SUBJECT: Amendment to Agreements with Hope Center, Inc.

Request: Council authorization to execute amendments to the agreements with Hope Center, Inc. under the Emergency Solutions Grants Program to extend the Hope Center Emergency Shelter Agreement and Hope Center Street Outreach Agreement period of performance through August 31, 2023, and authorizing the Mayor to execute any other agreements or amendments with Hope Center, Inc. related to the use of these funds.

Purpose of Request: On August 27, 2020 (Resolution No. 395-2020) Council approved an Amendment to the 2019 Annual Action Plan and Hope Center Inc. was provided \$1,178,175 in Emergency Solutions Grant funds from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) for the purpose of operating a street outreach program in the amount of \$275,507 and shelter expenses in the amount of \$902,668 related to preventing, preparing for, and responding to the coronavirus. On December 7, 2021 (Resolution 718-2021), Council approved to extend period of performance to August 31, 2022.

The Hope Center, Inc. has requested to extend period of performance to spend remaining funds to align with the HUD deadline for spending these ESG-CV funds. The proposed amendment would extend the period of performance through August 31, 2023.
