

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky November 17, 2022

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on November 17, 2022 at 6:01 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Kay, Lamb, McCurn, Moloney, Plomin, Reynolds, Sheehan, Worley, Baxter, Bledsoe, F. Brown, and Ellinger. Absent were Council Members Kloiber, LeGris, and J. Brown.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 122-2022 through 125-2022, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 610-2022 through 623-2022, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Horace Ross of Bethel Baptist Church.

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Upon motion by Mr. Ellinger, seconded by Ms. Sheehan, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the October 27, 2022 and November 3, 2022 Council Meetings were approved.

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Mayor Gorton asked Ms. Bledsoe, Coach James Wray, and Assistant Coach Christian King, to join her at the podium, along with the members of the Paul Laurence Dunbar High School Boys' Varsity Soccer Team, and read a Proclamation declaring November 17, 2022 as Dunbar Boys' Soccer Day in Lexington. She congratulated the team for winning 2022 KHSAA State Soccer Championship and presented each member of the team with the Spirit of Lexington award for their victory.

Coach Wray thanked the Council and Mayor for the recognition.

Ms. Bledsoe commended the team for their dedication and hard work, noting the strong athletic tradition the team has upheld in the community.

An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, FY 2023 Schedule No. 17.

An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for Council appropriations for the ADA Improvement Plan from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Recovery Funds, as preliminarily approved on November 1, 2022, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, FY 2023 Schedule No. 20.

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An Ordinance authorizing a salary supplement in the amount of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) per year, divided across twenty-six (26) pay periods and calculated as an additional sum payable on an hourly basis for non-exempt employees and on a

biweekly basis for exempt employees, for the following classifications: Telecommunicator, Telecommunicator Senior, Telecommunicator Supervisor, E-911 Manager, and Radio/Electronics Specialist, all in the Div. of Enhanced 911; such supplement being authorized pursuant to the authority granted by Section 21-27(d) of the Code of Ordinances of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government in recognition of employment market conditions that make it exceptionally difficult to recruit and retain qualified employees in these classifications; and further authorizing payment of this supplement to employees in these classifications, effective on January 2, 2023 received first reading.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute an Agreement with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services to restore a Monarch habitat at Lakeside Golf Course, for the Div. of Parks and Recreation.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute an Addendum to the Information System Agreement (executed pursuant to Resolution No. 495-2015) and related documents, with Systems & Software, Inc., to upgrade the EnQuesta system for the Div. of Revenue, at an additional cost estimated not to exceed \$691,174 in FY2023.
