## The Law

- c. Successful bidder shall supply tank labels as to product type, brand, weight, etc.

a. Bid price shall include delivery to requesting division's location and/or tank. Majority of product will be delivered in bulk and dispensed to the two (2) 1,000 gallon tanks located at Division of Fleet Service 669 Byrd Thurman Dr. Lexington, Ky. 40510.
