

## Memorandum of Understanding


This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) and Lexington Community Radio (WLXU) sets the terms and understanding governing the responsibilities of each of the two parties pertaining to radio equipment integration located at the WLEX tower site, 1065 Russell Cave Rd, Lexington, Kentucky.


### **Purpose**

WLXU, with the permission of WLEX, will be placing new equipment at the tower site which is co-located with LFUCG's public safety radio equipment. LFUCG has agreed to provide rack space to accommodate a desktop UPS and radio equipment (approximately 18" of rack space was indicated in the requirements), as well as generator power for the installed equipment as a cost saving measure for WLXU.


### **Terms**

1. Reporting
  - a. WLXU should coordinate their installation and ongoing maintenance efforts with WLEX administration as well as LFUCG to ensure all responsible parties have representatives present as needed whenever installation and/or maintenance needs to occur.
  - b. LFUCG will designate a point of contact within the Division of Enhanced 911 to coordinate any maintenance that could impact our systems.
2. WLXU will be responsible for all cost associated with the integration of their new radio equipment and LFUCG's existing equipment.
3. LFUCG representatives and/or contractors shall ensure that the integration meets our installation requirements before work is concluded.
4. LFUCG shall not be held liable for any interruption of power should the generator supplied by LFUCG fail.
5. LFUCG may rescind this agreement should the requirements of the Public Safety Radio System increase to a point where we no longer have the capacity to power both systems. LFUCG will provide notice to WLXU in writing should this requirement become necessary.

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
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
