examination of the pre-purchased plant material will be completed by the Contractor and the City representative. After this examination and notation of existing conditions, the pre-purchased plant material will become the Contractor's responsibility through project completion and the extended maintenance period. Should any damage occur to the pre-purchased plant material following the examination period and prior to the completion of the extended maintenance period, the contractor shall held be responsible pursuant to other applicable sections of this Specification. Following the extended maintenance period, the responsibility for all pre-purchased material will be returned to the City and the Contractor will not be required to provide any warranty for the pre-purchased material."

1. Bid opening has been extended to June 24, 2015, 2:00 pm.

SPECIFICATIONS

- The Contractor shall include the Maintenance of Traffic subcontractor information, per Part 3
 FORM OF PROPOSAL, section 6 LIST OF PROPOSED SUBCONTRACTORS AND PLANT
 MATERIAL SUPPLIERS.
 - a. Per Kentucky Transportation Cabinet regulations the Maintenance of Traffic installation is required to be inspected by a certified Work Zone Traffic Control Supervisor.
 - b. The Contractor shall provide the Certified Work Zone Traffic Control Supervisor. The Certified Work Zone Traffic Control Supervisor shall be required to insure all Maintenance of Traffic Installations meet KTC regulations and to provide proof of compliance.
- 2. Part 4 GENERAL CONDITIONS, Section 5.17 Erosion and Sediment Control: The intent of this section and requirements is to control erosion and sediment of areas disturbed as a result of creating planting beds or installation of planting materials. The Contractor shall comply with requirements of the LFUCG Stormwater Manual, latest edition- Erosion and Sediment Control Chapter. This may include means and methods of preventing erosion such as silt fence, checks, etc and will include permitting requirements outlined in the Stormwater Manual. Reference is also made to all Plan and Addendum notes with regards to control of silt, mud, debris, etc and onto adjacent properties, streets, and roads. Contractor may also reference Article 10, Division 5 Reduction of Soil Erosion of the LFUCG Code of Ordinances for additional information.
- In Technical Specifications Section 329300 Plants, 2.04 ACCESSORIES:
 Substitutions for planting accessories including peat moss will be considered during the submittal process of the contract. The Contractor will be required to provide proof that

- c. Substantial Completion is estimated to be September 25th.
- d. The maintenance period will extend to November 15, 2015 per Specification Section 329300 3.05 A of the Technical Specifications.
- e. The contractor shall provide a detailed project schedule in accordance with Part 4 GENERAL CONDITIONS, Section 2.6 Submittal of Schedules.

3. Plant Substitutions

a. It is strongly suggested that desired plant substitution requests be made by June 9th as there is not a guarantee that substitutions will be accepted during the project.

4. Permits

- a. The Contractor is required to obtain applicable permits per Part 4 GENERAL CONDITIONS, Section 5.10 Permits.
 - i. The City has submitted for the Transportation Cabinet Encroachment Permit and will supply that permit to the Contractor.
 - ii. All permits must be on site at all times during work.

5. Erosion Control

 a. The Contractor is required to provide erosion and sediment control as described in Part 4 GENERAL CONDITIONS, Section 5.17 Erosion and Sediment Control.

6. Soil amendments

- a. The City has performed soils testing for the site.
 - i. The test results indicate adequate phosphorous and potassium.
 - ii. In the Technical Specifications, Section 329300 Plants, 2.03 Topsoil, remove the language "with acidity range of between pH 6.0-6.8".
 - iii. In the Technical Specifications, Section 329300 Plants, 2.04 Accessories, remove the language "containing 5% nitrogen, 10% phosphoric acid, and 5% potash" and replace with "containing 34% nitrogen, 0% phosphoric acid, and 0% potash"
 - iv. The complete soils test results will be provided to the awarded contractor.

7. Weed Control Barrier

- a. Weed control barrier will not be used on this project. Delete all references to weed control barrier within Section 329300 Plants in the Technical Specifications.
- b. Pre-emergent herbicide will be used on this project as detailed in Section 329300 Plants in the Technical Specifications.

8. Public Art coordination

a. The LexArts group is coordinating a public art installation piece that may be located within the project site. Determination of exact site location and size will not be concluded until after this project has been awarded. Contractors should be aware that there may be coordination required between the Contractor, City, LexArts, and the selected public artist at some point during this project.

9. Pre-purchased Plant Material

- a. The City has pre-purchased some plant material for use on this project. Addendum #2 will be issued describing the method for delivery/ pick-up, warranty, Contractor care of and responsibility for pre-purchased material.
- b. The City has pre-purchased all of the trees required for this project.

10. Coordination with Arborist

- a. Add the following language to Section 329300 Plants 1.02 QUALITY ASSURANCE: "E. Coordination with City arborist:
 - All tree plantings shall be performed under the direct supervision of the City arborist. No tree plantings shall be accepted if they occur without the presence of the City arborist.
 - 2. The Contractor shall notify the City arborist at least 2 business days in advance of the tree planting operations, to insure the arborist will be present during planting.

- 1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.

- (1) If any contractor is found by the department to have engaged in an unlawful practice under this chapter during the course of performing under a contract or subcontract covered under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the department shall so certify to the contracting agency and such certification shall be binding upon the contracting agency unless it is reversed in the course of judicial review.
- (2) If the contractor is found to have committed an unlawful practice under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the contracting agency may cancel or terminate the contract, conditioned upon a program for future compliance approved by the contracting agency and the department. Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job.
