II. Bid Conditions

- A. No bid may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days after the date and time set for opening.
- B. No bid may be altered after the date and time set for opening. In the case of obvious errors, the Division of Central Purchasing may permit the withdrawal of a bid. The decision as to whether a bid may be withdrawn shall be that of the Division of Central Purchasing.
- C. Acceptance of this proposal shall be enactment of an Ordinance by the Urban County Council.
- D. The bidder agrees that the Urban County Government reserves the right to reject <u>any</u> and <u>all</u> bids for either fiscal or technical reasons, and to award each part of the bid separately or all parts to one vendor.
- E. Minor exceptions may not eliminate the bidder. The decision as to whether any exception is minor shall be entirely that of the head of the requisitioning Department or Division and the Director of the Division of Central Purchasing. The Urban County Government may waive technicalities and informalities where such waiver would best serve the interests of the Urban County Government.
- F. Manufacturer's catalogue numbers, trade names, etc., where shown herein are for descriptive purposes and are to guide the bidder in interpreting the standard of quality, design, and performance desired, and shall not be construed to exclude proposals based on furnishing other types of materials and/or services. However, any substitution or departure proposed by the bidder must be clearly noted and described; otherwise, it will be assumed that the bidder intends to supply items specifically mentioned in this Invitation for Bids.
- G. The Urban County Government may require demonstrations of the materials proposed herein prior to acceptance of this proposal.
- H. Bids must be submitted on this form and must be signed by the bidder or his authorized representative. Unsigned bids will not be considered.
- I. Bids must be submitted prior to the date and time indicated for opening. Bids submitted after this time will not be considered.

- K. Bidder is requested to show both unit prices and lot prices. In the event of error, the unit price shall prevail.
- L. A certified / cashier's check or Bid Bond in the amount of XX percent of the bid price must

be attached hereto. This check must be made payable to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, and will be returned when the material and/or services specified herein have been delivered in accordance with specifications. In the event of failure to perform within the time period set forth in this bid, it is agreed the certified / cashier's check may be cashed and the funds retained by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as liquidated damages. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned when the bid has been awarded.

- M. The delivery dates specified by bidder may be a factor in the determination of the successful bidder.
- N. Tabulations of bids received may be mailed to bidders. Bidders requesting tabulations must enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope with the bid.
- O. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is exempt from Kentucky Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax on materials purchased from this bid invitation. Materials purchased by the bidder for construction projects are not tax exempt and are the sole responsibility of the bidder.
- P. All material furnished hereunder must be in full compliance with OSHA regulations.
- Q. If more than one bid is offered by one party, or by any person or persons representing a party, all such bids shall be rejected.
- R. Signature on the face of this bid by the Bidder or his authorized representative shall be construed as acceptance of and compliance with all terms and conditions contained herein.
- S. The Entity (regardless of whether construction contractor, non-construction contractor or supplier) agrees to provide equal opportunity in employment for all qualified persons, to prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, sex or age, and to promote equal employment through a positive, continuing program from itself and each of its sub-contracting agents. This program of equal employment opportunity shall apply to every aspect of its employment policies and practices.
- T. The Kentucky Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 (KRS 45.560-45.640) requires that any county, city, town, school district, water district, hospital district, or other political subdivision of the state shall include in directly or indirectly publicly funded contracts for supplies, materials, services, or equipment hereinafter entered into the following provisions:

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

- (1) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age or national origin;
- (2) The contractor will state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractors that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age or national origin;
- (3) The contractor will post notices in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, setting forth the provisions of the non-discrimination clauses required by this section; and
- (4) The contractor will send a notice to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under the nondiscrimination clauses.

The Act further provides:

KRS 45.610. Hiring minorities - Information required

- (1) For the length of the contract, each contractor shall hire minorities from other sources within the drawing area, should the union with which he has collective bargaining agreements be unwilling to supply sufficient minorities to satisfy the agreed upon goals and timetable.
- (2) Each contractor shall, for the length of the contract, furnish such information as required by KRS 45.560 to KRS 45.640 and by such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to all books and records pertaining to his employment practices and work sites by the contracting agency and the department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with KRS 45.560 to 45.640 and such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto.

KRS 45.620. Action against contractor - Hiring of minority contractor or subcontractor

- (1) If any contractor is found by the department to have engaged in an unlawful practice under this chapter during the course of performing under a contract or subcontract covered under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the department shall so certify to the contracting agency and such certification shall be binding upon the contracting agency unless it is reversed in the course of judicial review.
- (2) If the contractor is found to have committed an unlawful practice under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the contracting agency may cancel or terminate the contract, conditioned upon a program for future compliance approved by the contracting agency and the department. The contracting agency may declare such a contractor ineligible to bid on further contracts with that agency until such time as the contractor complies in full with the requirements of KRS 45.560 to 45.640.
- (3) The equal employment provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 may be met in part by a contractor by subcontracting to a minority contractor or subcontractor. For the provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640, a minority contractor or subcontractor shall mean a business that is owned and controlled by one or more persons disadvantaged by racial or ethnic circumstances.

KRS 45.630 Termination of existing employee not required, when

Any provision of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 notwithstanding, no contractor shall be required to terminate an existing employee upon proof that that employee was employed prior to the date of the contract.

KRS 45.640 Minimum skills

Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job.

It is recommended that all of the provisions above quoted to be included as <u>special conditions</u> in each contract. In the case of a contract exceeding \$250,000, the contractor is required to furnish evidence that his work-force in Kentucky is representative of the available work-force in the area from which he draws employees, or to supply an Affirmative Action plan which will achieve such representation during the life of the contract.

U. Any party, firm or individual submitting a proposal pursuant to this invitation must be in compliance with the requirements of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government regarding taxes and fees before they can be considered for award of this invitation and must maintain a "current" status with regard to those taxes and fees throughout the term of the contract. The contractor must be in compliance with Chapter 13 from the Code of Ordinances of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government. The contractor must be in compliance with Ordinance 35-2000 pursuant to contractor registration with the Division of Building Inspection. If applicable, said business must have a Fayette County business license.

Pursuant to KRS 45A.343 and KRS 45A.345, the contractor shall

- (1) Reveal any final determination of a violation by the contractor within the previous five year period pursuant to KRS Chapters 136 (corporation and utility taxes), 139 (sales and use taxes), 141 (income taxes), 337 (wages and hours), 338 (occupational safety and health of employees), 341 (unemployment and compensation) and 342 (labor and human rights) that apply to the contractor; and
- (2) Be in continuous compliance with the above-mentioned KRS provisions that apply to the contractor for the duration of the contract.

A contractor's failure to reveal the above or to comply with such provisions for the duration of the contract shall be grounds for cancellation of the contract and disqualification of the contractor from eligibility for future contracts for a period of two (2) years.

V. Vendors who respond to this invitation have the right to file a notice of contention associated with the bid process or to file a notice of appeal of the recommendation made by the Director of Central Purchasing resulting from this invitation.

Notice of contention with the bid process must be filed within 3 business days of the bid/proposal opening by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support contention, to the Director of the Division of Central Purchasing or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Central Purchasing to explain his/her contention with the bid process. After consulting with the Commissioner of Finance the Chief Administrative Officer and reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor, the Director of Central Purchasing shall promptly respond in writing findings as to the compliance with bid processes. If, based on this review, a bid process irregularity is deemed to have occurred the Director of Central Purchasing will consult with the Commissioner of Finance, the Chief Administrative Officer and the Department of Law as to the appropriate remedy.

Notice of appeal of a bid recommendation must be filed within 3 business days of the bid recommendation by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support appeal, to the Director, Division of Central Purchasing or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Central Purchasing to explain his appeal. After reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor and consulting with the Commissioner of Finance and the Chief Administrative Officer, the Director of Central Purchasing shall in writing, affirm or withdraw the recommendation.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO THE BIDDER

(DO NOT SUBMIT PERFORMANCE SECURITY WITH BID)

<u>Performance Security:</u> The <u>APPARENT LOW BIDDER</u> shall furnish, before recommendation by the Division of Central Purchasing to the Urban County Council that the <u>BIDDER'S</u> bid be accepted, a <u>Performance Bond, Certified Check or Cashier's Check</u>, payable to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, in the penal sum of <u>100%</u> of the price of the materials and/or services proposed in the bid.

The performance bond will not be returned to the bidder after delivery of the materials/services specified herein unless the bidder requests that the performance bond be returned.

The certified / cashier's check will be returned when the materials and/or services specified herein have been delivered.

In the event of bidder's failure to perform as specified herein, it is agreed that the monies represented by the performance bond or certified / cashier's check shall be retained by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as liquidated damages.

Contracts that are less than \$50,000 will not require a 5% bid security or a performance and payment bond.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY AGREEMENT

The Law

- Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (amended 1972) states that it is unlawful for an employer to discriminate in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age (40-70 years) or national origin.
- Executive Order No. 11246 on Nondiscrimination under Federal contract prohibits employment discrimination by contractor and sub-contractor doing business with the Federal Government or recipients of Federal funds. This order was later amended by Executive Order No. 11375 to prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex.
- Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 states:

The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap.

- Section 2012 of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act of 1973 requires Affirmative Action on behalf of disabled veterans and veterans of the Vietnam Era by contractors having Federal contracts.
- Section 206(A) of Executive Order 12086, Consolidation of Contract Compliance Functions for Equal Employment Opportunity, states:

The Secretary of Labor may investigate the employment practices of any Government contractor or sub-contractor to determine whether or not the contractual provisions specified in Section 202 of this order have been violated.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government practices Equal Opportunity in recruiting, hiring and promoting. It is the Government's intent to affirmatively provide employment opportunities for those individuals who have previously not been allowed to enter into the mainstream of society. Because of its importance to the local Government, this policy carries the full endorsement of the Mayor, Commissioners, Directors and all supervisory personnel. In following this commitment to Equal Employment Opportunity and because the Government is the benefactor of the Federal funds, it is both against the Urban County Government policy and illegal for the Government to let contracts to companies which knowingly or unknowingly practice discrimination in their employment practices. Violation of the above mentioned ordinances may cause a contract to be canceled and the contractors may be declared ineligible for future consideration.

Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government MWDBE PARTICIPATION GOALS

A. GENERAL

- 1) The LFUCG request all potential contractors to make a concerted effort to include Minority-Owned (MBE), Woman-Owned (WBE) and Disadvantaged (DBE) Business Enterprises as subcontractors or suppliers in their bids.
- 2) Toward that end, the LFUCG has established 10% of total procurement costs as a Goal for participation of Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned and Disadvantaged Businesses on this contract.
- 3) It is therefore a request of each Bidder to include in its bid, the same goal (10%) for MWDBE participation and other requirements as outlined in this section.

B. PROCEDURES

- 1) The successful bidder will be required to report to the LFUCG, the dollar amounts of all payments submitted to Minority-Owned or Woman-Owned subcontractors and suppliers for work done or materials purchased for this contract. (See Subcontractor Monthly Payment Report)
- 2) Replacement of a Minority-Owned or Woman-Owned subcontractor or supplier listed in the original submittal must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by documentation of Good Faith Efforts to replace the subcontractor / supplier with another MWDBE Firm; this is subject to approval by the LFUCG. (See LFUCG MWDBE Substitution Form)
- 3) For assistance in identifying qualified, certified businesses to solicit for potential contracting opportunities, bidders may contact:

- 4) The LFUCG will make every effort to notify interested MWDBE subcontractors and suppliers of each Bid Package, including information on the scope of work, the pre-bid meeting time and location, the bid date, and all other pertinent information regarding the project.

C. DEFINITIONS

1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.

- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by one or more Non-Minority Females.
- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) The bidder shall make a Good Faith Effort to achieve the Participation Goal for MWDBE subcontractors/suppliers. The failure to meet the goal shall not necessarily be cause for disqualification of the bidder; however, bidders not meeting the goal are required to furnish with their bids written documentation of their Good Faith Efforts to do so.
- 2) Award of Contract shall be conditioned upon satisfaction of the requirements set forth herein.
- 3) The Form of Proposal includes a section entitled "MWDBE Participation Form". The applicable information must be completed and submitted as outlined below.
- 4) Failure to submit this information as requested may be cause for rejection of bid.

E. DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) Bidders reaching the Goal are required to submit only the MWDBE Participation Form." The form must be fully completed including names and telephone number of participating MWDBE firm(s); type of work to be performed; estimated value of the contract and value expressed as a percentage of the total Lump Sum Bid Price. The form must be signed and dated, and is to be submitted with the bid.
- 2) Bidders not reaching the Goal must submit the "MWDBE Participation Form", the "Quote Summary Form" and a written statement documenting their Good Faith Effort to do so. If bid includes no MWDBE participation, bidder shall enter "None" on the subcontractor / supplier form). In addition, the bidder must submit written proof of their Good Faith Efforts to meet the Participation Goal:
 - a. Advertised opportunities to participate in the contract in at least two (2) publications of general circulation media; trade and professional association publications; small and minority business or trade publications; and publications

- or trades targeting minority, women and disadvantaged businesses not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow MWDBE firms to participate.
- b. Included documentation of advertising in the above publications with the bidders good faith efforts package
- c. Attended LFUCG Central Purchasing Economic Inclusion Outreach event
- d. Attended pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform MWDBEs of subcontracting opportunities
- e. Sponsored Economic Inclusion event to provide networking opportunities for prime contractors and MWDBE firms
- f. Requested a list of MWDBE subcontractors or suppliers from LFUCG Economic Engine and showed evidence of contacting the companies on the list(s).
- g. Contacted organizations that work with MWDBE companies for assistance in finding certified MWBDE firms to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses should be a part of the bidder's good faith efforts documentation.
- h. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email or facsimile, to qualified, certified MWDBEs soliciting their participation in the contract not less that seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
- i. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting MWDBEs to determine their level of interest.



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RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS PROVISION

- (1) It is understood and agreed by the parties that Vendor hereby assumes the entire responsibility and liability for any and all damages to persons or property caused by or resulting from or arising out of any act or omission on the part of Vendor or its employees, agents, servants, owners, principals, licensees, assigns or subcontractors of any tier (hereinafter "Vendor") under or in connection with this agreement and/or the provision of goods or services and the performance or failure to perform any work required thereby.
- Vendor shall indemnify, save, hold harmless and defend the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, volunteers, and successors in interest (hereinafter "LFUCG") from and against all liability, damages, and losses, including but not limited to, demands, claims, obligations, causes of action, judgments, penalties, fines, liens, costs, expenses, interest, defense costs and reasonable attorney's fees that are in any way incidental to or connected with, or that arise or are alleged to have arisen, directly or indirectly, from or by Vendor's performance or breach of the agreement and/or the provision of goods or services provided that: (a) it is attributable to personal injury, bodily injury, sickness, or death, or to injury to or destruction of property (including the loss of use resulting therefrom), or to or from the negligent acts, errors or omissions or willful misconduct of the Vendor; and (b) not caused solely by the active negligence or willful misconduct of LFUCG.

REQUEST FOR BID #11-2014 HONEYSUCKLE REMOVAL ON GREENWAYS AND TRAILS

1.1 SCOPE

To remove, clear and dispose of all honeysuckle plants and undesirable trees in our greenways and along our trails as designated on the attached maps. Work is to include the mechanical removal of all honeysuckle and undesirable trees with a chemical treatment of all stumps as authorized by LFUCG's designated project manager. Mechanical removal includes the use of a skid steer loader with a grapple attachment or similar equipment as well as power hand tools.

Work shall be in conformance with Natural Resources Conservation Service recommendations relating to brush management and shall include all labor, materials, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. A site visit is recommended before placing a bid. Work will be completed 90 days from issue date of the purchase order.

1.2 SITE PREPARATION

All honeysuckle (Amur honeysuckle, *Lonicera maackii*, Morrow's honeysuckle, *L. morrowii* and Japanese honeysuckle *Lonicera japonica*) is to be cut near the ground, no more than 2 inches in height with saws or loppers and painted with a solution of high-strength Roundup® on the exposed stump while fresh (within 20 minutes of cut). Total stump removal is also acceptable. All branches, leaves and stems are to be removed from site or ground into mulch and spread thinly over the project area. Also invasive trees as well as undesirable trees will be removed. Trees to be saved will be marked by the LFUCG's designated project manager. *Note: Please review and follow all detailed instructions, specification and maps associated with each specific project location.*

1.3 BASIS OF PAYMENT

Payment for work done will be paid per one lump sum per work site after a final inspection by the LFUCG's designated project manager. Satisfactory work is defined as the removal of all honeysuckle and undesirable trees according to the specifications in this proposal and must be followed to receive payment.

- Heavy equipment such as a skid steer loader <u>shall not</u> be used near the creek where damage (ruts) may occur.
- Honeysuckle, invasive trees and undesirable trees will be cut away with a saw or loppers.
- Stumps are to be cut as low as possible to the ground, no more than 2 inches in height and treated with an herbicide.
- Rodeo or Aquamaster is the required herbicide for treatment of stumps. (Mix at the maximum rate for stumps according to manufactures instructions)
- Debris will be removed by hand.
- Debris is to be hauled away or chipped on the hillsides located on the north side of the property.

Bluegrass Wilkes Continued (0.67 acres - Hillsides next to residential property, Marked on map with a Red boundary line)

- A skid steer loader shall not be used on the hillsides to remove honeysuckle.
- Trees marked with orange spray paint will be cut. Trees marked with green spray paint will not be cut.
- Honeysuckle, invasive trees and undesirable trees will be cut away from the wire fence along the entire site. All branches must be trimmed that are coming through the fence.

 Do not apply with an herbicide treatment.
- Honeysuckle, invasive trees and undesirable trees will be cut by hand using saws.
- Stumps are to be cut as low as possible to the ground, no more than 2 inches in height and treated with an herbicide.
- Required herbicide treatment of stumps is to use *glyphosate* at the maximum rate for stumps. (Mix according to manufactures instructions for stump application)
- Debris is to be hauled away or chipped on the hillsides located on the north side of the property and spread out evenly.
- Entire work site must be clear of debris prior to completing work.

Boston Trail (0.19 mile)

- Trees marked with orange spray paint will be cut. Trees marked with green spray paint will not be cut.
- Mechanical removal of most honeysuckle is recommended with the use of a skid steer loader with a grapple attachment or similar equipment.
- Honeysuckle, invasive trees and undesirable trees will be cut away from the wire fence along the entire site. All branches must be trimmed that are coming through the fence.
 Do not apply with an herbicide treatment.
- If any honeysuckle or trees are growing through the asphalt they must be cut with a saw or loppers and stumps are to be treated with an herbicide.
- Stumps are to be removed and area graded smooth.

- Honeysuckle and undesirable trees cut with a saw will require herbicide treatment of stumps. Must use *glyphosate* with colored dye at the maximum rate for stumps. (Mix according to manufactures instructions for stump application)
- Debris is to be hauled away.
- Entire trail must be clear of all debris and dirt.

Chilesburg Trail (.28 mile)

- Trees marked with orange spray paint will be cut. Trees marked with green spray paint will not be cut.
- Mechanical removal of most honeysuckle is recommended with the use of a skid steer loader with a grapple attachment or similar equipment.
- Honeysuckle, invasive trees and undesirable trees will be cut away from the wire fence along the entire site. All branches must be trimmed that are coming through the fence.
 Do not apply with an herbicide treatment.
- If any honeysuckle or trees are growing through the asphalt they must be cut with a saw or loppers and stumps are to be treated with an herbicide.
- Stumps are to be removed and area graded smooth.
- Area to be seeded with a 70/30 mixture of grass seed, 70 percent bluegrass and 30 percent annual rye. Then apply a layer of straw.
- Honeysuckle and undesirable trees cut with a saw will require herbicide treatment of stumps. Must use *glyphosate* with colored dye at the maximum rate for stumps. (Mix according to manufactures instructions for stump application)
- Debris is to be hauled away.
- Entire trail must be clear of all debris and dirt.

Lafayette (Glen Lochdale) (0.55 mile)

- Trees marked with orange spray paint will be cut. Trees marked with green spray paint will not be cut.
- Honeysuckle, invasive trees and undesirable trees will be cut away from the wire fence along the entire site. All branches must be trimmed that are coming through the fence and an herbicide treatment must be applied.
- All other honeysuckle can be removed, stumps included mechanically with a skid steer loader and grapple attachment or similar equipment.
- Stumps are to be removed and area graded smooth

Continued - Lafayette (Glen Lochdale)

- Required herbicide treatment of stumps is to use *glyphosate* with colored dye at the maximum rate for stumps. (Mix according to manufactures instructions for stump application)









It will be ok to use a skid steer with mulching head to cut honeysuckle on "Glen Lochdale" as long as the stumps are cut within two (2) inches of the ground and herbicide is used on the stumps within the 20 minute window after the honeysuckle has been cut. The mulch chippings must be spread evenly out on the ground. Also, it is ok to use the mulching head in place of a chipper to mulch up the debris on this location.

At the Bluegrass Wilkes site, if all honeysuckle is cut by hand and moved by hand to the base of the hill running behind the residential development which is flat and dry, a skid steer with forestry mulching head can be used to chip all woody debris which will be evenly spread back onto the hillside. This can only be done during dry conditions so as not to cause any ruts.
