**SUBJECT: Amendment No. 1 to Agreement with Mountain Comprehensive Care Center**

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**Request:** Council authorization to execute amendment to an agreement with Mountain Comprehensive Care Center to move Emergency Solutions Grant CARES Act funds from Rapid Rehousing to case management, security deposits, utilities, landlord incentives, renter's insurance and personal protective equipment in the amount \$103,400 and to extend period of performance to August 31, 2023, and authorizing the Mayor to execute any other agreements or amendments with Mountain Comprehensive Care Center related to the use of these funds.

**Purpose of Request:** On August 27, 2020 (Resolution 395-2020), Council authorized acceptance of federal Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) for response to COVID-19. Mountain Comprehensive Care Center was awarded \$325,334 for a Case Management and Rapid Rehousing Program. Mountain Comprehensive Care Center requests a grant adjustment to reduce the Rapid Rehousing to \$103,400 and to increase funds in case management, security deposits, utilities, landlord incentives, renter's insurance and personal protective equipment to \$103,400 to better serve clients.

The proposed amendment would extend the period of performance through August 31, 2023.

**What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?** No impact on FY22 budget.

**Are the funds budgeted?** Grant funds are budgeted
