



	Questions	Answers
1.	Prebid meeting Q1 - What is the required pumping rate for the temporary 24-inch bypass line?	The minimum required bypass pumping rate anticipates a 24-inch diameter temporary force main with line stop valves that can be removed upon completion to maintain continuous wastewater flow.
2.	Prebid meeting Q2 - Are there any work hour restrictions?	Normal work hours (40-hours /week), are between the hours from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday. The Contractor must notify Owner at least 3-days in advance if Contractor intends to work beyond normal work hours. The Owner reserves the right of refusal on acceptance of Contractor's request for modified work hours, and will waive requirements for contractor reimbursement for costs incurred, if the Contractor's request is approved.
3.	I don't see the distance between the odor control manhole and the quazite box. What's the distance between the two so we can figure how much 2" conduit to quote?	Assume 3-feet of separation between the quazite box and manhole structure for conduits.
4.	What is the cement concrete paving unit for. I don't see anywhere that we need to go thru concrete paving? Is this the 6" inch concrete cap under the asphalt trench patch?	Bid Item No. 8 is intended for force main line trench repairs in concrete pavement areas. See attached Exhibit 1 showing concrete pavement limits. The contractor shall consider the existing jointing pattern to square off the required replacement section(s). The replacement panel shall match the existing concrete pavement section.





5.	Will Railroad Insurance be needed?	No, railroad insurance is not required since all work will be confined within the existing LFUCG property boundary limits.
6.	Is unit #7 (Bituminous Concrete Paving) the base asphalt for trench? If not, what is this for?	Bid Item No. 7 is intended for force main construction trench repairs in asphalt pavement areas.
7.	Is unit#9 (Asphalt Pavement Patch) the surface asphalt for the entire trench? If not, what's this for?	Bid Item No. 9 is intended for repairs to existing asphalt pavement areas that are damaged by the contractor during construction.
8.	Are there any special coatings needed for the Odor Control Manhole?	No special coatings are required.



DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS AND OUTREACH PLANS

As affirmed in Resolution Number 272-2024, the Urban County Council has adopted an annual aspirational goal of utilizing at least seventeen percent (17%) of public funds spend from certain discretionary agreements with certified Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs) and certified Woman Business Enterprises (WBEs); utilizing at least three percent (3%) of public funds from certain discretionary agreements with Certified Veteran-Owned Small Business and Certified Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (VOSBs); and utilizing Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) where applicable. Bidders should make every effort to achieve these goals.

Therefore, as an element of the responsiveness of the bid, all Bidders are required to submit documentation of their good faith and outreach efforts to ensure all businesses, including small and disadvantaged businesses such as minority-, woman-, and veteran-owned businesses, have an equal opportunity to compete for and participate in the performance of any subcontracts resulting from this procurement. 6. Contacted organizations that work with small, DBE, MBE, WBE, and VOSB companies for assistance in finding certified DBEs, MBEs, WBEs, VOSB and/or SDVOSBs to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses must be a part of the bidder's outreach efforts documentation.
7. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email, or facsimile, to qualified, certified small businesses, DBEs, MBEs, WBEs, VOSBs and/or SDVOSBs soliciting their participation in the contract not less than seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
8. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting small businesses, DBEs, MBEs, WBEs, VOSBs and/or SDVOSBs via tailored communications to determine their level of interest.

9. Provided the interested small businesses, DBEs, MBEs, WBEs, VOSBs and/or SDVOSBs with adequate and timely information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract.
10. Selected portions of the work to be performed by small businesses, DBEs, MBEs, WBEs, VOSBs and/or SDVOSBs in order to increase the likelihood of subcontracting participation. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate small, DBE, MBE, WBE, VOSB and/or SDVOSB participation, even when the prime contractor may otherwise perform these work items with its own workforce.
11. Negotiated in good faith with interested small businesses, DBEs, MBEs, WBEs, VOSBs and/or SDVOSBs, not rejecting them as unqualified without sound reasons based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities. ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY

MAC Construction & Excavating, Inc. ("Company") strives to provide you with a safe workplace. To that end, we are committed to providing a workplace free from drug and alcohol abuse and misuse.

- II. DEFINITIONS: For purposes of this alcohol and drug policy, the following words and phrases are defined as follows.

- B. Illegal drugs. The term "illegal drug" means any controlled substance other than one purchased and used pursuant to a prescription written by the employee's medical doctor or treating physician.

NOTE: Although some states and local jurisdictions have "legalized" marijuana, it is still illegal under federal law. The Company strictly prohibits possessing, using, and being under the influence of marijuana and other cannabinoids (including "medical" marijuana) on Company and customer premises and during work.

- C. Company and customer premises. The terms "Company and customer premises" include work sites, vehicles, and buildings, and other property owned, rented, used, or serviced by the Company or by any customer of the Company; employee-owned or employee-rented vehicles when on the property of the Company or any customer of the Company; and any other locations where the employee represents the Company in any capacity.
- D. Company time. For purposes of this alcohol and drug policy, the term "Company time" includes all working hours as well as meal periods, break periods, and "on-call" periods, regardless of where.
- E. Pre-Hire or Pre-Hire Employee. These terms mean a person to whom a conditional offer of employment has been extended, but whose hiring is contingent upon satisfactory results of a drug and/or alcohol test.
- F. Positive and Negative Tests. Except as otherwise allowed or required by applicable law, or announced by the Company, initial and confirmatory test results will be deemed "positive" or "negative" based on the concentrations set forth in DOT regulation 49 CFR § 40.87. We may apply other, more stringent, testing procedures, standards, and cut-off levels in circumstances not covered or governed by DOT regulations or other state, local or federal requirements (e.g., we may test for additional drugs, metabolites, and substances per customer request.)

III. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES:

- A. The possession, use, sale, transfer, purchase, and distribution of illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia, and alcohol on Company or customer premises, or while performing Company work or representing the Company (regardless of when or where), is strictly prohibited. Any illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia found will be turned over to a law enforcement agency and may result in criminal prosecution.
- B. The unauthorized possession, use, sale, and distribution of alcoholic beverages on Company time or on Company or customer premises is strictly prohibited.
- C. Being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs while on duty (regardless of where) is strictly prohibited. Reporting to work under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs also is strictly prohibited. For purposes of this policy, "under the influence" means the employee's ability to perform his or her job safely, effectively, efficiently, and professionally is or appears (in the Company's sole discretion) to be impaired or otherwise adversely affected by the presence of drugs or alcohol in the employee's body. The only exception will be for lawful

medications (other than marijuana and other cannabinoids) prescribed for the employee by the employee's physician and used as prescribed.

- D. An employee whose use of prescribed or over-the-counter medication reasonably may pose a direct threat to the employee or others must notify the Human Resources Department of any such risk and any work restrictions associated with such use. Medical verification of the necessity and safety of the use of prescribed or over-the-counter medication may be required.
- E. Off-duty illegal drug use is prohibited. Such use could adversely affect an employee's job performance or could jeopardize the safety of the employee or others. Off-duty illegal drug use could also jeopardize customers' or the public's confidence in the Company and its employees. Some jurisdictions have declared marijuana and other cannabinoids "lawful products," and prohibit adverse employment action based on a covered employees' off-duty use of those products. Even in those jurisdictions, however, employees who are under the influence of such products are not protected. Additionally, even those jurisdictions acknowledge that DOT regulations, federal contract requirements, and other federal laws prevail over state and local laws. In the event the Company and its employees become subject to such a state or local law, employees are cautioned to recognize the potential consequences of using cannabinoids off-duty.

Unless otherwise instructed, employees are not prohibited from responsibly consuming limited quantities of legal alcoholic beverages at business meetings, Company social outings, and Company sponsored events when authorized by the Company.

IV. TESTING FOR THE PRESENCE OF ILLEGAL DRUGS & ALCOHOL:

The Company reserves the right to test for the presence and/or influence of illegal drugs and/or alcohol under the following circumstances and any other circumstances required or permitted by law or contract:

- A. Post-Offer, Pre-Hire Testing: The Company may test persons who have been conditionally offered employment "Pre-Hires," prior to them being hired as employees, for the presence of illegal drugs and/or alcohol. Any Pre-Hire who tests positive for illegal drugs or alcohol will not be hired.

These testing provisions also apply to any former employee who was separated from active employment more than six (6) months prior to being conditionally offered re-employment.

- B. Random Testing: All Company employees shall be subject to at least annual random testing for the presence of illegal drugs and alcohol, consistent with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations 49 CFR Part 40 Procedures for Transportation Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing. Company shall, at a minimum, conduct a 5-drug panel program that tests for the following drugs: amphetamines, cocaine, opiates (2,000 ng/ml), PCP and THC. Company currently conducts, and reserves for itself the discretion to conduct, a more extensive 12 drug panel program. Random selection is done by a scientific method of a computer-based random number generator. At least one-twelfth

(1/12) of twenty five percent (25%) of the Company's total workforce shall be selected randomly each month for testing.

- C. Suspected Influence/Reasonable Suspicion: The Company may require an employee to submit to drug and/or alcohol testing when the Company reasonably suspects the employee has used or is under the influence of illegal drugs or alcohol. Factors that may cause reasonable suspicion include, but are not limited to, a decline in the employee's work performance or attendance, unusual behavior or appearance, the odor of alcohol or drugs, slurred speech, or a report of the employee using drugs or alcohol. Except as may otherwise be required by applicable law, the Company is not required to obtain a drug or alcohol test to support its good faith belief that an employee is under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- D. Post-Incident Testing: Employees who are involved in an incident that harmed or could have harmed employees or others may be required to submit to drug and/or alcohol testing. This applies to incidents which occur on Company premises, a Company work site, or anywhere else while engaged in Company business. Employees may be tested to determine the root cause of such an incident if there is a reasonable possibility drugs or alcohol caused or contributed to the incident or to an injury or illness resulting from the incident. When such testing is conducted, all employees whose conduct could have contributed to the incident will be tested; not just employees who reported injuries or illnesses.
- E. Job Agreement Personnel: "Job agreement individuals" include "temporary" workers, "variable workforce" workers, and other persons not directly employed by the Company. Persons employed through any job agreement will not be subject to testing as "post-offer, pre-employment" testing if they are already subject to drug testing by their governing agency. Such individuals, however, shall be subject to the random testing, suspected influence/reasonable suspicion testing, post-incident testing, and other requirements contained herein as applicable and will be required to comply in full with the terms and conditions of any drug, alcohol, or substance abuse policy applicable to the job agreement.
- F. Project Contract Agreement: The Company will, at a minimum, test when and as required or permitted and, at a minimum, follow all other requirements, including discipline by a project contract agreement, local ordinance or law applicable to an owner/customer and is hereby adopted and incorporated herein. This includes testing pursuant to government contracts.

Employees must provide urine, blood, breath, hair, saliva, and/or any other type of specimen permitted by law for drug and/or alcohol testing, when and as the Company requests.

V. CONSEQUENCES:

- A. Any violation of this alcohol and drug policy (whether specifically mentioned below or not) is ground for discipline, termination of employment or other action required or allowed by law or deemed appropriate by the Company.

- B. Failure to Cooperate: Anyone who fails or refuses to submit to and fully cooperate with a drug and/or alcohol test when requested may be disciplined or terminated (or, in the case of Pre-Hires, the offer of employment may be withdrawn). Violations include, but are not limited to, attempting to adulterate or tamper with a specimen, failure to provide a specimen, or otherwise interfering with testing, and refusing to authorize disclosure of test results and related information to the Company.
- C. FIRST OFFENSE - Positive Test: Any Pre-Hire who tests positive for illegal drugs will not be hired. Any employee who is found to be under the influence of alcohol or an illegal drug, or who tests positive for an illegal drug or alcohol, shall be subject to the following procedures:
1. An Employee's first positive test will result in a 30-day period of ineligibility for work or termination. The suspension/termination decision will consider the circumstances of the incident and of the employee's employment record.
 2. If the employee is not terminated, the employee shall, at a minimum, be ineligible to work for a minimum of 30 days. During this period of time, employee shall comply with a mandatory referral, enrollment, and participation in a rehabilitation program recommended or approved by the employee's personal physician. Any employee required to participate in a rehabilitation program must sign a written agreement concerning the terms and conditions of his/her participation in the rehabilitation program and his/her return to work. Refusal to participate in a mandatory rehabilitation program will result in immediate termination.

Employees who participate in a rehabilitation program will be fully responsible for all costs and expenses associated with the program. The Company's group health insurance may cover some of these costs and expenses for employees who are enrolled in the group health insurance program. Please consult the Human Resources Department for further information concerning the terms and conditions of the Company's group health insurance plan.
 3. Employees will not be compensated during the time they are absent from work due to disciplinary action or to participate in rehabilitation but may use any vacation days available to them during rehabilitation.
 4. Employees who are not terminated will lose any safety incentives for the performance year in which the positive test occurred.

D. Return to Work: An employee who has, in lieu of termination, been disciplined through a period of ineligibility for work will be eligible to return to work only after signing a "Last Chance Agreement." The Company will set the terms and conditions of such agreements, which shall, include at a minimum:

1. Acknowledging the violation.
2. Producing written documentation showing enrollment and participation in a rehabilitation program.
3. Providing a doctor's release confirming the employee is physically and mentally ready to return to work and can perform his or her essential job functions with or without reasonable accommodation.
4. Passing a drug and/or alcohol test as a condition of returning to work.
5. Agreeing to submit to periodic and unannounced follow-up testing for a period of one (1) year after returning to work.
6. Agreeing that, any positive test result is legitimate ground for immediate termination of employment.

E. Second Offenses: A second offense will result in immediate termination of employment. An employee dismissed for violation of the Alcohol and Drug policy is not eligible for re-hire.

VI. ALCOHOL:

- A. Employees who use alcohol are required to meet the same standards of performance and conduct that are required of other employees. Unsatisfactory behavior, such as absenteeism, tardiness, poor job performance, and accidents related to alcohol use will neither be tolerated nor accommodated.
- B. Employees are subject to testing to determine whether they are under the influence of alcohol as explained in Section V, above.
- C. The consequences of violating the Company's alcohol use policy are explained in Section V, above.

VII. TREATMENT PROGRAM:

- A. The Company recognizes that alcohol and drug problems are treatable in many cases. Confidential assessment, counseling, treatment and specialized help are available through Seven Counties Services, Inc. and similar programs.
- B. Voluntary participation in such programs—before you violate this policy or are requested to submit to drug/alcohol testing—will not necessarily jeopardize employment or future advancement, but it also will not exempt employees from disciplinary actions for substandard job performance, rules infractions, or violations of the policies set out herein. Except as may otherwise be required by law, employees who participate in rehabilitation or treatment programs are not entitled to job protection during or following participation.
- C. The Company encourages employees who think they may have a drug or alcohol problem or are concerned about the drug or alcohol abuse of a family member to seek help voluntarily as soon as possible by contacting an appropriate care provider or social service agency.

VIII. TEST RESULTS, RECORDKEEPING, AND CONFIDENTIALITY:

- A. Notification of test results: Any employee is entitled to be notified of the results of a test administered to him or her under this policy.
- B. Recordkeeping: All records related to the administration and results testing, including the test results of any individual whose test is positive, will be maintained for a minimum of five (5) years, except that individual negative test results will be maintained for a minimum of twelve (12) months. Any individual's test results will be maintained by the medical doctor used by the Company to conduct the testing.
- C. Content of records: The Company will maintain records containing the following information relating to testing: (1) the fact that the employee submitted to a drug and/or alcohol test, (2) the date of such test, (3) the location of such test, (4) the identity of the person or entity performing the test, and (5) whether the testing finding was "positive" or "negative." This information will be maintained in confidential files separate and apart from the employee's other employment records.
- D. Access to individual test results or test findings: No person may obtain the individual test results retained by the medical doctor who administers a drug test, and no such doctor may release the individual test results of any employee to any person, without first obtaining written authorization from the tested employee. However, nothing in this paragraph will prohibit a medical doctor from releasing to the Company any of the information that the Company is permitted to retain pursuant to the preceding paragraph.
- E. Confidentiality: Except as otherwise required or permitted by applicable law, no person may obtain from the Company any information relating to an employee's test results without first obtaining written authorization from the tested employee.
