

RESOLUTION NO. _____ - 2022

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING OWNERSHIP AND MAINTENANCE OF PORTIONS OF STATE-MAINTAINED ROADWAYS LOCATED ON GEORGETOWN ROAD, LEESTOWN ROAD, NEWTOWN PIKE, CITATION BOULEVARD, AND LIBERTY–TODDS ROAD, AS WELL AS PORTIONS OF OTHER STATE SUPPLEMENTAL ROADS AND OTHER ROAD FACILITIES, UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF CERTAIN MAINTENANCE TASKS BY THE KENTUCKY TRANSPORTATION CABINET.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (“Cabinet”) has determined that certain roads constructed and/or currently maintained in Fayette County as part of the State Primary Road System do not logically fit within the State Primary Road System; and

WHEREAS, the Cabinet has requested that the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (“LFUCG”) accept ownership and maintenance of these state-maintained roadways, including but not limited to portions located on Georgetown Road, Leestown Road, Newtown Pike, Citation Boulevard, and Liberty–Todds Road, as well as portions of other state supplemental roads and other state-maintained road facilities, as described more particularly in a letter dated April 27, 2022 and as depicted more particularly in maps appended thereto, all of which are attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, the Cabinet has agreed to certain revisions of proposed transfer plans and has agreed to successfully complete certain maintenance tasks for the portions of the roadways which LFUCG has been requested to accept ownership and maintenance thereof, such maintenance tasks being more particularly described in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, LFUCG, by and through its Department of Environmental Quality and Public Works, has inspected said roadways and has made recommendations favorable to the acceptance of ownership and maintenance of these roadways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT;

Section 1 – That ownership and maintenance responsibility for the roadways identified and more particularly described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, be and hereby is assumed by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government upon successful completion of maintenance tasks more particularly described therein.

Section 2 – That this Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its passage.
