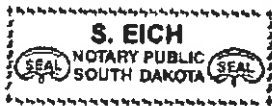

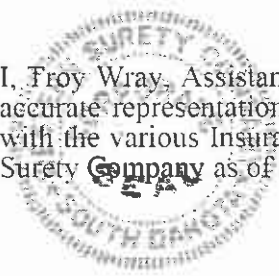

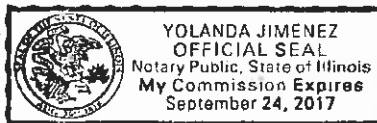

Q&A

1. Item No. 3: Demo: Reinf Concrete Floor at 7,600 SF. Actual square footage comes to 7,073 sq ft according to the blueprint. A: The demo quantities of the concrete floor of 7,600 sq ft in the Advertisement for Bids differs from the plans (7,073 sq ft) because of a last minute change to the drawings at the area of the 4 ft barrier wall and behind the restroom area.
2. Item No. 4: Disposal on site? What are we disposing on site at 290 CY? According to scope of work, everything is either taken offsite or scrapped. A: The 290 CY disposal was referring to the concrete to be removed.
3. Item No. 7: Rebar Walls #3 & #7. Specifications state #6 & #7 bar to be used. There is no #3 bar referenced for the wall. A: Rebar Walls #3-#7 is referring to a range of rebar sizes and there are only #6s and #7s shown on the drawings.
4. Item No. 8: Drill hole for vertical rebar and anchors. The quantity stated is 210 holes drilled. Wall dowels have 314 holes, columns have 20 for anchor purposes. A: The quantities stated for drilling for vertical rebar and anchors should be 332 instead of 210.
5. Item No. 9: Epoxy anchoring cartridge & anchor. Calling for 210 cartridges to be priced. Wall and anchors will only take 60 cartridges, per blueprint, verified by Hilti. A: The quantities for "epoxy" anchoring cartridges is 312 for anchoring the vertical rebar in the barrier wall to the foundation and 20 "adhesive" type cartridges for the column anchor bolts instead of 210.
6. Item No. 12: Floor Finishing SF = 8,350. Actual square footage is 7,073 SF per blueprint. A: Floor finishing are of 8,350 sq ft should match the corrected floor area of 7,073 sq ft as stated in Item no. 3.



7. Item No. 15: Drill holes for horizontal and grout dowels: 415 EA. Dowels cannot be grouted into slab. Are you specifying an epoxy mortar grout in cartridges? Product Hilti HY200-A / approx 400, 16.9 ounce cartridges. A: Items 14 & 15 – drill holes for horizontal and grout dowels. Horizontal holes are to be drilled for dowels to be grouted into the existing slab as shown in Detail A on Sheet S-9. The grout is to be a non-shrink type conforming to ASTM C1107 (refer to the General Notes under Concrete Construction item 16 on S-1).
8. Item No. 18: Remove bad soil (2' deep below slab). Does soil need to be taken to landfill due to leachate contamination? Point was brought up by Greg Elkins (CKY) and when asked if material could be dumped at construction landfill. Answer was, No, due to leachate contamination possibilities. A: Material will need to be disposed of at a permitted waste landfill.
9. Item No. 37: Cleanup Area. Clean up what? What material? Pricing for cleaning up our own mess is included in pricing. Is there other material to be cleaned up? A: Cleanup is referring to the construction materials and debris generated by the repairs. The city takes care of the cleanup of the city garbage only.
10. Does contractor higher Engineer firm to calculate load on main beam for column replacement and method of shoring? A: The Contractor will be responsible for determining the method and design of the shoring and bracing of the structure for repairing and replacing the building columns.
11. Item No. 1: Demo: Slab Cutting (12" thick) at 405 LF. Actual is 434.8 LF. A: We anticipate not sawing along the wall (31'-5") at the abandoned restrooms.
12. Item No. 8: Drill hole for vertical rebar and anchors. Quantity 210. Actual count 332 holes. A: Quantities stated for drilling for vertical rebar and anchors should be 332 instead of 210.
13. MISSING: No support details have been provided for slab mats. A: The new 12" thick slab details and subgrade information are combined with the joint details on sheet S-9, Detail A.





1. **Item #13 on Addendum #2:** MISSING: No support details have been provided for slab mats. A: The new 12" thick slab details and subgrade information are combined with the joint details on sheet S-9, Detail A.

Question has still not been answered as to HOW IS THE ENGINEER SUPPORTING REBAR MATS OFF OF SUBGRADE AND BETWEEN MATS. No detail has been provided on AS-9 that is referenced.

A: The rebar mats are required to be supported during concrete placement as noted in the General Notes, Concrete Construction note #2. The rebar supports are called "chairs" or "standees" and there may be other names for these. These are usually not detailed on engineer's design drawings. However, the rebar fabricator will usually show these on their shop drawings.

2. **ITEM # 5 on Addendum #2:** Item No. 9: Epoxy anchoring cartridge & anchor. Calling for 210 cartridges to be priced. Wall and anchors will only take 60 cartridges, per blueprint, verified by Hilti. A: The quantities for "epoxy" anchoring cartridges is 312 for anchoring the vertical rebar in the barrier wall to the foundation and 20 "adhesive" type cartridges for the column anchor bolts instead of 210.

Answer is confusing, as it is not calling for the 60 cartridges it should take, it is now calling for 312 cartridges for anchoring the vertical rebar in the barrier wall to the foundation and 20 adhesive type cartridges for the column anchor bolts. Instead of correcting to the Qty total of 60, the Answer has increased the Qty from 210 to 312. A: Disregard the number of cartridges stated if



the manufacturer's cartridge can fill more than one hole properly and meets their published strengths. Provide the number of cartridges necessary for the amount of anchor bolts, rebar and the depth of embedment required in the drawings. The manufacturer can assist with the number of cartridges needed based on what is required in the project and the size of their cartridges.
