- (1) For the length of the contract, each contractor shall hire minorities from other sources within the drawing area, should the union with which he has collective bargaining agreements be unwilling to supply sufficient minorities to satisfy the agreed upon goals and timetable.
- (2) Each contractor shall, for the length of the contract, furnish such information as required by KRS 45.560 to KRS 45.640 and by such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to all books and records pertaining to his employment practices and work sites by the contracting agency and the department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with KRS 45.560 to 45.640 and such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto.

# KRS 45.620. Action against contractor - Hiring of minority contractor or subcontractor

- (1) If any contractor is found by the department to have engaged in an unlawful practice under this chapter during the course of performing under a contract or subcontract covered under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the department shall so certify to the contracting agency and such certification shall be binding upon the contracting agency unless it is reversed in the course of judicial review.
- (2) If the contractor is found to have committed an unlawful practice under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the contracting agency may cancel or terminate the contract, conditioned upon a program for future compliance approved by the contracting agency and the department. The contracting agency may declare such a contractor ineligible to bid on further contracts with that agency until such time as the contractor complies in full with the requirements of KRS 45.560 45.640.
- (3) The equal employment provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 may be met in part by a contractor by subcontracting to a minority contractor or subcontractor. For the provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640, a minority contractor or subcontractor shall mean a business that is owned and controlled by one or more persons disadvantaged by racial or ethnic circumstances.

# KRS 45.630 Termination of existing employee not required, when

Any provision of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 notwithstanding, no contractor shall be required to terminate an existing employee upon proof that that employee was employed prior to the date of the contract.

### KRS 45.640 Minimum skills

Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job.

It is recommended that all of the provisions quoted above to be included as <u>special conditions</u> in each contract. In the case of a contract exceeding \$250,000, the contractor is required to furnish evidence that his work-force in Kentucky is representative of the available work-force in the area from which he draws employees, or to supply an Affirmative Action plan which will achieve such representation during the life of the contract.



### TO ALL PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS:

Please be advised of the following clarifications to the above referenced bid:

#### Item and Clarification

On both Drawings C-1 and C-1A, the temporary construction access road shall be 15 ft wide (rather than 12 ft in note 1). As described in the notes, at the end of construction this gravel access road will be made into a 12 ft wide asphalt driveway with 1.5 ft shoulders on both sides along the same alignment using the typical road section detail on Drawing C-3. This roadway detail will also be used for the paving around the pump station that is not pervious.

The truss layout shall be as shown on Drawing S-6, Section 6.1 (rafter overhang), rather than shown on Drawing A-4 (cantilever overhang).

On Drawing P-2 in the plumbing fixtures schedule, item X (water heater), the heating element is 8.3 kw not 83 kw.

Bar screen control diagram on Drawing E-3 was replaced in Addendum No. 3 and similar to the original diagram, the new diagram details FCP-110 which is provided by the bar screen manufacturer. Remote start and motor run signals shall go to the RTU and LSH-110 shall also start the screen (both were shown on the original diagram). LCP-111 is shown on drawing E-7 and described in note 4.
