4. The work is entitled the "Elizabeth Street & Forest Park Site Improvements". The project is bounded by the limits of construction as shown in the construction documents. Specifics consist of the construction and/or furnishing of items listed in the Bid Schedule for the proposed stormwater improvements Elizabeth Street & Forest Park located in Lexington, Ky.

Lines of Communication

1. Owner and General Contractor communications will be issued through the Owner (LFUCG DWQ). All communications are to be directed to Brian Marcum in writing during the Bidding and Contract Award Phase. During construction all Owner and General Contractor communications are to be directed to Rick Day.
2. All verbal instructions must be followed by written documentation. Verbal instructions are not binding by the contract.

Schedule

1. Last day for questions shall be January 17th at Noon.
2. Bid Opening: January 23, 2020 @ 2:00 pm @ LFUCG's Division of Purchasing (200 East Main Street; 3rd Floor.
3. Final completion is 120 days from notice to proceed. Liquidated damages are set at \$400 per day.

Schedule of Values

1. This bid is based on **Unit Prices**. Unit prices shall be provided in the bid schedule / schedule of values (**Part III**) by the contractor to be used for any additions, changes, or deductions to the Contract. Please look closely at the Basis of Payment defined within the Technical Specifications.
2. Quantities may or may not be verified in the field by the inspector.
3. Change orders shall not be issued for differences between the unit bids and actual field conditions unless LFUCG DWQ approved changes to the Scope of work occurs.
4. Unit prices shall be reviewed, and an unbalanced bid shall be rejected.

Construction Schedule

1. The overall construction schedule is 120 calendar days. A specific construction schedule shall be submitted by the contractor at the pre-construction meeting for review and approval.

Existing Conditions

1. The Contractor shall walk the site and note all existing conditions prior to beginning construction. No change orders shall be considered for items readily discernible by a site visit.
2. Utility coordination is the responsibility of the contractor. This includes all Utility related clearances, safety issues, OSHA requirements, and temporary bracing or bridging of utility items.

Traffic Control

1. The Contractor shall maintain at least one lane of traffic access along Elizabeth Street and Forest Park at all times. Means and methods are the responsibility of the contractor. Contractor is responsible for obtaining any lane closure/blockage permits from the LFUCG Division of Traffic Engineering.

Staging / Storage / Parking /Access to the Site

1. The Contractor shall access the work site via the public right of way of Elizabeth Street and Forest Park.
2. LFUCG Consent and Release Forms have been signed by all the impacted property owners to grant Temporary Construction Easements on along the frontage of their respective properties. Additional easements for construction access or staging will be the responsibility of the Contractor.

Permits

Permits to be obtained by the Contractor include:

- Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) approval by LFUCG (partially completed by LFUCG)
- LFUCG Land Disturbance Permit
- KPDES Notice of Intent
- Fuel storage permit (if required) for any generators, pumps, and equipment
- Lane Blockage/closure

Questions / Comments:

Question: Will the contractor be required to test the existing 8-inch sanitary sewer along Forest Park if lateral connections for relocations for the homes along the north side of Forest Park to avoid conflict from the proposed 15-inch storm sewer.

Answer: Testing for the existing 8-inch sanitary sewer will not be required. Testing for any relocated laterals running to the north to the existing homes along Forest Park will be required per local plumbing code. Please note that laterals shall be installed by a Licensed Plumber per KRS 318.010.

Comment: LFUCG DWQ completed a pothole exploration of the existing sanitary sewer laterals at the proposed 15-inch storm sewer crossing along Forest Park. From the results it appears that only the lateral at 201 Forest Park (30 ½ in depth) will be in conflict with the proposed storm sewer and will need to be relocated. *Please See Attached SWIU Daily Report.*

For a lump sum-based bid, the item total is the bid amount the Division uses for bid comparison.

The LFUCG's decision on the bid amount is final.

The contract, if awarded, will be on the basis of materials and equipment specified in the specifications without consideration of possible substitute or "or equal" items.

The estimated quantities of items of unit price work are not guaranteed and are solely for the purpose of comparison of bids and determining an initial Contract price. Determination of the actual quantities and classification of unit price work performed by the Contractor will be made by the Engineer in accordance with the General Conditions.

C. DEFINITIONS

- 1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.
- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by one or more women.

- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) A Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a veteran and/or a service-disabled veteran.
- 5) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- d. Attended pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned businesses of subcontracting opportunities
- e. Sponsored Economic Inclusion event to provide networking opportunities for prime contractors and MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses.
- f. Requested a list of MWDBE and/or Veteran subcontractors or suppliers from LFUCG and showed evidence of contacting the companies on the list(s).
- g. Contacted organizations that work with MWDBE companies for assistance in finding certified MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses should be a part of the bidder's good faith efforts documentation.
- h. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email or facsimile, to qualified, certified MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned businesses soliciting their participation in the contract not less than seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
- i. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting MWDBEs and Veteran-Owned Businesses to determine their level of interest.
- j. Provided the interested MWDBE firm and/or Veteran-Owned business with adequate and timely information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract.

OUR MISSION: The mission of the Minority Business Enterprise Program is to facilitate the full participation of minority and women owned businesses in the procurement process and to promote economic inclusion as a business imperative essential to the long term economic viability of Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government.

To that end the city council adopted and implemented Resolution 484-2017 – A Certified Minority, Women and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ten percent (10%) minimum goal and a three (3%) minimum goal for Certified Veteran-Owned Small Businesses and Certified Service Disabled Veteran – Owned Businesses for government contracts.

The resolution states the following definitions shall be used for the purposes of reaching these goals (a full copy is available in Central Purchasing):

Certified Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) – a business in which at least fifty-one percent (51%) is owned, managed and controlled by an ethnic minority (i.e. African American, Asian American/Pacific Islander, Hispanic Islander, Native American/Native Alaskan Indian) as defined in federal law or regulation as it may be amended from time-to-time.

Certified Women Business Enterprise (WBE) – a business in which at least fifty-one percent (51%) is owned, managed and controlled by a woman.

Certified Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) – a business in which at least fifty-one percent (51%) is owned, managed and controlled by a veteran who served on active duty with the U.S. Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines or Coast Guard.

Certified Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) – a business in which at least fifty-one percent (51%) is owned, managed and controlled by a disabled veteran who served on active duty with the U.S. Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines or Coast Guard.

The term “Certified” shall mean the business is appropriately certified, licensed, verified, or validated by an organization or entity recognized by the Division of Purchasing as having the appropriate credentials to make a determination as to the status of the business.


