- 1. See attached 09-2023 Certified Bid Tabulation.
- 2. See attached revisions to Technical Specifications Sections 25.3 and 25.6.
- 3. Replace Information for Bidders, 17. Contract Time, with the following:

"Unit Price Contract (UPC) is anticipated to be in effect for two years. For individual projects undertaken under this UPC, the time to completion for each project will be agreed upon between the OWNER and the CONTRACTOR and reflected in the Notice to Proceed."

Please be advised of the following clarifications to the above referenced bid:

- 1. Bid opening has been extended to February 20, 2025, 2:00 pm.
- 2. Question: The unit prices for pipe removal and pipe installation spec section 6 indicate all materials are incidental to removal of pipe. If the pipe removed requires stone backfill due to the above surface or otherwise, will we be paid for the stone on the unit price per ton?
 Answer: If a pipe is to be removed but not replaced with new pipe and is to be backfilled with any material other than borrow/earthwork, then the quantity for the backfill material (stone, flowable, etc.) will be paid for separately.
- 3. Question: Spec section 25 Indicates all bedding and backfilling (even if flowable fill) is incidental. Also it includes concrete cap in this section as incidental. Will those be paid out by their respective unit prices for stone backfill or flowable fill, and would concrete cap need to be included or would it fall under unfinished concrete unit prices?
