Mobilization, Traffic Control (Maintenance of Traffic), Construction Staking and E&S Permitting will be paid on a sliding percentage scale for increments of the final price for Work, per the table below.

(For example, if the final total of Bid Item Prices for the work is \$24,000, Mobilization would be (\$10,000 X 15%) plus (\$10,000 X 10%) plus (\$4,000 X 5%) = \$2,700)

No additional compensation will be paid beyond a contract price of \$100,000. For example, the mobilization cost for a \$100,000 price of work will be identical to that for a \$110,000 price of work.

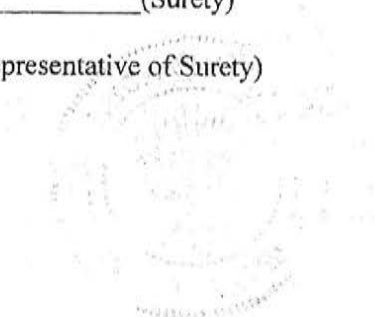

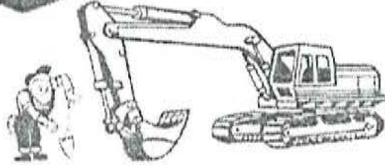

**Answer:** If a pipe is to be removed but not replaced with new pipe and is to be backfilled with any material other than borrow/earthwork, then the quantity for the backfill material (stone, flowable, etc.) will be paid for separately.
