over \$2,500,000 in new equipment, building improvements, start-up costs, and building costs for a 10-year period. additional job opportunities for the citizens of Lexington and the surrounding area. The company plans to create 35 new jobs with an average wage of approximately \$73,000 per year plus benefits.
