SUBJECT: Agreement with Fayette County Public Schools Law Enforcement – 800 MHz Radio System

---

Request:

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an amendment to an existing agreement (R249-2016) with the Fayette County Public Schools (FCPS), which permits its sworn law enforcement officers and telecommunicators to receive Law Information Network of Kentucky and FBI National Crime Information Center (LINK/NCIC) services via this division's Information Channel operator.

Why are you requesting?

The original agreement permits FCPS Law Enforcement to program its radios and pay a fee to have use of Lexington's radio system. FCPS requested this amendment so that its officers can determine if persons they encounter have a valid operator's license or confirmed juvenile petition, warrant, domestic violence order, etc., which is information that can be queried and confirmed by E911 telecommunicators through the LINK/NCIC system. All other terms of the original agreement remain unchanged. The Lexington Police Department concurs with this amendment.

What are the costs in this budget year and future budget years?

There are no new or additional costs associated with this agreement.
