- pipe lining of approximately 4,100 feet of 60-inch sewer. Included were jacked-in-place pipe, pavement replacement, and other items required to complete the Work.

Project Description Scope of Work

The Lake/Allen/Maple Sewer Improvement project was one of the solutions defined in Lancaster's Long-Term Control Plan (LTCP) to reduce combined sewer overflow (CSO) volume and also to reduce basement flooding. The project involved conversion of the existing combined sewer to a storm sewer and installation of a new sanitary sewer at a lower elevation. This project had NPDES Permit compliance dates associated with PTI submittal and completion of construction. Pirnie/ARCADIS developed detailed design drawings and specifications and provided construction administration services for the project.

The sewer separation project consisted of:

- Installation of approximately 10,000 feet of 8- to 18-inch gravity sanitary sewer
- Jack-and-bore installation of an 80-foot-length of 18-inch line under a railroad for the sanitary sewer
- Jack-and-bore installation of a 110-foot-length of 18-inch line under Main Street for the sanitary sewer
- Movement of approximately 260 sewer connections from the existing combined sewer to the new sanitary sewer

As a separate part of the project, approximately 4,200 linear feet of 60-inch combined sewer received a new cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) liner. The concrete sewer is approximately 70 years old and had a continuous longitudinal crack at the 12:00 position. This sewer lies at a shallow depth under a major residential street. The City chose CIPP lining over sewer replacement in order to minimize community disruption. This segment of the project was completed in 2006 over a period of less than three months.

Project Description Scope of Work

Pirnie/ARCADIS completed design and construction phase services for the CSO 1006 and CSO 1013 projects. These projects were identified in the City's LTCP and had compliance dates included in the NPDES Permit. The overall purpose of the projects is to be able to divert more flow to the wastewater treatment plant site during wet weather for treatment in the new high-rate treatment system.

With this project, CSO 1006 was completely eliminated. The existing 15-inch underflow line was planned to be increased to 36-inch and tied directly into a downstream junction chamber. However, during design it was decided to increase the size to 48-inch and divert an old interceptor into the line. This will eliminate future maintenance issues with the old line and helped accommodate installation of the new line in a relatively confined corridor. The project also included a 240-foot jack-and-bore under a railroad and a 160-foot-jack and-bore under a neighborhood street. The total length was approximately 1,840 feet and was designed as reinforced concrete pipe (RCP), However, after bidding, the contractor offered a credit to substitute a triple-wall polypropylene product. After careful evaluation of numerous factors and concerns, it was decided to proceed with the polypropylene pipe except for some of the deeper areas. The pipe has fewer joints, one every 20 feet instead of one every 8 feet, was relatively easy to install. passed the leakage test without any problems, and provides better corrosion resistance than the RCP.

The CSO 1013 project consisted of increasing the sanitary flow diversion capacity from the CSO structure to the interceptor for conveyance to the WWTP. The CSO is still active and will overflow only during larger storm events once the entire overall LTCP is implemented. The existing 15-inch sanitary underflow line to the interceptor was supplemented with a new 36-inch line.

The City of Elyria's Cascade Siphon and Bottleneck Improvements project is being designed to improve the performance of the combined sewer system in the vicinity of Ohio Street, Glenwood Street, and Washington Avenue. The project will divert approximately 10.25 mgd through the Cascade Siphon to the 54-inch-diameter west side interceptor sewer during the 10-year design storm. The double barrel siphon consists of a 30-inch-diameter cast iron pipe and a 20-inch-diameter cast iron pipe.



1. Each Respondent shall comply with all Federal, State & Local regulations concerning this type of service or good.

The Respondent agrees to comply with all statutes, rules, and regulations governing safe and healthful working conditions, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1970, 29 U.S.C. 650 et. seq., as amended, and KRS Chapter 338. The Respondent agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the LFUCG harmless from all penalties, fines or other expenses arising out of the alleged violation of said laws.

- 2. Failure to submit ALL forms and information required in this RFP may be grounds for disqualification.
- 3. Addenda: All addenda, if any, shall be considered in making the proposal, and such addenda shall be made a part of this RFP. - 12. B. At Will Termination

Payment for those goods and services shall not be unreasonably withheld.

- 13. Assignment of Contract: The contractor shall not assign or subcontract any portion of the Contract without the express written consent of LFUCG. Any purported assignment or subcontract in violation hereof shall be void. It is expressly acknowledged that LFUCG shall never be required or obligated to consent to any request for assignment or subcontract; and further that such refusal to consent can be for any or no reason, fully within the sole discretion of LFUCG.
- 14. No Waiver: No failure or delay by LFUCG in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege hereunder, nor any single or partial exercise thereof, nor the exercise of any other right, remedy, power or privilege shall operate as a waiver hereof or thereof. No failure or delay by LFUCG in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege under or in respect of this Contract shall affect the rights, remedies, powers or privileges of LFUCG hereunder or shall operate as a waiver thereof.

- 15. Authority to do Business: The Respondent must be a duly organized and authorized to do business under the laws of Kentucky. Respondent must be in good standing and have full legal capacity to provide the services specified under this Contract. The Respondent must have all necessary right and lawful authority to enter into this Contract for the full term hereof and that proper corporate or other action has been duly taken authorizing the Respondent to enter into this Contract. The Respondent will provide LFUCG with a copy of a corporate resolution authorizing this action and a letter from an attorney confirming that the proposer is authorized to do business in the State of Kentucky if requested. All proposals must be signed by a duly authorized officer, agent or employee of the Respondent.
- 16. Governing Law: This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In the event of any proceedings regarding this Contract, the Parties agree that the venue shall be the Fayette County Circuit Court or the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, Lexington Division. All parties expressly consent to personal jurisdiction and venue in such Court for the limited and sole purpose of proceedings relating to this Contract or any rights or obligations arising thereunder. Service of process may be accomplished by following the procedures prescribed by law.
- 17. Ability to Meet Obligations: Respondent affirmatively states that there are no actions, suits or proceedings of any kind pending against Respondent or, to the knowledge of the Respondent, threatened against the Respondent before or by any court, governmental body or agency or other tribunal or authority which would, if adversely determined, have a materially adverse effect on the authority or ability of Respondent to perform its obligations under this Contract, or which question the legality, validity or enforceability hereof or thereof.
- 18. Contractor understands and agrees that its employees, agents, or subcontractors are not employees of LFUCG for any purpose whatsoever. Contractor is an independent contractor at all times during the performance of the services specified.
- 19. If any term or provision of this Contract shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the contract shall remain in full force and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY AGREEMENT


